





This list will offer up some ideas of food that travel well or some foods that you can pick up on the day that you plan on eating them while traveling.

Nuts – look for raw or roasted ones that are not sugar coated. If you do a lot of traveling the best & least expensive way to purchase them is in bulk.

Fruit – Oranges, apples, apricots & pears pack well and can withstand a little bit of banging around in your luggage.

Veggies – carrots & celery are the 2 most common to find on the road and will last a few days packed without refrigeration. Goes well with Hummus and peanut butter

Rice cakes – they travel well and you can find them in different flavors or use Hummus & peanut butter with these also

Dried meats – if you are going to choose this, know that 95% on the market are high in salt & loaded with nitrates

Cheese – There are many kinds of cheeses and many will travel several days without going bad

Chocolate – Like the dried meat a lot of what is available is not real good for you but sometimes it's what you need/want

Dried fruits – this you want to do in moderation, dried fruits have their value but overdoing will put a heavy glycemic load on your system which you don't need when you are travelling. Again buying in bulk will serve you well.

The Kansas District Rally was on June 23rd & 24th and I would like to thank the District staff for putting on a great party. I know it's not easy to plan something like this but you pulled it off.





Yes, riding a motorcycle CAN be dangerous. Fortunately, bikes also give you the best possible tools to avoid crashing — powerful brakes, obstruction-free vision, excellent handling and tires that grip. Use those tools, and your very own brain, to avoid common motorcycle accidents.

Want to reduce your odds of dying in a crash? Get educated. New riders should complete a basic rider course from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) or something similar.

Safety gear doesn't just help prevent injury in a crash, it can also make riding more comfortable, put you in better control of your bike, and help you be seen by other drivers. Bright colors on your helmet and jacket/suit will help car drivers see you, potentially avoiding some of the most common accidents.

I also had someone recently ask me what TCLOCS stood for. We have several new members and in case they don't know what TCLOCS are. I have a laminated pocket version which is handy to keep on the bike. Ask me for one! Nothing ruins a vacation quicker than an unexpected equipment failure.
