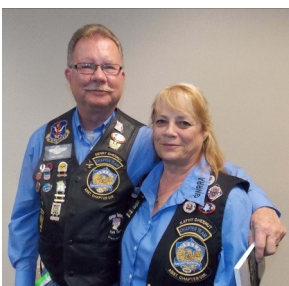

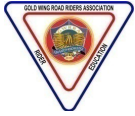

Well it's June which means "Schools out for the summer" which also means for a lot of people that vacation time has started so whatever you have planned enjoy it. In the meantime let's talk about what we did during the month of May

We had our monthly chapter meeting on the 8th and of course it was raining (just as it did most of the month of April) so the attendance was a little low but as always we had a blast.

Bob Brown our Riders Educator gave a great lesson about riding in the wind (and I will try to do him justice by trying to repeat some of his information here).

When riding in the wind (which in Kansas can be an everyday thing) it can be a battle to keep the motorcycle on the road because it seems that the wind is unpredictable but there are clues to watch for such as watching the grass and trees around you. You can tell by how hard they are moving in the wind as to how strong the wind is blowing. We all know that going past something that is blocking the wind, such as a row of trees or a large truck, that as soon as those thing end the wind will be blowing again so be prepared so you don't get blown off the road or into oncoming traffic. When a gust of wind slams into your bike immediately press both grips upwind. If the gust pushes you to the left then you press both grips toward the right. When the gust dissipates quickly & firmly press the grips the opposite way to get the bike rolled upright again.

Protect your eyes from the grit & debris. Don't think that just because you don't see anything around you that it's not there. It can come from wind blowing, but it can also come from another vehicle passing by

Avoid getting tired. The extra energy spent keeping your bike under control will wear you out so take a break every hour or so even if you don't think you need it.

Pay attention to the forecast if high winds are forecast or if there is a tornado alert try to choose a route that avoids the area or abort the ride until conditions improve.

BTW...Steve & Terri Bockhaus got sworn in as M.A.D. leaders for the state of Kansas. For those who do not know what M.A.D. is, it's the Motorist Awareness Division and their goal is to establish the safest motorcycling environment possible and will do this by educating the motorist community. The hope is to reduce the number of motorcycle crashes with other vehicles thus save lives & avoid injuries. So the next time you see Steve & Terri tell them congratulations.

May 13th brought us our monthly chapter ride & Dave & Dana Baranek were in charge. They planned a day ride to Big Brutus. I couldn't go so I am pleased to say that Debbie Gattenby was kind enough to send me the following information

CHAPTER "B"



KANSAS

It has been a full month of riding for Chapter B members. Ed James led the monthly dinner ride on May 4. Seven Chapter B members enjoyed barbecue at Biemer's in Lawrence. The group was small, the weather was not so great, but the food, fun and friendship were wonderful.

An impromptu ride and lunch was led by Allen Robertson on May 13 to the BBQ Shack in Paola. The weather was perfect for the eleven bikes and one car making the journey. Heading south via the back roads, the group rode by and honked at Chapter B member, Chuck Finley's home. The barbecue was exceptional as well as the friends that participated.

It's November 11, 1918 and the guns were silenced. An Armistice was declared to end the fighting of World War I. Two weeks after the Armistice, leaders in Kansas City met to discuss the creation of a monument to honor the men and women who served in the war. More than \$2.5 million was raised in ten days. After three years of construction the Liberty Memorial was completed and President Calvin Coolidge gave the dedication speech on November 11, 1926.



On May 17 Chapter B members met and rode to enjoy breakfast at Dagwood's Cafe and then ventured on to the Liberty Memorial for the mid-monthly ride. The Memorial and Museum are sights to see and there are many artifacts to view and much information to provide an insight into World War I.

Chapter B member, John English provided the following information about the ride he led on May 20. It was a great time for all who went. Thanks John.

One of my favorite early season rides is to Marquette, Kansas for the Thunder on the Smoky rally. The week leading up to the rally was filled with thunderstorms and the early forecasts were for dismal weather on Saturday. But by Friday afternoon, the weather people were telling us that Saturday would be partly cloudy with a 70 degree high, almost perfect riding weather. Four bikes left Lenexa under cloudy skies and just under 60 degrees, but it looked good off to the west. We picked up another bike in DeSoto with a light mist falling. We added two more bikes just south of Lawrence in a light rain. The rain had stopped when we picked up our last bike at US 56 and we could see a little blue sky off to the west. We followed a mule into Burlingame and stopped for a "breakfast feed" as part of the local Rodeo Days.

We topped off the tanks in Council Grove and headed west across the Flint Hills with a spattering of rain off and on. The hills were really green this year with what appeared to be an extraordinary number of cattle fattening up on the bluestem grasses. When a wide load, one of the tower parts for the wind turbines, blocked the route to K 4, we took a tour through downtown Herrington and picked up K 4 west of town, arriving in Marquette at about noon - done with rain for the day. After talking to a couple who hit a deer last year, crashing both of their bikes, I was asked if was safer to hit a deer on a trike or a two wheeler. If you know the answer to that question, you might share it. My advice was not to think about it. I hadn't been to this rally for a few years and a couple of things had changed. The vendors were about the same as was the music in the park. In previous years there had been some street activity - motorcycle games, stunt riders, etc. - not this year. I had also expected a reduced number of bikes because of the weather and I hadn't seen much advertising. However, it looked like it was as popular as ever. I got to visit with a couple of people I knew and hadn't seen for a while. We stayed for about 1 ½ hours, gassed in Lindsborg and took K 4 to Topeka. K 4 is always a great ride and today was no exception. In Topeka we visited Coyote Canyon for dinner and I got a shot of us "Relax Inn" in the parking lot. Take a look at the sky. That is apparently "partly cloudy" because that is what it looked like all day. We reached the high for the day, 61 degrees, about the time we arrived in Topeka.



Gary and Reba Ohler led the breakfast ride on May 27 to Perky's Café in Basehor to finish out the month. Showers were in the forecast and the sky was rather ominous, but nineteen people enjoyed breakfast and time together.

Our extend ride was on the 13th to Marilyn’s in Osage City led by Bill and Margaret Hanson with 6 people and 3 bikes (again all with 3 wheels). After a leisure old fashioned breakfast we headed out on a short relaxing ride. It was probably only

about 75 miles of wondering south of Topeka and ending up back at the Kwik Shop but it worked out well allowing everybody to be back home early in the afternoon to do as they wished.

Our monthly meeting was held on the 16th at Perkins with 10 people in attendance. It appeared that whatever bronchial ailment that is going around hit several of the chapter members leading to the small attendance.

A follow-up email will be sent out after receiving the RSVPs for alternate plans if needed.

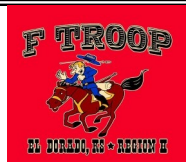

Our meeting was adjourned and refreshments were provided by John and Karen Glaves. They were very good and we appreciate them providing for us.

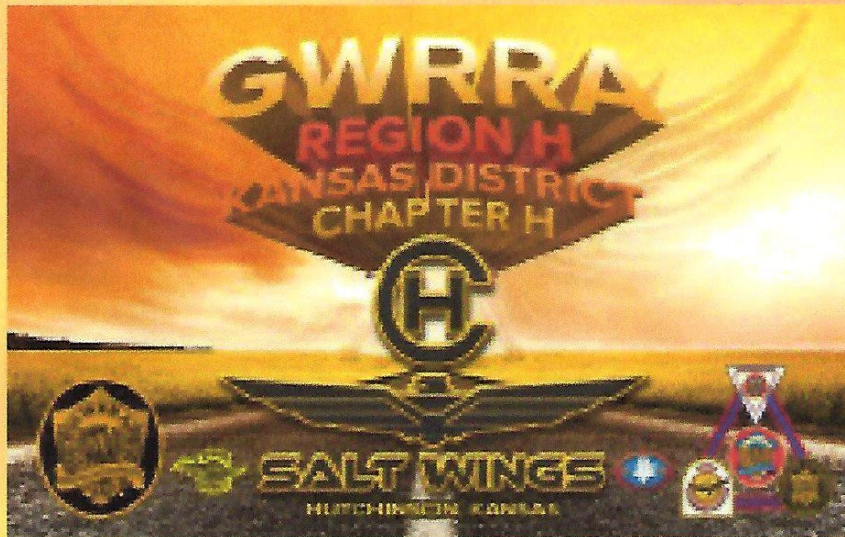

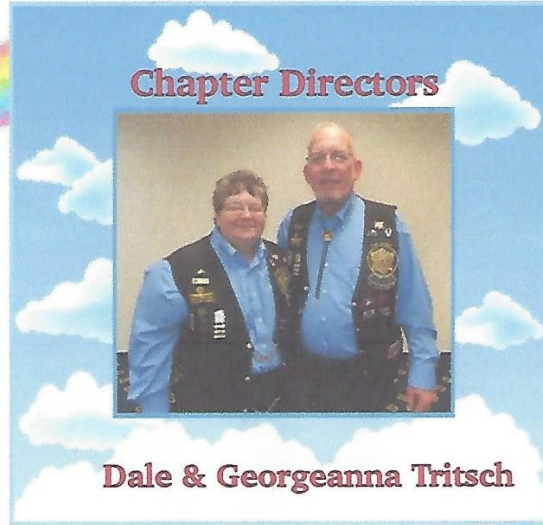

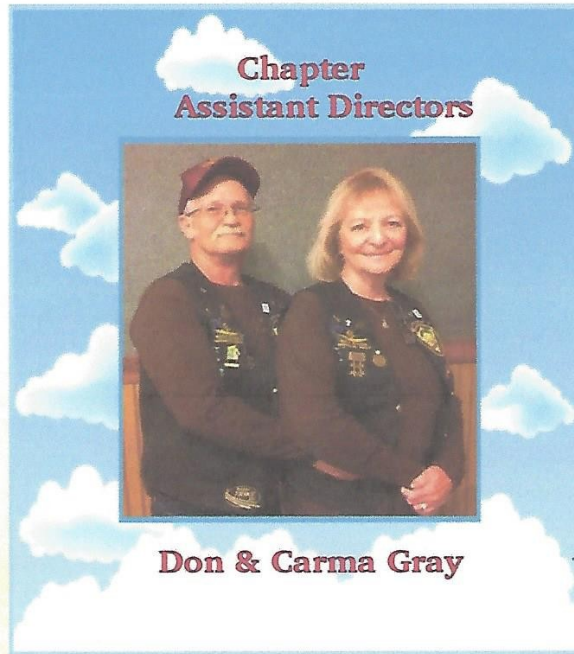
On Saturday, May 13th, six Chapter H members attended the TTRC in Wichita. The weather was nice and everyone had a good time learning new skills and updating old skills.

We had some FUN get together the past few weeks with twelve Chapter members making it to the Harvest Café in Inman where we enjoyed some good food and camaraderie.

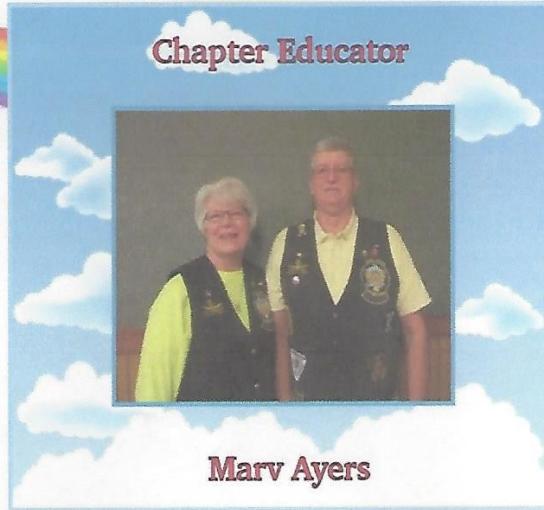

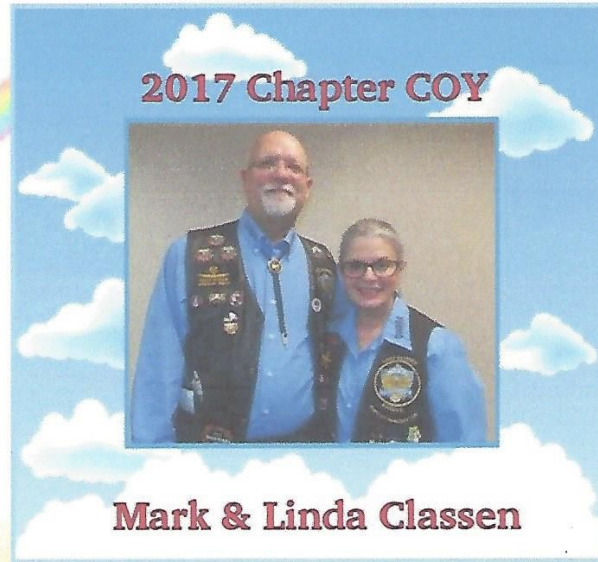
With graduations here, we all have a chance to help our family members pursue the dreams of a lifetime.
