### MOTOR AWARENESS COORDINATOR

My goodness, it is hot in Kansas.

Not sure how many are riding in the heat, but I know there are many. Hopefully you are prepared to handle Heat exhaustion if it occurs while riding.

The following suggestions to recognize and treat 'heat exhaustion is taken from the Medic First Aid Manual, pg 160-161. It also discusses muscle spasms.

**SPASMS:** "Heat cramps are uncontrollable muscle spasms that can affect the calves, arms, abdominal muscles and back. They can occur suddenly and be very painful." (We know that don't we!)

"Manage cramps by stopping activity, moving the person to a cooler location, and having them drink water or a sports drink. Stretching and direct pressure to the cramping muscle may help. Delay further activity until the cramping has been resolved."

**HEAT EXHAUSTION:** "Heat exhaustion can develop from the combination of an increased internal temperature and the excessive loss of fluids to the environment, typically from sweating.

**THE SIGNS:** "Signs include heavy sweating and pale, cool skin. The person may become nauseated and vomit. He/she may complain of a headache or dizziness and feel weak."

"Although it may not appear serious, treat suspected heat exhaustion without delay. Without immediate treatment it could progress to heat stroke, a life-threatening condition."


**TREATMENT:** "Stop the person from activity and move her to a cooler place. Loosen or remove excess clothing. Have the person lie down and raise the legs 6-12 inches. Spray water or apply cool, wet cloths to head and torso. (If possible), use a fan to speed evaporation.

Encourage the person to drink cool fluids, preferably a sports drink with carbohydrates and electrolytes. If the person does not improve or seems to get worse, activate EMS."

**HEAT STROKE:** Briefly a note on Heat Stroke. It can take your life folks. Page 163 lists some symptoms of Heat Stroke.

"In addition to the signs of heat exhaustion, a person with heat stroke will have an altered mental status. The skin can become red, very warm, or even hot, and be completely dry. Heavy sweating could be present, especially when exertion is the cause. The person may collapse and have a seizure. Activate EMS immediately and begin aggressive cooling with the resources available."

**TREATMENT (Until EMS arrives):** "Spray or pour water on the victim and fan him. Apply ice packs to the person's neck, groin, and armpits. Cover the victim with a wet sheet and continue to fan. The best method when possible is to immerse the person in cool water up to his neck."



**NOT RESPONSIVE:** "Place him on his side in the recovery position to protect the airway. Do not force the person to drink fluids. Never give an unresponsive person anything by mouth.

Don't know what the recovery position is? Enroll in a Medic First Aid class and you will learn a lot about saving lives.

Hope this information is helpful to you in the event you encounter someone that needs your help.

**MYTHS:** The following two myths are addressed.

**Myth #1:** Medic First Aid offered by Rider Education and GWRRA is for people in the levels program so they can advance. RIGHT & WRONG. Medic First Aid is one requirement for those wanting to advance to Level III. That is the RIGHT part. But in my humble opinion Medic First Aid or other first aid course is for everyone and anyone that wants first aid training to be prepared to possibly save a life, maybe a family member. Don't you think everyone should know the basics of first aid treatment, no matter the cost to take a course? How can we put a price on 'LIFE'?

**Myth #2:** Many think the Road Captain Course is for those that what to be lead group ride or be a tailgunner/drag for a group. RIGHT & WRONG. It is for that but it is also for anyone that rides in group. We all need to know how to ride safe in a group and this course will help with that knowledge. I suggest you also attend GWRRA's 'Team Riding Seminar' before taking the RCC.

**Other news.** We had a very good Road Captains Course (RCC) in Hutchinson Kansas in June. Marv Ayers, Rick Stevens and yours truly were the presenters.

Folks, so many of GWRRA's Rider Education programs (Seminars/Riding Courses) are design to prepare you for an emergency either during a individual or group ride on being at home and action by you is needed to possibly safe a life. Most of the Rider Education Educational seminars are 'FREE'. Can't ask for any more than that. Even if there is a minimal cost, isn't it worth it to know you just might be in the right place at the right time to use the 'FREE' training? I hope your answer is a resounding YES!

Off my soap box. Sorry, I'm passionate about these things. I've had to use my MFA training in helping a person that needed immediate care. I'm glad I took the time to take the MFA class and learned what to do until EMS arrives.

Our next riding courses we have scheduled are in September and here is the schedule for those classes.

Sept 18<sup>th</sup>= TTRC Trike & Trailer Course

Sept 25<sup>th</sup>= TC (Two Wheeled Trailing Course)

That is it for now. As always, ride smart and be alert to arrive alive.

CHAPTER "B"



Chapter B members and friends were gone seven days as they rode around Oklahoma in May. Led and organized by Dan Gray, the theme, "Ride Through Many Nations" was a reference to the many Native American Nations of Oklahoma. The ride began in DeSoto with fifteen bikes and six passengers heading to the northeast corner marker of Oklahoma, Kansas, and Missouri and then continuing on south along the Arkansas border through the Cherokee and Creek Nations. A lunch stop at the Lazy Parrot in Grove, Oklahoma and then an afternoon of country roads through eastern Oklahoma with the evening lodging in Roland, OK completed the first day.



Day two found the group headed east for a brief ride to Fort Smith, Arkansas before coming back into Oklahoma and continuing the ride south along the Arkansas border to the southeast corner of Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Texas through the Choctaw Nation. They enjoyed a very scenic and twisty ride through the Ouachita National Forest and crossed the Talimena Scenic Byway at Emerald Vista. Catfish was enjoyed at the Catfish King Restaurant in Idabel, OK for lunch and then it was on to the southeast corner. The actual corner marker is in the middle of the Red River so the group decided they would just imagine that they were there. The smell of honeysuckle, the beautiful wildflowers and Cucumber Creek, where the water is green, were some of the day's memories. The evening was spent in Durant, OK with dinner at Billy Sims BBQ.



The Chickasaw Nation and the Leased District were on the agenda for the third day as the group continued west along the Red River to the southern southwest corner bordering the Texas panhandle and then turning north along the Texas border. Lunch was at the Bomber Inn in Frederick, OK and the afternoon gas stop at Hollis, OK got the group as close as possible to the southern southwest corner of Oklahoma and Texas. As they rode along the Texas panhandle they found an interesting outhouse display and crossed the Coffee Pot Creek where the water was the color of coffee



The fourth corner, the southern northeast corner, was found on day four as the group continued north to the western corner of the Oklahoma/Texas panhandle and then turned west along the Texas northern panhandle border through the Seminole Nation and into No Man's Land. A few miles of Historic Route 66 and the Shattuck Windmill Museum were seen. There were no restaurants in this part of Oklahoma so lunch was at the Smokehouse in Perryton, Texas. Wildlife was prevalent as the afternoon ride continued and the group made their way to Dalhart, Texas for the evening stop.



Staying in No Man's Land for day five the group was able to complete the southern panhandle border to the southwest corner of Oklahoma, Texas, and New Mexico. While stopped to add some warmer clothes, a local rancher also stopped to make sure the group was okay. He explained that the famous dust bowl photo was taken very close to the group's current location and that due to the lack of grass in the area, each head of cattle requires twenty acres of land. With not much to see, the group headed north along the New Mexico border. Near the



northwest corner of Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Colorado the group entered the Black Mesa area and stopped at the Black Mesa State Park. It was a beautiful area. A curvy road took the group to the northwest corner marker and then a turn to the east and it was on to Boise City and the Rockin' A Café for lunch. The road leading to the Kansas, Oklahoma, and Colorado marker was underwater so the group ventured east to the end of the panhandle and Hooker, OK. A free meal at the hotel in Woodward, OK brought an end to the day.

With the Kansas border in sight, the group rode through the Cherokee Outlet and back into the Cherokee Nation on day six. More animals were seen and it was a great day of riding. At the hotel, the group met a group of European riders who were riding Route 66 from Chicago to Santa Monica. They enjoyed visiting and looking at the bikes. The evening was spent at the Coleman Theater in Miami, OK where the group enjoyed a tour, buffet dinner and movie at this restored 1900's theater.



Day seven was heading home day. Some of the group left from the hotel. Some completed the loop of Oklahoma along scenic country roads and saw a teepee on the river bluff. It wasn't too hot and the wind wasn't blowing us around at all. We had a great bull session while eating and even managed to finish and get back on the road in time for Brenda and me to get home before it got dark enough for the headlights to really be needed to see the hiway.

We had our extended ride on Saturday the 11<sup>th</sup> with Rick and Rita Thompson leading us to Weston, MO with 8 bikes and 12 people. Rick did a great job since I for one spent just about all of the ride on roads that I had never been on, some that were straight and some that would hurt a snake's back at times. The variety was good to keep it interesting. As we were getting to Atchison for a break at the museum, we were passed at a stop light by 3 bikes that were on the District ride to the Cray Castle. Our ride was scheduled in November so it was in conflict with the District ride that was scheduled at a later date. I'm not sure if any of Chapter C people made the District ride or not. It was announced several times that as always for rides who you rode with didn't matter as long as you enjoyed your ride. I don't remember the name of the place we ate in Weston but all the comments I hear about the food were good. As for myself I had the Big Mouth BLT (I know the name fits the eater) and it was out of this world. The bacon was batter dipped and deep fried. Not a crumb was left on the plate and the onion rings with it were extremely good too. The trip back home was pretty hot but Rick mad enough stops to give us plenty of chances to get something to drink or refile cups to keep hydrated. Our monthly meeting was held on the 21<sup>st</sup> at Perkins with 19 in attendance. The meeting was pretty short since there is no sense in dragging something out just for the sake of killing time. Bill Hanson started things out by point out he had read an article where if my memory is correct 4% of registered motor vehicles are motorcycles accounting for 25% of motor vehicle fatalities. Even if they count all fatalities of riders on unregistered off road bikes and probably even toss in ATVs (thinking like a politician here) the number is way too high. The causes mentioned were primarily caused by drinking, left turns in front of the bike, inattention, riding above rider's ability. It also appeared too many that not wearing a helmet was mentioned in a lot of those accidents. No statistics were available so that was just an observation. Al Davis mentioned that a large number of fatalities in the local area lately have been single bike accidents where the bike went off the road for one reason or the other. Rod Williams looked back on his 30 years in law enforcement and said a vast majority of the fatal accidents involving bikes that he worked were alcohol involved.

Ironically, when we were on our extended ride we had to wait for approximately 5 minutes at the intersection of US 59 and US 24 west of Lawrence while a group of riders went buy. I estimated a minimum of 100 bikes but have no clue if that is even close either high or low. We were behind them going into Topeka and when they were turning to go to what appeared to be a bar (Kickstart) they were on the frontage road blocking traffic to ride into the facility side by side.

While sitting and watching them go by on the road it appeared to me that you could have counted the helmets, in the group, on one hand.

With nothing coming up at the district rally we discussed the supper ride that is being led by John & Teresa Gull. It was scheduled to go to Guy & Mae's for BBQ, but Al said, the owner had passed away, so John will come up with another destination and it will be included in the ride event e-mail Bill will send out.

Since we had no extended ride on the calendar for July Brenda & I decided we would lead a ride to the Boyer Museum in Belleville. We will be leaving from Dara's Fast Lane, on Kimble Ave across from CICO park in the Candlewood shopping center, Manhattan, with a departure time of 10:00 AM with a lunch stop in Concordia at Heavy's BBQ.

With nothing else to discuss we had the 50/50 drawing with Galen Umsheid winning the large one and Rod & Lara Williams winning the small one. It appears they are taking Teresa's spot in winning.





It is the Honda Powersports Trip Planner. It is easy to use and you can save your trip and edit it later. Find it online at <http://tripplanner.honda.com>. All you do is set up a free account so you can log in and start a new trip or view or edit one already planned.

Another is Rever <https://a.rever.co/> where you can download an app to your phone or tablet and it works with Butler Motorcycle Maps. I know of some that have used Rever and gone 115236 miles, and each on a different road.

Another good resource is Butler Motorcycle Maps. They are good for different types of riding and cover almost all of the USA and some other places also. They are not cheap but do come in bundled sets. I think they might be at Wing Ding 38 in Billings, MT. Go online at <https://www.butlermaps.com/> and check it out.

As we all know, if we have a plan the ride goes better. We can always deviate from the original plan and still get where we want to go. Sometimes going a different route or making a new stop keeps the ride interesting and fun. That is what it is all about – Fun.

Rider Ed. Bits

Can you say HOT!!!! Riding in high temperatures is very uncomfortable and very dangerous. There are three conditions you need to be aware of, Heat Cramps, Heat Exhaustion, and Heat Stroke.

Profuse sweating, without replacing fluid, electrolytes, will lead to Heat Cramps. Ignore this condition and you are on your way to Heat Exhaustion, you need to get cooled down quickly. If you think you are too tough to be slowed down by a little heat, you are sliding quickly into Heat Stroke. Heat Stroke is a true medical emergency, without medical treatment this could be your last motorcycle ride. Without medical treatment your body temperature will continue to rise until body functions begin to shut down. Do not ignore what your body is telling you.

On hot days make frequent stops, hydrate with fluids containing electrolytes, like Gatorade, wear cooling vests.

## Afterthoughts

### Who Needs Safety?

Apparently not the Harley riders around my area of Ohio, who from my unscientific study make up about 90% of the motorcycle riders here. Virtually all of them wear the standard Harley uniform of jeans, shoes, t-shirt or tank top, and the standard Harley black leather vest. About one in ten wear a helmet (I counted once), most going with the "do-rag" instead.

After reading in this past weekend's newspaper about yet another motorcycle fatality here (flat tire, passenger ejected, no helmet, died from head trauma in what would likely have been an otherwise survivable accident), I knew what I would be writing about this month.

Now before I get all high and mighty about us Goldwing riders, I should mention that the vast majority of Goldwing riders I see riding around here are no better. Perhaps lulled into a sense of protective safety by the encompassing fairing and bags, I often see Goldwing riders in my area wearing nothing more than shorts, sandals and a T-shirt. Once in a while you'll see a helmet - which I suppose is good for protecting your head as the asphalt removes your skin.

As you might have guessed, I am a long-time ATTGATT (All The Gear, All The Time) proponent. For good reason: the only reason I am here today to write this is because of the helmet I was wearing when I hit the ground.

With the warmer weather upon us, the temptation is there to go without that jacket, without the pants. After all, it's just a quick run to the store, right? What could possibly happen? I can tell you from personal experience what can happen: when the truck turned left in front of me, I was less than half a mile from home. What could possibly happen? My bike was written off, and I spent the next several months on crutches.

I have to say, it's a pain dragging on the pants, the jacket, the boots, the gloves, the helmet, every time I take my bike out. Sometimes I will just give up and take my car on a short journey, because it's not worth the trouble getting kitted out to ride my bike.

The problem is simple: humans were never intended to travel at the speeds at which our motorcycles allow us to. Our brains just don't have the mechanisms in place to actually comprehend the velocities and physics involved travelling at even 40 mph. Therefore, we don't have the sense of fear that should accompany such an action. This is both a blessing and a curse: it allows us to relax and enjoy the sensations and experiences of riding our motorcycles, but it also means that we are lulled into a sense of complacency regarding our ability to survive should we come off of our bikes at such a speed.

I've heard some people say that they only wear their protective gear when they know they might need it. This to me is a ludicrous argument - if you knew in advance that you were going to need your protective gear because you were going to be in an accident, wouldn't you just avoid taking that trip in the first place?

Riding gear is insurance. It's insurance saying "yes, something bad might happen, but I'm going to do my best to protect myself, so that I'm still around for my loved ones, and don't have to spend weeks having gravel scrubbed out of my wounds."

There are those who refuse to wear helmets, saying it's their choice. I hear that a lot, particularly from organizations like ABATE - they dedicate themselves to abolishing helmet laws, trumpeting that it should be the choice of the rider whether or not to wear their helmet. And given that choice, many will not.

However, when that truck turns left in front of you, keep in mind that you are now also choosing to burden your friends and family with attending your funeral - or if you're lucky, with tending to your diminished mental capacity and capabilities for the rest of their lives. And to me, that's just a selfish, irresponsible thing to do.


