



Season's Greetings,

As we move into New Year, we, as educators should pause and take a look at what was accomplished in 2017 and how we can improve our educational training in 2018.

We first must deal with a MAJOR change in the Rider Education Program. Beginning in January 2018, the chapters will no longer have a Chapter Educator. During the restructuring process it was decided that the Chapter Educator position will be deleted and Chapter Ride Coordinator takes its place. Yes, the duties of Chapter Ride Coordinator will change drastically for the better.

What hasn't changed is my annual 'FREE' luncheon for the former CE's, now the new CRC's (Chapter Ride Coordinators) and their spouses at Mid-Winter Rendezvous. I'm hoping more 'Job Description' information will be available. If so will be presented at that meeting by my ADE and me.

One more bit of information. National has created a NEW position at the District level named "District Ride Coordinator". It IS an officer position. Our District Directors Bill & Sarah Watts and I have appointed Bob & Barb Brown to that position. Not only will he be coordinating District ride events, he is the contact at the District level for the Chapter Ride Coordinators.

Here are a few training opportunities for everyone. KSH is working on sponsoring a Medic First Aid Course (MFA) January 27. Contact Dale Tritsch if you would like to attend this course.

If you cannot make that MFA course, a second opportunity presents itself at the Kansas Summit, scheduled for March 17, 2018. We plan on starting MFA at 8am Saturday morning.

There are additional opportunities to participate in the educational seminars and modules. Rider Ed will be presenting four seminars and Leadership Training will present four modules. In addition to the four seminars and MFA, Rider Ed is having the Trike <u>classroom</u> portion of the Trike course in the afternoon. If you have never taken the classroom portion this is your opportunity to do so, and then enroll in our Trike Course (TRC-R), short version April 7, 2018.

Below is the rest of our 2018 scheduled Riding courses.

April 22: BRC2. This is a two wheel advanced MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation)

May 5: TC &TTRC. This is the Trailering course for two wheels and Trikes ENROLLMENT IS OPEN FOR ALL SESSIONS

Hello everyone.

Well it's December and that means that 2017 is almost over...boy did this year go by fast. So let's talk a little bit about what happened in November.

On the 4th Chapter Q had their chapter's birthday party (not sure how old) where we all enjoyed a bowl of the great chili that Sheila Tucker made then enjoyed several games of bingo. I think it's safe to say that everyone in attendance had a great time.

On the 9th was our Chapter meeting and we had a great group of people there where we talked about the rides we went on then Bob Brown gave us a great lesson about how to prepare our bikes for the winter...normally I try to talk a little bit about what he taught us but I left the lesson sitting on the table when I went home so I will try to do my best (after doing a little research on google)

1) Surface Prep

Wash your bike and dry it completely to get all the moisture off the surfaces (an electric leaf blower is a great way to get all the nooks and crannies really dry.) Add a coat of wax, which will act as a barrier against moisture and rust. Finally, spray exposed metal surface with WD-40 to displace all moisture (fun fact: the WD in "WD-40" stands for water displacement) and to give them a protective coating against corrosion.

2) Change Oil and Filter

Change your oil and filter. It's better for your lubrication system to have fresh oil sitting in it for several months than to have used, broken down oil in it, Using a winter weight oil like 5W30 can help it start up easier come spring time as well. keep moisture from building up on them and causing any rusting or binding. Any part of your motorcycle that needs to be lubed at any point should be lubed again before storage. Some parts to check are: chain drive, cables, controls, fork surfaces, and any other pivot points.

4) Prep Fuel System

Gas tanks have a tendency to rust when not in use, and untreated pump gas breaks down and becomes gummy over time. To prevent rusting and make sure your fuel is ready to run after a few months in storage, you'll want to fill your tank completely with fuel treated with a product like Sta-Bil Fuel Stabilizer.

5) Safeguard Battery

Batteries have a tendency to self-discharge when sitting over time, especially when they remain hooked up to the bike. The easiest way to combat this is to hook up a battery tender like the Battery Tender Super Smart Junior which uses smart technology to monitor the charge and keep the battery topped off without overcharging.

6) Protect Tires

If your tires are left to sit in the same position all winter long, they could develop flat spots. Keeping the tires off of the ground will prevent this, so if you have Motorcycle Stands, put the bike up on them for storage. If you don't have stands, try to get at least the rear tire off the ground, or you can rotate your tires by rolling your motorcycle slightly every few weeks. If you need to leave your tires down on concrete, put a piece of carpet or plywood under them to keep any moisture from seeping into them.

Keeping moving parts lubed during the winter will help

7) Check Coolant/Anti-freeze

If you'll be storing your bike somewhere that gets below freezing, make sure you have adequate levels of antifreeze in your coolant system. This is very important; if you run straight water in your coolant system and it freezes, you could come back to a cracked head in the spring!

8) Plug Out Pests

Mice and other rodents are notorious for hiding from the cold inside exhaust pipes and making homes out of air filters. If order to avoid any furry surprises when it's time to ride again, plug up your pipes with an exhaust plug like the BikeMaster Rubber Muffler Plug. You can also simply stuff your air intake and the ends of your exhaust with some plastic bags - but do use bright colored bags or tie something to them so you don't forget take them out when you fire up the bike!

9) Keep it Covered

With your motorcycle fully prepped for winter, invest in a proper motorcycle cover. A quality motorcycle cover will not only keep dust off the bike, but will keep the moisture out so it doesn't get trapped underneath it, and create corrosion or rust. If you're storing it outside, be sure to get a cover with tie downs to prevent it from blowing loose in wind. If you're storing it inside you're in much better shape, but you should still use a cover to prevent dust from building up on it.

10) Theft Protection

If you're storing your bike outside, bear in mind that being parked unattended for months at a time makes it an easy target for theft. In addition to protecting your bike from weather, using a cover will conceal it from view, and securing it with a heavy lock and chain can give you some peace of mind. If you'll be storing your bike anywhere it can be accessed by others, consider investing in some security measures.

On the 17th our Chapter had a get together at Taco Fajitas...if you ever wanted to see what happens to a very small restaurant when 20 (or more) Goldwingers show up to eat you should have been there this evening. Did some of us make a mistake by leaving early and missing out... maybe?

















The very next day on the 18th was another get together. This one was in Altoona Kansas @ the Prairie Nut Hut. This was another of those small restaurants where there were so many of us there that we ended up eating is shifts just so everyone who wanted to could sample just how tasty a Prairie Nut could be. (A couple of people even brought their own dipping sauce). I believe I saw someone from each of the chapters at this event.

The 23rd was Thanksgiving and I hope everyone enjoyed the day however they got to spend it.

Everybody loves a parade! November 11, Veterans Day, dawned cold in northeast Kansas. Even with the cold temperatures, the streets were lined with people as we rode through downtown with flags waving and people cheering. We were glad to honor and celebrate all the men and women who have served or are serving in the armed forces of the United States of America. Two Chapter B members chose to ride in the Veterans Day parade in Leavenworth. Since both parades that Chapter B usually participates in fell on the same day this year, a choice had to be made. We were happy to have members in both parades saluting our veterans.

Questions about Veterans Day and the military were part of the trivia fun at the November monthly Chapter B meeting. Armistice Day, as it was originally known, was first celebrated to honor those who had fought and died in World War I. In 1945, World War II veteran, Raymond Weeks thought all veterans should be honored and proposed the change. U.S. Representative Ed Rees from Emporia, Kansas later presented a bill in Congress and President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the bill into law in 1954, eight and one-half years after Weeks held the first Armistice Day celebration for all veterans. Congress amended the bill a week after it was signed and replaced "Armistice" with "Veterans" and Veterans Day has been celebrated since. Plans for the chapter Christmas party and couple of the year basket were also discussed.




Hello to all of you Friendly, Fun, Fabulous Members!




