

### Notes from Your District University Coordinator

Hello Kansas Riders!

Linda and I are getting really anxious to get some real riding weather going this spring. I know that it has been a real bummer of a winter and we haven't had much of a taste of spring yet but don't kid yourselves it is coming and we must be ready for it.

One of the ways that you can be ready for riding season, is to prepare mentally for it and that is exactly what your University Training team is geared up for coming this March 17<sup>th</sup>! Mark it on your calendars and bring a friend. That is what GWRRA is all about Friends, Fun, Safety and Knowledge, and we will get all four at the Kansas Summit. This is a perfect time to reach out to non GWRRA members and to show them what we are all about. All that we ask is that you contact either your chapter director or myself at my email so that we can have a guess of how much food we need to make! Remember that this Saturday is without any cost to you, except if you are planning on attending the MFA course and that we have to charge for at 20.00 a person.

What can you expect at the Kansas Summit? Here is just a short overview of what we will be having at the Summit:

- Morning MFA course. This will cover you on the levels program, but is a must for being safe and prepared for any emergency. It covers CPR, First Aid and emergency defibrillator use.
- Afternoon Trike Classroom course. This will cover you on the levels program. This is the classroom portion of the range Trike course. We are having a range Trike course a couple weeks later in Wichita. You only need the classroom portion every couple years.
- 8:30 Co-Rider. This is also a levels course, but is good for anyone that rides 2 up. Covers the safety and proper riding habits of your 2<sup>nd</sup> rider.
- 8:30 Who's afraid of the Dark. This is a general riding course that is excellent for getting safety tips and proper night riding habits.
- 10:30 Only Sugar Melts in the Rain. Another general riding course that will give instruction to your riding habits in rain and how to properly react to that riding condition.
- 10:30 Road Trippin. This is a Leadership level course on setting goals. That does not mean that only leaders are to attend. We all need to set goals in our lives and make better decisions.
- 12:45 Team Riding. Another levels course that should be attended by everyone. We all need to be aware of the

riders around us and how to properly ride in a group.

- 12:45 Cha Cha Change! This is another Leadership level course that we can all benefit from. Change always comes into one's life and in this course we talk about handling the change.
- 2:30 Brr It's Cold. A riding course about riding in the cold. Practical suggestions and training on how to handle the cold when caught in it and riding in colder weather.
- 2:30 Do you have a Minute. This is also considered a Leadership course but is more suited for everybody in that we will be discussing proper ways to handle and give feedback to your chapter, friends our any other organization.

You can see that we are going to have a big day on the 17<sup>th</sup>! I would love to see every class full so make your plans and we will see you there! Chapter Directors – Please email me any participants that have contacted you so I can get a estimated count of people.

### MOTOR &WARNESS

### Steve and Terri Bockhaus Coordinators



As you may or may not be aware, Steve and I are the Motorist Awareness Coordinators (MAC) for the state of Kansas. Sounds like a fancy title, doesn't it? But, what does it mean? Well, in a nutshell, it means that it is our job to educate the public about motorcycle safety. Sounds pretty simple, huh? Considering that this position is appointed by the national, not state office, by an organization, (GWRRA) whose main mission is to promote safety, you better believe it is an important position that we take very seriously! So, how is this accomplished? Let me share a little insight with you.

Steve attends meetings in Topeka every quarter and participates in many "zoom calls" with GWRRA National Motorist Awareness Program officers. Recently I was able to take off work to go to Topeka with him. These motorist awareness meetings are held at the Kansas Traffic Safety Resource Office on Wanamaker Street. There were representatives from Substance Abuse Prevention Awareness, Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP), Christian Motorcycle Association (CMA), A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactment (ABATE), Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Department of Transportation (DOT), and Legislatures. There is no funding from GWRRA or Kansas tax payers to cover the expenses of these meetings. All the representatives are as passionate about safety on the highways as we are, so are willing to volunteer their time and talents for this mission.

We were shown charts and discussed statistics about crashes. The biggest challenge of course, is how to improve the statistics. How is the best way to spend what little money we have? Have the yard signs and bill boards been effective? Did the radio ads, "Click it or Ticket" reach many people? How about the "Don't drink and drive" campaign? As one can expect in such versatile groups, there was much discussion about more or stricter laws, especially regarding right of way violations. Steve and I have always felt that instead of making more laws that are unenforceable, it would be much more effective to provide education instead. And, let's just say, shyness is not exactly our virtue.

While there is no current information regarding the number of crashes involving motorcycle riders who are motorcycle safety foundation trained vs. untrained, most of us will have to agree that there are more motorcycles on the road, and more M endorsements issued. Education and practice are required to drive a car, truck, bus, etc, but not a motorcycle. How crazy is that!? And, how many that do have an M endorsement were "grandfathered in", but haven't ridden in years? (Or worse yet, can honestly say they've been riding since they were a kid, but never had any formal training, so are doing nothing but reinforcing bad habits.)

This topic led us directly into our next discussion: why don't people take riding classes? Well, there are many reasons, including: time, money, convenience, pride/embarrassment. One possible solution may be interactive online classes, with mandatory range time. I have to say, the other riders at this meeting were shocked to find out how cheap and how much education that GWRRA provides. We have a good thing going here folks, so keep doing all you can to recruit new members! Also, these meetings are open to anyone, so if you are ever interested in attending, contact Steve. He would be happy for the support.

Here are a few other pictures of those that were in attendance.














