
## Message From Your District Events Coordinator



Hold it a minute. Have you prepared yourself for the riding season? I imagine that all of us take a lot of care of our machines, so they are ready to ride, but did we forget to take care of our mine and bodies during non-riding season. We all need to mentally and physically be ready before riding. Have we been exercising? What about how we ate! Are we getting the recommended amount of restful sleep?

'Surprises' are 'fun' when they involve a party or opening a gift. We just did that didn't we! But did you know that 'surprise' is the common factor in most all accidents? No one has an accident on purpose,

but when a person is 'surprised' by unexpected obstacles or event, the potential for injury is very high. Your best defense against accidents is to avoid 'surprise' by being alert at all times and be trained on how to handle the situation. Again, did you prepare your mind to ride? Be alert for obstacles and action of others sharing the roadway that could cause you or someone else to get hurt. So, PLEASE, be prepared to react to that unwanted 'SURPRISE'. Take a rider course no matter how many times you've taken it. It will tune up your skills and reaction time which will pay dividends. It is 'cool' to be safe.

It's time to put this puppy to bed. No, not Tucker the yellow lab, the article.

Sheila and I once again wish you and yours the very best of the New Year 2015. We'll see you at Mid-Winter Rendezvous.

Be ready to rumble. There is so much to do at the rendezvous. There is 'Fun' things, relaxing things, brain teasers, team competition, seminar opportunities and excellent companionship with one another. AND, my favorite veggie, pop corn, its free. J And special entertainment by Dave Patton, a crooner from Kansas Chapter 'B' followed by a nice banquet meal.

## January – Its That Time of Year

Each January Districts conduct an event that may go by many different names. They may be known as Operations meetings, business meetings, paperwork meetings or Mid-Winter events. Regardless of what they are called, they all have a common purpose - to share information and take care of annual financial reporting requirements. There may be other activities involved, such as training seminars, swearing in new Officers, presenting incoming Couples of the Year, fellowship, fun and games. They are conducted by the District Director and should be attended by all members of the District and Chapter Officer teams. 


# The Kansas Twisters




