Passengers

There are basic adjustments operators should make to their motorcycle and their riding style when carrying a passenger. Adjustments to the tire pressure and suspension settings are usually required. And, be sure not to exceed the weight limit (total of operator, passenger, accessories, and cargo). Refer to your owner's manual for those details.

Regarding riding style, the extra weight of the passenger will tend to make the motorcycle slower to respond to steering input, may require more throttle and clutch finesse to start off from a stop, may require greater pressure on the brake controls, may reduce cornering clearance, and may increase the time and space needed for passing. A lighter motorcycle may be affected more than a heavier motorcycle, because passenger weight will constitute a bigger percentage of total loaded motorcycle weight.

If you're a novice when it comes to carrying a passenger, practice turning and braking with your passenger aboard in a low-risk area like an open parking lot before you take to the streets. Learn the needed skills gradually. Remember too that novice passengers tend to fear lean, so make turns, corners and curves

more gentle (less lean) than you normally do. Remember that passengers new to motorcycling can experience anxiety and may want you to pull over and stop at times. If you do not have a helmet-to-helmet communications system, or if your system fails, you might try an old fashioned approach: When your passenger gives your arm three quick squeezes, it's time to pull over. It's a simple but effective signal, and just knowing there is a stop-option can help reduce your passenger's level of anxiety.

Your passenger should know to brace him/herself when you're stopping to avoid knocking helmets together, keep their feet on the footrests at stops, and look over your shoulder in the direction of the turn to ensure he/she leans with you in a corner. And passengers should always wear proper protective gear, even for short rides.

Finally, don't overlook the advantages of carrying a passenger. Two immediately come to mind:

More weight over the rear tire may increase the usefulness and stopping power of the rear brake, especially in quick-stop situations.

And most importantly, a passenger serves as a trusted companion with whom to share the joy of motorcycling!


Also, consider having your passenger join you during your next GWRRA Rider Course. It will give both of you a chance to experience the emergency maneuvers in a non-critical environment.



Well it was a beautiful day for a ride when I left Floresville ,Texas on my way to Ft Worth to spend some time with my riding brother Rusty and I had decided to complete my certification for my Airman's Certificate for Aircraft Maintenance at a local airport in the Ft Worth area.

As I said earlier it was a beautiful day for a ride so I was headed north on I-35 and of course the traffic was pretty thick. I was getting close to Waco Texas on the southern outskirts and traffic was getting heavier the closer we got to Waco. I was riding in the center lane of three lanes in that area and there were no vehicles most of my time to my left and as I came up on a box type truck pulling a dual axel trailer on my right. As I got closer to the truck and trailer combo, I was watching the traffic all around when suddenly out of nowhere a car cut in front of this truck on my right and of course he (the truck) swerved into my lane and all I saw was truck and trailer coming at me at 75 miles an hour.

I had literally seconds to respond and because of the ERC I take every year I did what just came natural and pushed on my hand grip to shoot the bike into the left lane and away from this truck. For a split second I remember saying this is going to hurt. Then after I regained my composure I pulled past this truck and there were two guys and two gals in the cab. I was angry at first but when I got beside the truck I noticed the left side mirror was broken out and he didn't even know I was there. He was trying to avoid hitting the car that pulled in front of him.

Well boys and girl let me tell you I told God at least 50 times thank you for watching over me that day. You know I always say a little prayer before I ride and I have my bike blessed, and I take the ERC to keep me sharp having to use these evasive actions second nature because at 75 mph and pulling a loaded trailer stuff just happens so quickly.

One thing I forgot to say earlier is when I pushed that grip hard and the bike shot in the left lane, I didn't even have time to look in that lane, what mostly I was thanking God for was not as much as I got out of the way of that truck, as much as I thanked him for nothing being in that left lane when I shot over there and hitting me from the back, where I was angry before at the guys in the truck swerving into my lane I had done the same thing. I just Thank God he had kept that lane open for me.

Everyone knows I ride a lot I rolled 112,000 miles on my bike and I haven't, "Thank the Lord", had an accident and I attribute that to three things, A very fine built motorcycle, fine training and experience and last but not least God watching over me.

I pray for him to watch over me, my motorcycle and to keep the critters out of my way, and me out of theirs, both two legged and four legged.





Bubba's Chili Dump

- 1 lb Hamburger
- 1 lb Sausage (hot optional)
- 1 med onion (chopped)
- 1 pkg Hot chili seasoning
- 1 pkg Reg chili seasoning
- 8 oz Velveeta Cheese or Mexican Cheese
- 1 cn Diced Green Chiles
- 1 cn Tomato Sauce
- 1 cn Williams Chili Beans (medium)
- 1 cn Van Camp Mexican Chili Beans
- 1 cn Rotel Chili Fixins'

Cook meat and drain. Place remaining ingredients in crock pot and heat until cheese has melted. Add hamburger and Sausage, mix well. Heat to simmer and serve.

Bill's Basic Chili

- 1-3 lbs Hamburger (amount depends on people)
- 1 can Chili Beans or Mexican Style Beans
- 1 can Kidney Beans
- 2 cans Nacho Fiesta Cheese Soup
- 1 can Diced Tomatoes
- 1 cup Chunky Salso Mild
- 2-3 pkg Chili seasoning (1 hot-2 mild)
- 1 pkg Shredded Cheddar Cheese

Cook hamburger and drain. Combine with remaining ingredients. Heat to simmer and serve

Note; If you really like it hot, add a 4 oz can of diced jalapenos and/or substitute Chili Beans with Hot Chili Beans or add Medium or hot Chunky Salsa.

Meat Loaf

- 1 T good olive oil
- 3 cups chopped yellow onions
- 1 t chopped fresh thyme leaves
- 2 t kosher salt
- 1 t freshly ground black pepper
- 3 T Worcestershire sauce
- 1/3 cup canned chicken stock or broth
- 1T Tomato paste
- 2 1/2 lbs ground chuck (81%)
- 1/2 cup polain dry bread crumbs
- 2 extra-large eggs, beaten
- 1/2 cup ketchup

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F.

Heat the olive oil in a medium sauté pan. Add the onions, thyme, salt, and pepper and cook over medium-low heat. Stirring occasionally for 8-10 minutes until onions are translucent but not brown. Off the heat, add the Worcestershire sauce, chicken stock and tomato paste. Allow to cool slightly.

In a large bowl, combine the ground chuck, onion mixture, bread crumbs, and eggs and mix lightly with a fork. Don't mash or the meat loaf will be dense. Shape the mixture into a rectangular loaf on a sheet pan covered with parchment paper. Spread the ketchup evenly on top. Bake for 1 to 1 1/4 hours until the internal temperature is 160 degrees F and the meat loaf is cooked through.

TIP: A pan of hot water in the oven UNDER the meat loaf will keep the top from cracking and be moist.


