



Medic First Aid

As I look out the window, to my surprise, I see SNOW! It has not snowed here in a long time. Even though we enjoy the beauty, there are also hazards that come along with it.

We will not discuss the traffic hazards, but the medical hazards. Most of us will go out in the snow and shovel it off of the sidewalks and driveways. Remember, it is slick out there. It is very easy to fall. Also, the air is COLD! This can cause breathing problems. The cold can also cause frost bite.

Let's discuss each item. A fall can cause embarrassment, bruises, and fractures. A fall can cause you to have a bruised butt. Keep in mind that this bruise and discomfort can also be a sprain or a fracture. If you suspect a fracture, immobilize the area and call 911. If it is just a bruised butt, well endure the embarrassment.

The cold can also cause frost bite. The best treatment is avoidance, but this does not always happen. If you need to treat for frost bite, get the person inside and warm the body. Remove wet clothes to prevent further chilling. Give the person warm liquids to drink. (NO alcohol). Watch for shock and keep them warm.

The cold air is also makes it difficult to breathe. Now for most this is no problem, but to the person with breathing problems to begin with, this can be dangerous. Just bring this person inside to get warm. Have them sit down and relax. Monitor their breathing. If they stop breathing, call 911 and give rescue breathing until help arrives.

The final concern reminds me why I bought a snow blower. Shoveling snow requires a lot of work. We must all admit that we are not as young as we once were. We are not in as good shape as we once were. The work of shoveling snow can bring on a heart attack! Studies show that heart attacks increase in the winter when it snows. If a heart attack occurs, call 911 and initiate CPR. But remember, the person is outside in the cold and snow. We need to protect ourselves from cold injuries and a heart attack. There is NO need for there being 2 people in trouble. Move the victim to a warm, dry area if possible. If not, "do what you gotta do" By the time you read this, we will have trained a new MFA Instructor and he will have taught his first class. We welcome Marvin Ayers from Chapter H to our team. Motorcycle Flags - Etiquette

The United States Flag Only

If only the United States Flag is displayed on your motorcycle, you should either mount it in the center, or, you should mount it on the right side of the motorcycle. This should be based of the rider's perspective when he or she is facing forward. This is also known as the "Marching Right" position.

The United States Flag + 1 (Any other Style)

If you have a United Stated Flag on your motorcycle, with any other flag, it should be mounted to the right side of the motorcycle. This should be based of the rider's perspective when he or she is facing forward. This is also known as the "Marching Right" position. If the other flag is that of another nation, it should be the same size and at the same height of the US Flag - NO flag should ever be displayed higher than

the US Flag.

The United States Flag + More Than One Other Non-National Flag

If you are flying the United States Flag and more than one other non-national flag, (EX: POW/MIA, Patriot Guard, Eagles) it should beat center and mounted higher than any of the other flags. No other flag should be larger than the United States Flag, or fly higher. This should be based of the rider's perspective when he or she is facing forward. This is also known as the "Marching Right" position. The remaining nations should be mounted right to left in alphabetical order. If you are flying multiple flags, they should be mounted from the rider's right-to-left in the following order.

- 1) United States To the riders right
- 2) Nations Alphabetical
- 3) States and Territories In order of admittance
- 4) Military In Order of establishment
- 5) Any other flags


