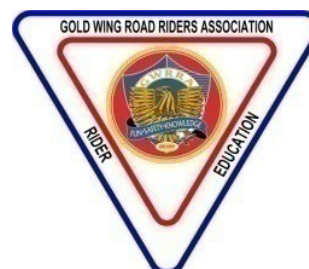

The Chapter Educators and their wives were treated to a luncheon Saturday then we had an informal business meeting. But the main purpose of the luncheon was let the Kansas Chapter Educators know how much we (Jim Lamb ADE) and I appreciated their time and leadership they provide to their chapter participants and to the District Rider Ed staff.

We talked about how well we did in meeting or surpassing the 2013 goals. I assured them they did super in helping reach those goals.

The educators were reminded that we encourage chapters to host/sponsor some Rider Ed Seminars, particularly during the non-riding season. It is also a very good time to have the Medic First Team come to their area and provide the life saving techniques.

I announced the plan to have two Road Captain courses this year and the first one will be in Hutchinson Kansas. I've schedule it twice there and had to cancel, not for lack of interest. Look out Hutchinson; here we come (I PROMISE)J. Weather permitting and availability of a classroom Rick Stevens and I will be there in March and east in the fall.

The second location will be in the Lawrence or Lenexa area in the fall. The good thing about this course is we do not need a range; just a classroom and streets ride on.

Jim lamb, Rick Stevens and I have selected the dates for our four riding courses. I will announce them as soon as Rick gets the approval of the City of Wichita to use the parking lot. We will have two wheeler course (BRC2) first, then a Trike course (TRC), followed with either a Two wheeler with trailer (TC) or a second BRC2. We haven't had much luck in getting enough interest in the 2 wheeler/trailing course, but will have it if enrollment is there.. We will close out the year with the popular Trike Trailering (TTRC) .

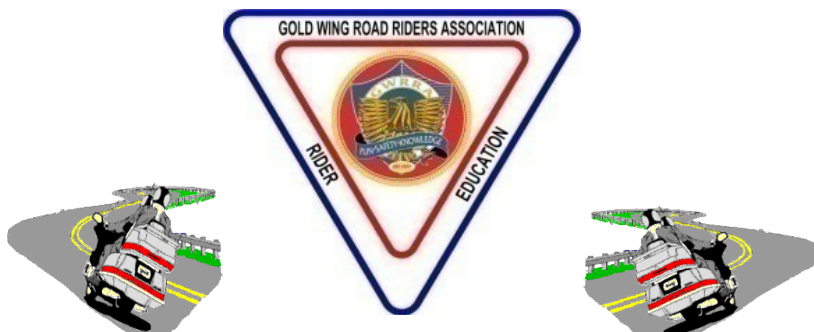

Who's on First?

At this time, the Officer Handbook is a bit outdated when it comes to the levels and titles of GWRRA's leadership and who is responsible to who. In an effort to stay up to date, here is what the revised structure looks like. As far as most Members are concerned, nothing has changed. Beginning at the levels most of us are interested in, what is depicted in the Officer Handbook has not changed with respect to Chapter, District or even Region Team structure or titles. Each of those respective levels of the Association are just as they have always been, both in Team composition and reporting - Chapter to District; District to Region. The changes begin to apply at the Region Director and three GWRRA Program teams - Rider Education, Membership Enhancement and Leadership Training. In 2013, the structure was changed somewhat by adding five new Deputy Directors. Four of those positions are geographically organized with two to four Regions assigned to each Deputy Director; three in the U.S. and one in Canada. The Region Directors report thru these Deputy Directors. The fifth Deputy Director is known as Director of Programs and, as the title depicts, is responsible for coordinating activities of the three GWRRA Programs. Each of these Deputy Directors is responsible to the Director of GWRRA, previously referred to in the Handbook as Executive Director. One last title change - those in charge of the three GWRRA Programs were previously known as International Directors and are now simply known as Directors.

There you have it. A few things changed, but most stayed the same.

The more you know, the better it gets!

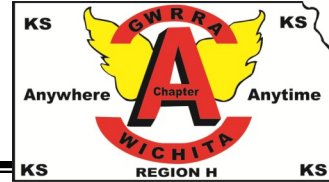
Well, that's a capsule peek at the 26th Mid-Winter Rendezvous. The facilities were very good and the general consensus from the attendees was let's come back next year.

Food for Thought

As you are riding along on your GL1500 or GL1800, have you ever thought about what is happening between your legs.

At 70mph your engine will be turning approximately 3,000 rpm. To put this in perspective, there are six little pistons, each moving up and down 50 times every second. Your engine has 12 valves, each opening and closing 750 times a minute for a total of 9,000 times a minute or 540,000 times every hour.

Your carburetor or fuel injector squirts into each cylinder about .02 millilitre of gas 750 times a minute, or less than a half ounce every minute. Then we explode that fuel and air mixture 750 times a minute for each of the six cylinders to turn a crankshaft, that turns the gears, that turns a drive shaft, that turns the back wheel and propels you, your co-rider and your luggage down the road.

It is simply amazing technology when you put it in these terms. As a matter of fact it is absolutely mind boggling! Now you do the math. One rider at the Region "I" rally has ridden a 2003 GL1800 over 250,000 miles without doing any repairs on his engine. Eat your heart out Harley Davidson.

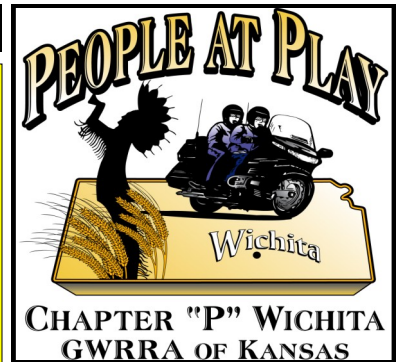

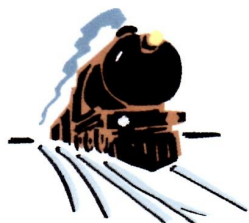

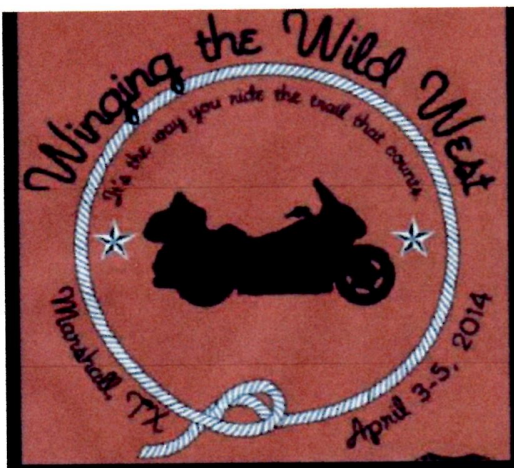
