
see us. The Louisiana Convention is the next weekend in Lafayette, LA and should be a lot of fun also.



That's it from rider ed this month. Jim, Rick and I are looking forward to serving you and hopefully meeting all your training needs in riding and with the seminars.


Please contact your Chapter Educator and let him know what seminars you would like presented at our Kansas Rally in September. He has a list that you can choose from.

Special Interest Groups

When you hear the phrase 'special interest groups' what normally comes to mind are negative thoughts of those political activists who may or may not be looking out for our best interests. Perhaps a group of people with very narrow, self serving interests. However when it comes to GWRRA, Special Interest Groups (or SIGs) are a good thing. We all share the passion for our motorcycles, but that is likely not our only hobby. Knowing that, GWRRA developed SIGs to embrace the diversity of those other interests and to provide the opportunity and organizational support for Members to share and enjoy that common area of interest which may be associated with motorcycling. In other words, more enjoyment or enhancement for your membership buck. Hmm - guess that's why SIGs fall under the Membership Enhancement Program.

So what kind of SIGs are there? The formally acknowledged national SIGs consist of Lady Riders, Camping/RV, Ham Radio and Classic Wings. Its easy to see how each of these fit in with GWRA. After all, we are gaining more lady riders, especially given the trike popularity; quite a few motorcyclists enjoy camping; and the early GL1000, 1100 and 1200 are still great machines but with parts and service getting harder and harder to obtain, those Classic Wing loyalists need to bond together to help each other out. And given our Members' "always ready to help out when needed" mentality, its no surprise we have so many ham radio operators in our ranks.

While those listed above are national in scope, SIGs can be organized within a Region, District or even at the Chapter level. Got a bunch of Members who enjoy the same thing, like bowling, maybe golf, how about classic or custom cars? Start a local group - maybe challenge other Chapters to a competition or have a District wide event. Just remember that a SIG should not take away from the primary focus of motorcycling and that any events planned by the SIG should not interfere other GWRRA activities. However SIGs can be a great way for our Members to bond and share additional common interests.

July 2nd thru 5th - Wing Ding in Madison WI Sept 12th thru 14th - Kansas District convention in Abilene KS



conduct a very professional class.



Did you find your membership number? Better read me again. (your friendly KS-H newsletter)







Thank you, Rick for your dedication to the Twisters. We look forward to an exciting future riding together.




