# By the Book

"By the Book" articles are intended to help familiarize GWRRA Volunteer Leaders and Members with the policies, procedures, and information contained in the GWRRA Officer's Handbook (OHB). #### I Belong to Chapter XY-Z

We've all heard, or even said ourselves, we belong to Chapter XY-Z. We may consider ourselves to be primarily active in a particular Chapter, often referred to as our 'home Chapter'. But its important to remember that we are members of GWRRA, therefore members of ALL chapters. Everyone is free to 'belong' to as many or as few chapters as desired. For example, I consider myself to be an active 'member' of two different chapters and often participate with others beyond those two. So why are we 'assigned' to a particular Chapter on the Area Report Listing (ARL)?

There are some important distinctions to keep in mind when discussing geographical boundaries and Chapter Membership.

**CHAPTER BOUNDARIES**, refer to identifiable geographic perimeters; District lines identify the District Director's geographic area of "prime" responsibility, usually along state lines. Zip codes, for the sake of convenience, identify the Chapter Director's geographic area of "prime" responsibility. Members are 'assigned' to the Chapter closest to where they live so that Chapter can contact new Members in an effort to welcome them to GWRRA and invite them to participate. However Members are free to consider a different Chapter their primary 'home'. All that is reguired to change the 'assignment' is for the Member to contact Member Services in Phoenix and request the change.

**CHAPTER MEMBERSHIP** is non-existent. A Chapter is composed of PEOPLE, not some surveyed, plot of land. We make every attempt NOT to dwell on an individual's "Home Chapter." Our Members and guests make their own decisions as to the Chapters they wish to support... they belong to every Chapter that exists within the GWRRA.

**CHAPTER MEMBER** is a designation that, unfortunately, is often misunderstood. GWRRA has Members. Chapters do not. **CHAPTER PARTICI-PANTS** is the preferred term to use when speaking of Members that attend Chapter gatherings and participate in Chapter functions.

An important concept that Officers must always remember is that our Members are NOT under any obligation to attend or participate with *any* individual Chapter. On the contrary, it is the responsibility of each Chapter Director to present as attractive a package as they can to encourage participation in their Chapter. That is the key. Make people an offer they cannot refuse! Your success as a leader is measured by the Chapter attendance at your events.

The more you know, the better it gets!

He competed against 3 other bikes (well 4 if you count Marty... who was riding the course but not competing) 2 Can-Ams & another Goldwing so imagine Larry's surprise when they announced that he had won 1<sup>st</sup> place which isn't bad considering that he doesn't normally ride a bike with 3 wheels (which is so different from riding a 2 wheeler).



Of course the real reason we went to Wind Ding this year is because the Drill Team was performing on the 4<sup>th</sup> and I have to admit that so far this was the largest crowd that they have performed before. There were 4 teams riding that day. 2 were novice teams and the team from Canada that's been riding together for many, many years. 


