Rider Ed Article for June 2019

Happy Spring everyone! This month you have to put up with the Assistant Educator writing the article not the Educator. Bill is taking a rest this month.

I hope that everyone is getting out and enjoying some nice spring riding between the monsoons we have been having. Whether in your 4 wheeler or you 2 wheels do not attempt to drive thru running water on the roadway. You cannot tell what is or is not below the running water. Rushing water can erode the roadway away in a matter of just a couple of hours or less. Also as little as 2 inches of water on the road can cause your vehicle to float. Do not drive around Road Closed signs they are there for a reason. As the statement goes **"Turn Around, Don't Drown."**

Just a quick note on the remaining Rider Course we have scheduled this year. The course is the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) Basic Rider Course 2 - Updated we have scheduled for June 8, 2019. Because this is a new course for Bill, Bob and I to teach we are required by MSF to recertify the range. This involves multiple photographs, forms and paperwork to be sent to California for review by MSF.

As of this time we have not received the certification back from MSF. Since we are not certified and would not have time to mark the range prior to the date of the course we are going to postpone the course until later in the riding season. The Rider Education team will look at a date in the future to present this course. This will be the first time that we have been able to offer this course to our riders and we are excited to be presenting it. Be patient and we will get the message out to you through Kansas District Facebook page and through your Chapter Directors.

Remember the Kansas District Rally later this month, June 20 thru 22 in Salina, KS. The Rider Ed team will be presenting several seminars at the rally including the Road Captain Course on Saturday June 22. This is a good seminar to take even if you do not want to lead the ride.

Because of the deadline for me to get this out I am going to keep this short this month.

Here is a little information on the Levels program. I will highlight a different level each month. If you have any questions about the Levels program or your status in the program contact Bill Tucker or Rick Stevens. We can check your status or show you how to check your own status. This month we will feature Level 1

Level I: Safety by Commitment

(Safe Rider Program)

Level I of the Rider Education Program is also referred to as Safe Miles. It represents the commitment of the Rider and/or the Co-Rider to practice safe motorcycle operation whenever they operate their motorcycle. Safety is a state of mind which can only be attained through total commitment. Every successful accomplishment begins with a commitment to reach the intended objective. This is true of the Rider Education Program and includes a promise to learn for the sake of Rider, Co-Rider, friends and family, and others on the road. Though there is no mileage requirement to enter Level I, the commitment to safe riding is tracked by the number of accident free miles since joining GWRRA. Accident free miles are accumulated in 5,000 mile increments and may be updated at yearly intervals.

Rider/Co-Rider Requirements:

The requirement for Level I is current membership and the expressed commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding. They are encouraged to display these patches as an outward sign of that commitment

Submit a completed Rider Education Program Levels Application Form (Form N.7), along with optional patch fee to a GWRRA Officer for verification.

Enrollment is free. Patches are available at **\$6.00 FOR EACH PARTICIPANT**. With your purchase you will receive ONE SAFE MILES PATCH, either a RIDER or CO-RIDER ROCKER and a Safe Miles pin if applicable

As you have heard many times in the past and will hear it again in the future as stated by my mentor and teacher Bill Tucker Senior District Educator:

PRACTICE MAKES PERMANENT.

We all then got back on our bikes and rode to Pawnee Oklahoma to Click's Steakhouse for lunch....I really can't remember how we all got back on our bikes after that. We were stuffed!!

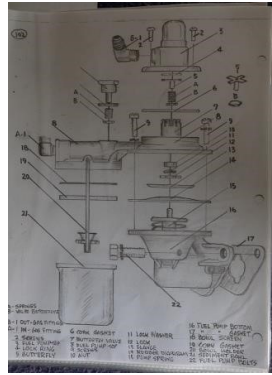

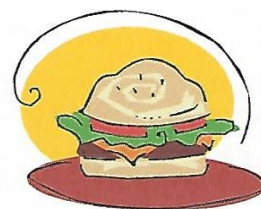

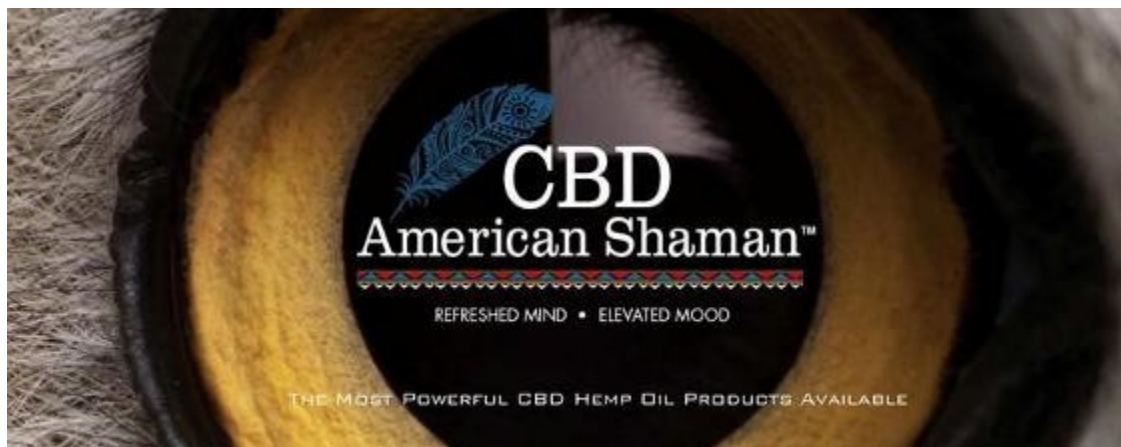
