I am writing this edition of the Kansas Winger as your newly appointed Kansas District Educator. I will have a very big pair of shoes to fill following Senior District Educator Bill "Bubba" Tucker. As Bill's Assistant for the past 3+ years I have learned quite a lot but feel that I will have quite a lot more to learn as we move forward.

One of my Goals is to increase the number of participants in the Levels Program. As part of that goal I am going to include the requirements for the 4 levels in this article over the next few months. Last month described Level 1. This month is for Level 2. I know that not everyone is interested in this program, but it is a program that will help you become a safer and more informed rider, if you participate. If you have any questions about your status in the Levels program or any other questions about the education segment of our organization feel free to get in touch with me at rfstevens@gmail.com and I will answer you as soon as possible. Please leave a phone number to reach you if I have any follow up questions.

We had a great Rally in Salina, Kansas this past weekend. On Friday we presented "Riding in Mountains, Hills and Curves" and on Saturday we presented a Road Captain Course. Both of these courses were well attended and we had a lot of good discussions during the class. University Trainers presented Modules on "Just add Spice" and "You don't Know What They Don't Know, Riding with New and Inexperienced Riders". These Modules were also well attended.

We also had a "No Zone" truck provided by the American Trucking Association". Both of the No Zone Road Captains are motorcycle riders and presented great information about just how much you CANNOT see around a truck. Attendees were asked to sit in the driver's seat, with some of the extra mirrors on the truck covered, to see how bikes and cars that they had just seen could not be seen from the driver's position. Also if you see our own Bob Brown ask him about fulfilling a lifelong dream on Saturday.

Please remember that as the weather gets hotter, you need to be aware of the heat and what you can do to take care of yourself. Drink plenty of water, take breaks often, ride early in the morning and get in where it is cool in the afternoon.

We will be having another Training Summit later in the year. We are still in the planning stages and need your ideas for training Modules and Seminars that you would like to have the trainers present. You can email them to me or let me know when you see me at your Chapter meeting.

Level II: Safety by Education

(Tour Rider Program)

Level II of the REP is also referred to as Tour Rider. It represents the commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to be safer motorcycle riders by taking approved motorcycle riding courses at regular intervals. GWRRA has chosen several educational training programs for the Riders and Co-Riders such as GWRRA Rider Courses and Sanctioned PLP programs, the MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) programs, the CSC (Canadian Safety Council) programs, and other approved programs.

Rider Requirements

Be a current GWRRA member.

Be enrolled in Level I of the Rider Education Levels Program and have 5,000 safe miles.

Have a current motorcycle license endorsement as required in the member's home state

Have completed an approved Rider course within the past **three** years or a sanctioned PLP within the **last** year.

Co-Rider Requirements:

Be current GWRRA member.

Be enrolled in Level I of the Rider Education Levels Program and have 5,000 safe miles.

Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past **three** years.

Submit a completed Rider Education Program Levels Application Form (Form N.7), along with optional patch fee to a GWRRA Officer for verification.

Enrollment is free. Patches are available at **\$5.00 FOR EACH PARTICIPANT**. With your purchase you will receive either a Rider or Co-Rider triangle patch.

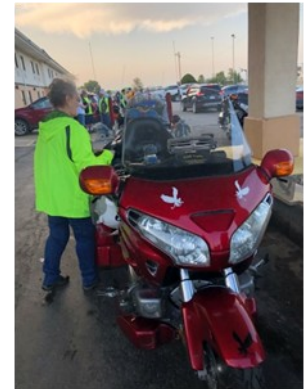
They have a semi in the parking lot then have cars & bikes park around the truck.

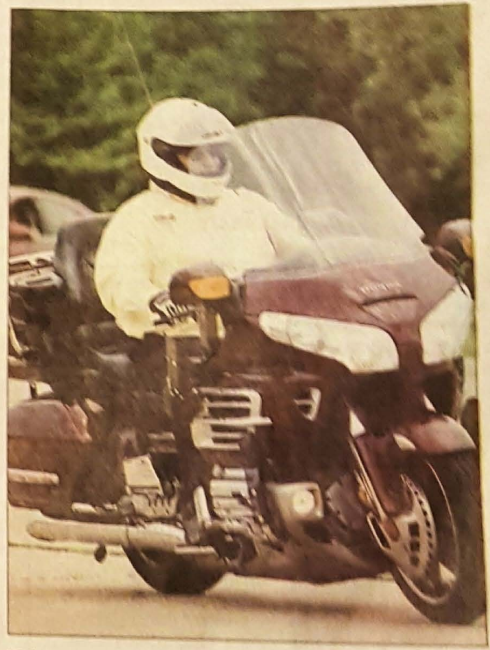

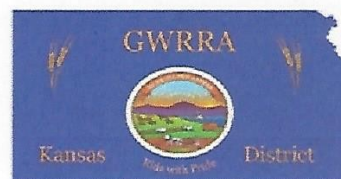
Our next meeting will be August 1st at Boss Hogs in Winfield, Ks., eat at 6 and meeting at 7.

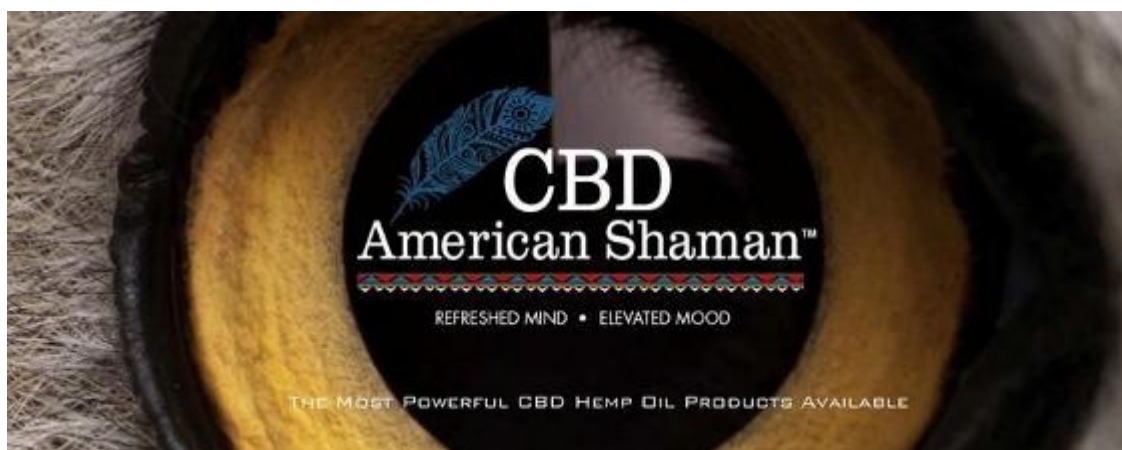
