Hello everyone. By the time you read this we will all have been stuffed with turkey and all of the trimmings. I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving and we are on the downhill slide to Christmas. The full Holiday Season will soon be upon us too. Enjoy attending the various parties and gatherings with your families and with your GoldWing family.

On November 9th we held our second Kansas Summit. We had a good crowd in attendance at Greenwich Elementary School for the event. I would like to thank Brenda Kistler from Chapter F for arranging the use of the school for this event. I also would like to thank Doris for assisting in putting on this event. I would also like to thank the members that came out and enjoyed the day learning and refreshing their skills and training.

Jack and Doris Schoeck and Bill Tucker presented a very nice Medic First Aid and CPR Renewal for the members. Remember if you need to renew or get initial certification for Medic First Aid and CPR please contact Steve Bockhaus or myself and we can get a training class scheduled. We do bring that training to the Chapters so gather your members and schedule a class.

We also had seminars on Team Riding presented by Bob Brown. We had a nice group discussion on night riding. A University Module called Zone Out presented by Joe Magnet from Chapter B. Thank you Joe for coming all the way to Wichita to help us out by presenting this module for us. We finished up the afternoon with a seminar on Motorcycle Crash Scene Response.

In carrying on with my explanations about the Levels Program I would like to talk briefly about the Masters Recognition. This information is taken directly from the GWRRA Handbook.

Master's Recognition

Master Tour Riders that have remained current (Riding Course/CO-Rider Seminar/2up Rider Course and First Aid/CPR recertification requirements) for increments of 5, 10, or 15 years are eligible to be awarded special recognition. This recognition is represented by a Master's Recognition patch. To check if you might be eligible for one of the Recognition Levels, check the "Master Recognition Eligibility" found in the Educators Tool Box of the Officer section on the Rider Ed website.

Senior Master

Those Members meeting a minimum 5 years of active participation and <u>continuous</u>* recertification as a Master Tour Rider may be recognized and receive a Senior Master Rocker upon application to GWRRA.

Grand Master

Those Members meeting a minimum 10 years of active participation and <u>continuous*</u> recertification as a Master Tour Rider may be recognized and receive a Grand Master Rocker upon application to GWRRA.

Life Grand Master

Those Members meeting a minimum 15 years of active participation and <u>continuous</u>* recertification as a Master Tour Rider may be recognized and receive a Life Grand Master Rocker upon application to GWRRA.

Application

Application for the recognition program patch is made using the Master tour Rider/ Co-Rider Application Form (N.9). The cost of the **optional** patch is \$2.00 USD. The form is sent to the District Educator for Verification.

*SIMPLY FULFILLING LONGEVITY REQUIREMENTS DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIRE-MENTS OF T THIS PROGRAM. THE APPLICANT MUST REMAIN CERTIFIED/ RECERTIFIED FOR THE TIME REQUIREMENT. HAVING A MASTER NUMBER ON THE ELIGIBILITY LIST DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY QUALIFY SOMEONE FOR THE MASTER'S RECOGNITION PROGRAM.

IF THERE IS A TIME WHEN COURSES ARE NOT CURRENT, OR MEMBERSHIP EX-PIRES, THE MEMBER NEED ONLY REJOIN GWRRA, RECERTIFY AND REMAIN CUR-RENT FOR THE ADDITIONAL TIME REQUIRED TO MAKE UP THE NON-CURRENT TIME. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE MASTER TOUR RIDER/CO-RIDER TO EN-SURE THERE IS NOT LAPSE IN THE TIME THAT THEIR MEMBERSHIP OR COURSES ARE CURRENT. THE RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM LEVELS DATABASE AND DIS-TRICT EDUCATOR CAN BE USEFUL IN ASSISTING THE PARTICIPANT IN MEETING THE RIDER EDUCATION PORTION OF THESE GOALS.

The last thing I would like to cover is Updating your Levels Information. Something that has not been discussed recently is high or safe miles. I know that as GoldWing riders we are always talking about how many miles we have on our bikes and are very proud of the miles we have ridden. Below is how to update your Levels information and your high miles.

Updating Levels Information

When a member already in the Levels program completes a Rider Course, First Aid, CPR, Co-Rider Seminar or wishes to update their high or safe miles he/she should use the N.10 Levels Data Update Form. This form may be found on the Rider Education Webpage in the Officer Tab.

When a member wishes to progress to a higher level in the Levels Program they should use the N.7 for Levels I, II and III and the N.9 for Level IV.

The N.7, N.9 and N.10 forms are forwarded to the District Educator for input into the Member's information in the Rider Education Database.

I know this has been a bit long winded but lots of information to get out to the members. If you have any questions feel free to contact your Chapter Director or myself and we will get the information you are seeking.
















From the Kansas Winger Editor and Publishers, Bill & Sheila Tucker.
