

WINTER RIDING

This week has definitely provided us an official start to the winter riding season but you can extend your riding season if you prepare yourself for the colder winter weather.

Motorcycling + snow/ice = disaster. Only go out on your motorcycle when the roads are clear of snow and ice. Be sure that any ice that may have formed earlier (such as overnight) has completely melted away before you set out on your journey. Remember that rain dries and snow melts faster on some sections of a road than on others. Patches of ice tend to develop in low or shaded areas and on bridges and overpasses.

Dress appropriately with insulated gear and ensure none of your skin is exposed. Heated gear such as heated vests, gloves, and grips can greatly help warm you up and make for a more comfortable ride.

When calculating the temperature to determine whether it is too cold or whether you feel you can brave the frigid weather – take the wind chill factor into account. Make sure to add the average speed at which you feel you will be traveling to the actual wind speed to come up with the wind speed to base your calculation. For example, using the above charts, if the temperature is 0C, and the wind speed is 20 km/h, and you will be traveling down city roads averaging 60 km/h – you should be prepared to ride in -10C degree weather.

Take breaks more often and warm up with a hot cup of coffee / tea / hot chocolate. When taking a break, move around to get the blood flowing throughout your body with special attention to your hands and feet.

Keep your hands warm and use your judgment to know when the conditions are unsafe. By the time the next motorcycling season comes around your skills will be sharp and your bike will be ready to go! Ride safe! Jim Lamb, Kansas District Rider Educator







Numbers To Live By

Understanding key numbers—BMI, bloodsugar level—can lead to better health.

Blood Pressure

Healthy number: Less than 120/80 mmHg. Blood pressure refers to the force of blood against the walls of your arteries when your heart beats (systolic pressure, the top number) and during rests between beats (diastolic pressure, the bottom) and is measured in millimeters of mercury (mmHg). "The lower yours is, the better," says Dr. Holly Thacker, director of the Center for Specialized Women's Health at the Cleveland Clinic. High blood pressure, or hypertension, is 140/90 mmHg or higher. Hypertension is called "the silent killer" because it often has no symptoms and, left untreated, can lead to stroke, heart disease, kidney damage, and vision and memory problems. (If your top number is between 120 and 139 and the lower is between 80 and 89, you have prehypertension, which also carries risks.)

Have yours checked: Every time you see a doctor, including an ob-gyn. To lower your numbers, consume a low-fat, low-sodium diet; exercise often; maintain a healthy weight; limit alcohol intake; don't smoke; and manage stress. Your doctor may prescribe a diuretic to flush out excess sodium. If that and lifestyle changes don't work, other medicines, like an angiotensin converting enzyme (ACE) inhibitor, may be prescribed.

Blood Sugar

Healthy number: A fasting blood-sugar level of 99 mg/dL or less.

A fasting blood-sugar test measures glucose (sugar) in milligrams per deciliter (mg/dL) of blood after you haven't eaten for at least eight hours. A level of 126 mg/dL or higher indicates diabetes, a condition in which your body doesn't produce enough insulin (which converts blood sugar into energy) or use insulin properly. Diabetes more than doubles your risk of heart disease and increases your chances of kidney disease, vision loss, and other health issues.

Have yours checked: At age 45, then every three years after that. (Your doctor may test you earlier if you are overweight or have a family history of diabetes.) Some doctors also do a hemoglobin A1C test, which measures glycated hemoglobin (HbA1C), a substance in red blood cells that forms when glucose attaches to hemoglobin. This "gives a better picture of average blood sugar over the previous three months," says Dr. Wendy S. Klein, an internist in Richmond, Va. An optimal A1C reading is less than 5.7 percent. To improve your blood-sugar numbers, shed any excess pounds.

Live a healthy lifestyle, don't rely on medications.

- 2 boneless chicken breasts
- 1 can cheddar cheese soup
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can Rotel
- 1 1/2 Tbls milk
- 1 onion, chopped
- Totilla chips
- Shredded cheddar cheese

In a sauce pan combine water & bouillon. Add broccoli & onion. Bring to boil & then simmer for 10 minutes.

Combine soup, milk & pepper. Add to broccoli mixture.

Simmer until hot.

TACO SOUP Janis Mooney

1 1/2 lb Hamburger 1/2 cup chopped onion

Cook hamburger & onion together. Drain then add 1 pkg taco seasoning mix.

Add the following and DO NOT DRAIN

1 can corn 1 can pinto beans can ranch style beams
 can hominy
 can Rotel
 can chopped stewed tomatoes
 pkg dry hidden valley ranch dressing
 cans tomato sauce
 cups water

DO NOT ADD SALT

Mix and simmer 45 minutes.

KANSAS DIRT (Served at District Team Meeting) Sheila Tucker

1/2 pkg large Oreo cookies
1 4 oz pkg Cream Cheese
1 box instant vanilla pudding
1/2 cup powdered sugar**
8 oz Cool Whip
1/4 cup margarine (1/2 stick)
1 1/2 cup cold milk
1/2 t vanilla

Crush cookies and put 1/2 the crumbs in a 9x9* pan. Mix cream cheese & margarine until smooth. Mix in powdered sugar and fold in cool whip. In separate bowl mix pudding, milk & vanilla. Fold in mixzture and pour on the crumbs. Spread remaining crumbs over top. Refrigerate.

*For a large group, double the ingredients and put in 9x13 pan. ** May substitute a non-sugar product for the diabetics.

1/2 cup oil 2 tsp vanilla 2 cups grated zucchini Enough water to make a 'like a cake batter'.


Grease a 9x13 cake pan and bake at 350 degrees, 25 minutes



Those of you that read the Winger know that most of the articles are submitted by the Chapter Directors or their editors and from the District Team. And occasionally from the region team.


