



WOW, the last article for 2016. Where did the year go?

A few months ago, Rick Stevens, Marv Ayers and yours truly traveled to Hutchinson to attend the CMA (Christian Motorcycle Association) state rally. We were invited by Mike Bright, CMA State Director to give a couple of our safety seminars. Mike wanted 'Team Riding' and one other one, and we selected our new seminar, 'Distracted Drivers'. Both were well received and generated many questions after our presentations. It was rainy that morning but we still had around 100 in attendance.

My message for this month is about why people don't see us on our motorcycles and driver distractions. A topic that is being addressed over and over and it needs to be because we need to be reminded of the risks we face when riding our motorcycles, two or three wheels. I realize this is old stuff for many of you but hang in there. Being reminded isn't all that bad.

We have always been concerned with why drivers don't see us and the causes are even more prevalent than before with the electronics that are now in the hands of drivers or fixed in the car somewhere where they can reach them.

Here are a few distractions I came up with from research and personal observation during my 34 years as a law enforcement officer.

Putting on makeup or shaving and combing hair;

Reading books, maps and other documents;

Cell Phones used to call or text; Car Stereos so loud it is a distraction:

Your passenger(s), including your children and animals (usually a dog or two);

GPS in car OR on your motorcycle;

Not paying attention to their driving, Possibly Day Dreaming about a DR. Appointment etc.

I bet we all are guilty of this one. Eating and/or drinking while in motion;

Not mentally with it. Had an argument with spouse before leaving house:

Family health concerns or physically impaired;

Driving after taking medication that affects your judgment;

Driver reaching to back seat to correct a child or pick something up off the floor, front or back;

Things hanging from the inside center mirror.

I bet you can add some distractions to this list. Why are we not seen by other drivers?

Maybe we blend in with the scenery behind us OR

We might be wearing dark clothing at night or anytime OR

Next page

We might be hidden by any number of things such as another vehicle, advertizing signs, yes even a utility pole or stop sign could block their view.

Maybe they did see us but they misjudged our speed because the bike is much smaller than the four wheeler.

Again, add your observations or maybe something you did that caused you not to see the motorcycle coming toward you.

I encourage you to attend the "Distracted Drivers" seminar that is scheduled at Mid-Winter Rendezvous next year (January 20-21) in Park City, KS.

As we journey into the Christmas month and the wintery months ahead, we need to keep all the above distractions and actions in mind to help reduce the risk in doing what we enjoy doing, 'Riding our favorite ride', however; don't become distracted by thinking about all the above, just follow the motto of the Boy Scouts and "Be Prepared" and remember this, When you must handle a situation, 'Predict the worst to obtain the best results'.

We hope you had a safe, non- fattening Thanksgiving. According to my blood sugar readings I had a great feast. Shame on me.

Hello everyone...

It's December and the holiday season is upon us so this month's newsletter will be short & sweet.

So what happened in November...well the Twisters had their last performance for the year with their appearance in El Dorado at their Veteran's Day parade on the 5th. This is I believe their 4th time to perform and all though they had to amend their program a little bit (street is too small for some of that maneuvers) it was a great way to end the season.

Our monthly meeting was held on the 10th and although the crowd wasn't our largest it was still a good meeting. Our Riders Educator Bob Brown gave a great lesson on 10 ways to keep riding in the winter

Get Layered. Layering will keep you insulated & warm. Start with a light base layer which should trap warm air nest to your skin and wick away sweat. Make sure the top layer is tough & wind-proof. Please be sure the layers don't restrict movement.

Trap body heat. Most body heat escapes from the hands & head area so keep these warm. Seal/close the gap between your sleeves & gloves so you could look into some gauntlet style gloves. Also a neck warmer or balaclava can help to prevent cold air from entering your helmet.

Don't get foggy. Visor fogging can cause hazardous visibility problems during cold weather. There are some substances that you can put on your visor to help keep it from fogging over so talk to Bob (or do a Google search) to discover what they are.

Get electric gear. If you are going to ride a lot in the cold weather you might invest in some heated gear to help keep you warm. Remember a warm torso prevents frostbite by allowing the heart to focus on pumping blood to the hands & feet. You can also invest in putting heated grips on your bike

Watch the voltage. If you invest in the heating equipment be sure your alternator can handle the additions. Check your owner's manual to find out how much wattage your alternator generates how much wattage is used to run the bike. Make sure there's enough for what you are going to use.

- **Get streamlined.** One of the ways you can keep warm is to keep the cold air from blowing on you so invest in a fairing. You can also put baker wings on your handle bars and around other places on your bike to help deflect the wind off of you.
- **Don't be fooled**. Hypothermia is insidious so don't ignore early symptoms, uncontrolled shivering, numb fingers or toes, slow reaction times, or fuzzy thinking. The wind chill adds to the danger so make sure you stop frequently & have a hot beverage and allow your body to warm up.
- **Practice tire smarts**. If you put race type tires on in the summer be sure to switch back to ordinary street tires during the cold months they develop grip at lower temperatures & reach effective operating temperature quicker
- **Put your oil on a diet**. Using thinner oil during the cold months will improve your bike's performance...especially during start-up. Check your owner's manual for recommendations.
- **Rev up your insurance I.Q**. Make sure your insurance police allows for year-round riding. May insurance premiums are based on an annual term that takes into consideration the variances in throughout the year. A discount for limited use during "off season" may already be reflected in your cost. However if your policy requires your bike be laid up during certain months, you may not e as protected as you thing.

Dec 11 we leave for the Prairie Rose Dinner & Show at noon. There will be plenty of good food and a fantastic show.





"By the Book" articles are intended to help familiarize GWRRA Volunteer Leaders and Members with the policies, procedures, and information contained in the GWRRA Officer's Handbook (OHB). December brings us together for many different parties – celebrating the various holidays or watching our favorite teams in their endeavor to be the best. Many of the social events or gift exchanges done at this time of year have the tradition of involving alcohol. While it has been discussed at length many times, I thought it best to remind everyone of the GWRRA policy on alcohol. Page D-15 of the Officer Handbook states: "While GWRRA makes no attempt to legislate policy as it relates to an individual's freedom, we must give strong consideration to potential liability exposure of the Officer group. For this reason, GWRRA CANNOT: 1) sell alcoholic beverages; 2) profit from the sale of alcoholic beverages; 3) distribute as an award or prize any alcoholic beverages at a GWRRA event; 4) encourage its use by adver-

The first few words are important to remember – **WE ARE NOT ATTEMPTING TO BE THE ALCOHOL POLICE**. However, that said, the next few words from the Officer Handbook are of utmost importance – **THERE ARE POTENTIAL LIABILITY ISSUES**. What does this mean? Most areas have what are known as social host liability laws which impart liability to those responsible for serving alcohol. Those held liable, in either criminal or civil actions, provided alcohol to someone who is subsequently involved in a vehicle crash or other activity which caused death, injury or even property damage. Businesses that serve alcohol go to great extent to train their personnel in preventing patrons from being over served. Most often the social host involved in legal actions is a private individual who served alcohol in their home, where they are considered to be the host. However, when the event is a company or organization affair, the company or organization can be held liable – meaning GWRRA and its officers could be held responsible. Think about that. If you're the Chapter Director, you could be held liable even though the event wasn't in *your* home. Yes, GWRRA has liability insurance which covers the Association and its officers. But would it cover you if you are violating written Association policy?

So what are some things to avoid when planning your event? For openers, if the party is at an individual's home, do not serve alcohol, period. If the event is being conducted at a facility that serves alcohol, do not set up a cash bar in the room your event is being held in, or in the 'prefunction' gathering area, as that could place GWRRA in a position of liability. And do not advertise that a cash bar is being made available on any of your flyers or party announcements regardless of where the cash bar may be – even if it is the normal location of the bar in the facility. Lastly, do not allow the facility to make any mention of alcohol availability in their contract for the event, as that too, could place GWRRA and its officers in a position of liability.

Liability issues aside – the main reason for the policy, as I see it, is we don't want to be the cause of losing any of our GWRRA family as a result of providing alcohol. So let me leave you with this. If you're having a Chapter event at your home or other location that doesn't commercially serve alcohol, follow the policy and don't make it available. If you're having your event at a location that does serve alcohol as part of their normal business, and choose to consume, please do it responsibly. I want to see all of our family together in the coming year!

The more you know, the better it gets!


