



Here are some of the things that the National Safety Council recommends. Get enough rest. If possible, try to get someone to ride with you. Avoid long distances at night and during the daytime wear sunglasses to help fight glare and help prevent eye fatigue. Take frequent breaks. Don't overeat...have light meals & snacks. DON'T DRINK ANY ALCOHOL. Last and probably the most important...listen to your co-rider who may well know what's going on better than you. And Co-Rider...you need to watch for the warning signs and tell the rider that YOU need a break.

One more thing about the meeting...our fearless leader Marty has started something that we can all participate in if we so choose. When you go out of town and stay at a motel/hotel if you don't use the little bottles of shampoo, conditioner & bars of soap if you could go ahead and collet them the plan is after a few months or year of doing this taking all that was gathered and donate them to a homeless shelter or someplace like that. 

It seemed like we had a guardian angle on the way back for the weather. It just for the most part kept moving out of the way. I don't think we went thru more than 10 miles of rain and that was near Burlington, KS. The Kansas wind did make it a lot of work keeping the trikes between the proper lines especially when we rode thru the frontal boundary and the wind which was about 30 mph suddenly switched 180 degrees making it a WOW moment that somehow got transmitted over my CB giving John a brief time of concern. The rally was a good one. Chapter C was well represented with us and also Gary and Susan Drake. Kansas District was the most represented by percentage within the region. The district also walked away with our share of prizes with Bill Tucker winning one of the 50/50 drawings and Rick Kistler winning two door prizes. He was actually lucky enough to win the second one before he got back to his seat from winning the first one. Brenda won the quilt that that was raffled off. It was valued at \$250. I won't say how she sounded when her number was called but the sound of a farm animal comes to mind and made me jump a bit.

Ron led a discussion about maintenance day to determine what was needed in the line of food and Ken Felch wanted to know how many were planning on coming in order to have enough hamburgers for everybody. He also wanted to know what kind of maintenance would be taking place in case he needed to make any preparations in his shop. It appears that most of us have our maintenance up to date which is pretty normal for the chapter as we all pretty much take care of our maintenance when it's needed and not wait until we have a failure or a maintenance day.

We (Chapter 'F') have a scheduled ride to Burns Kansas Café May 1. Those interested should meet at the café at 6:30pm.





BY THE BOOK

What If I Don't Go to Your Church?

Within GWRRA there are guidelines and there are policies. While these words are often used interchangeably, they are completely different. A guideline is something that provides help and assistance for use within certain boundaries. A policy implies more structure and less ability to change. We don't have many true policies, but those we do have primarily exist for a reason – to retain Members. For that reason GWRRA has a **policy** on religion that must be adhered to.

The policy states "GWRRA is purposely designed to be free of religious persuasion and ceremony. This is not because the Association is opposed to religion, but religion is, and should be, a personal choice. No Member should be compelled or forced by virtue


of their attendance at a GWRRA function to participate in a religious ceremony that may be in conflict with their own beliefs. If for some reason it is determined that prayer is appropriate, make it a moment of silence so everyone in attendance can offer their thoughts in their own way. If worship services are offered at GWRRA functions, they should be announced in advance and denoted as optional on the event program and staged in a separate location for those who want to attend."

If you were attending a Chapter gathering and forced to participate in a religious ceremony that was in direct conflict with the way you believe, how likely would you be to return? When I was conducting one of the early Officer Certification Program (OCP) classes, I had a Member tell me they were very happy we were stressing adherence to the policy on religion. They had the reputation of always being late to Chapter gatherings. They went on to explain the reason they were habitually late was because the Chapter gathering always began with a prayer. The Member then told me they were Atheists and rather than make a scene, always arrived late enough to be confident the opening prayer was over. No one in the Chapter knew of their belief and the Member didn't want to make it known for fear they would be ostracized or made to feel unwelcome. Its fortunate they felt that strongly toward the Chapter, otherwise they assuredly would have abandoned the Association. We definitely do not want to run anyone off just due to their religious belief. Aside from being the right thing to do, the policy needs to exist, because discriminating against anyone based on their religious belief is against the law.

The more you know, the better it gets!




