

The Kansas Traffic Safety Resource Office is having the training summit in Wichita at the First United Methodist Church 330 N. Broadway. Marv, Rick and I are giving the seminar 'Motorcycle Crash Scene Response'. This summit is open to everyone.

March 25th is the first riding course. The Trike Course (TRC) will be given, weather permitting. At this writing we have two (2) openings. We have set a "Bad Weather" date of May 13<sup>th</sup> which is the day for the Trailering courses. We chose that day because we rarely have enough sign up to have the course. The rest of the training schedule is below.

We are hoping to have two or three Road Captain Courses (RCC). Our goal is to have one in the Wichita area where Chapter A-P-Q-F are located. Then schedule one east close to chapter C & B. Chapter H usually sponsors one and fills it, but if not folks can join us there.

The new District Directors want the Rider Ed team to put together a one day Retreat and include the Leadership Training and Membership Enhancement Divisions. He is aware that we have been attempting to do that for three years but there is so much going on it is difficult to find one weekend day open. With that said we will give it another shot, Right team?





## From your Chapter MAC



When the weather turns cold and riding slows down, what do you do with your time? You could fill some of the time with visiting your favorite motorcycle shop and drooling over the new motorcycles but now is also a good time to do that maintenance you may have put off or missed doing during riding season. Go over your bike with a fine tooth comb and check a few things, for instance:

- Change the oil and filter. It is better for your lubrication system to have fresh oil sitting in it for several months instead of the old broken down oil in it
- Lubricate moving parts. Lubing the chain drive, cables, controls, fork surfaces and any other pivot points, keeps moisture from building up.
- Check your tires. Look for cracks on your tires. It is also a good idea to have your bike up off the concrete during winter, or at least move it around once in a while so flat spots don't happen.
- Keep the battery charged. Use a battery tender or remove the battery from the bike, store it in a dry spot and charge it once a month.
- Add fuel stabilizer and antifreeze. Gunked up gas and cracked heads make for a big mess when you get ready to ride in the spring.
- It is always a good idea to check the tires, chains, cables, etc. now and replace what's needed. If a bike shop does your maintenance, it's easier to get it taken care of now than in the spring.
- Now is also a good time to upgrade accessories. I would guess Santa may have delivered some cool gifts to add to your bike.

If you've done all of that, then relax, watch some football and wait for nicer days to come. Let's have a SAFE, HAPPY and FUN 2017!



# **Spreading the News!**

Newsletters inform Members and Officers of what's going on. No matter how plain or fancy, the main purpose is to communicate with the Members. There are a few 'rules' for newsletters.

Chapter participants cannot be charged to receive a newsletter. Members should not be asked for a contribution to receive a newsletter. Newsletter costs should be charged off as an operating expense to the Chapter and paid for from the Chapter operating funds. It should be available to all GWRRA Members shown on your ARL.

The format you choose is up to you, but the "heading" of the newsletter must have the Chapter name and the GWRRA logo on it to indicate that it is a GWRRA newsletter. Your Region and District designation should also be visible, along with the month and year.

Newsletters provide you an opportunity to "talk" with the Members on a one-to-one basis and is **never** to be used as a platform for personal tirades or "politicking" for, or against, a particular cause. Information from Home Office, Region and District should be included to assist them in understanding the concept, goals and workings of GWRRA. Other contributions should come from folks like your Rider Educator with items on safety. Members may submit interesting items about trips, experiences, anniversaries, etc. All Chapters within a District are encouraged to exchange newsletters. Copies should also be sent to your District, Region and Deputy Director.

Newsletters should be distributed at least monthly to all Chapter participants. Sometimes, Chapters "piggy-back" their information with a "sister-Chapter" or participate in a District publication for more efficient use of resources. This is acceptable.

We know many distribute newsletters through email or on your web sites; but we must remember there are those who do not have access to the Internet. Therefore, hard copies of newsletters should be mailed to those Members. You should also have copies available at your Chapter gatherings for any visitors or guests.

Newsletter editors are the heroes of our Association. Please thank them for their efforts and help them out by providing articles or pictures.
