

### Synopsis of Sightseeing Trips at 2018 Rally SOURCE: The Kansas Guidebook 2 for explorers

#### Big Brutus - Located in West Mineral Ks.

No other name other than Big Brutus would befit this gigantic and enormous electric coal shovel. It is one of the two largest electric coal shovels in the world still assembled.

Big Brutus in action rumbled along at 22 mph and removed the soil from the ground so smaller shovels could remove the coal from the one scoop. That scoop is so big it would fill three railroad cars. In the museum the is a replica of 'Big Brutus' names 'Little Giant'. It is constructed on a scale of one inch to one foot. 'Little Giant' can be operated to demonstrate how it and its mammoth successor machines called 'draglines' scoop up millions of tons of earth to expose rich coal seams below.

Memorial Day-Labor Day, daily 9am-8pm; Jan-Mar daily 10a-4pm; remaining months daily 9am-5pm.

Located at 306 E Washington, Arma Ks. In 2009 local artist Gary Lofts and his wife, Susan, spearheaded a campaign to paint a large mural on the side of a 1907 downtown building honoring the towns centennial. It's a beauty and depicts the town's history including scenes of a miner, railroad and depot, church, a Model T, and the former school buildog mascot.

#### **Veterans Memorial- Arma**

Arma Mural- Arma

Located at 5th and Washington the memorial was built shortly after WWII. This memorial now honors local veterans who served in all wars. Flags representing four branches of the military fly in front of the memorial. Arma's V-J Day homecoming has been celebrated annually since 1946.

#### St. Aloysius Historic Site- Greenbush Ks

From Summit Street in Girard go 8 miles west on K-47.

The story of this historic site is an amazing one, beginning with a Catholic priest caught in a terrible storm prayed for survival while hiding under his horse's saddle. He promised if he survived he would build a church. He survived and in 1871 he built the church. In 1881 a storm destroyed the church and the parishioners build a stone structure in 1881. It was used until a larger one was built 1907. In 1982 lightening struck St. Aloysius Church and destroyed it. The ruins' are still standing and the parishioners built a pavilion nearby and moved a one-room schoolhouse to the site.

#### Miner's Memorial-Pittsburg

Located a 2nd & Walnut in Pittsburg, a beautifully landscaped area features a larger-than-life bronze statue of miner John Christian Ott and large polished granite monuments inscribed with names of miners who worked in the Weir-Pittsburg coal field fields. Informational kiosks along a sidewalk tell more about the life of a coal miner.

#### **Immigrant Park-Pittsburg**

It is at 106 W 2nd. In the block east of the Miners 'Memorial the handsome brick Pritchett Pavilion graces the site where the old Europe Hotel and Frisco Depot once stood. In the late 1800's and early 1900's. These facilities received new immigrant families who came to work in the coal fields. Plaques on the pavilion are inscribed with stories of these families and the difference they have made in the area. A nearby mural depicts the old hotel and depot.

#### Hotel Stilwell- Pittsburg

It is situated at 707 Broadway. In 1889 in an attempt to make his little mining town appear more metropolitan to attract new capital, financier Arthur Stilwell constructed this grand downtown hotel. The grandeur is evident in the lobby which features a stained-glass dome and medallions around the hanging lights. In its day, the hotel hosted such renowned figures as Susan B. Anthony, Theodore Roosevelt and William Jennings Bryan. Above the outdoor balcony, a carved limestone griffin guards the property. Restored in 1997, the hotel today houses apartments. Lobby-Mon-Fri 9a-5p 620-235-1997

#### Solidarity Mural-Pittsburg

You will find it at 308 N Walnut. Inside the Public Library, Wayne Wildcat's colorful mural illustrates the 1921 Pittsburg event involving 6,000 women marching in protest of mining conditions and in support of striking miners. The New York Times dubbed these courageous women the "Army Amazons" and their march became a turning point in labor history.

#### Pittsburg state University Veterans Memorial Amphitheater

At 1900 S Rouse you'll feel a tug at your emotions as you walk the entryways lined with flags of the 50 states and the official seals of the five military branches. Dedicated in 2004, this memorial amphitheater features a half-sized replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C. The replica was part of the Moving Wall program that brought "The Wall' to those who couldn't travel to the nation's capital. Among other features, the amphitheater contains an eternal flame and reflecting pool.

#### **Crawford County Historical Museum**

A short drive to 651 S. U.S. 69 you will see exhibits that capture the area's history of coal mining, farming printing, and ethnic diversity. Unique artifact include a dress worn by 1967 Miss America Debbie Barns and a 1933 aerial fire truck. Wed-Sat 10am-4pm Sunday 12-4p 620-231-1440

#### Chicken Annie's Original

Ride to 1143 East 600. From 20th street (Pittsburg) 4 miles north on U.S. 69, then 3 1/2 miles east on 600 When Annie's husband, coal miner Charley Pichler, suffered a disabling accident in Yale Mine No. 13 in 1933, she had to find work to support their family. In 1934 Annie started selling fried chicken out of her home, with side dishes of German potato salad, German coleslaw, a strip of green pepper, and a slice of tomato. That was the beginning of this now-famous restaurant. It is owned today by Annie's grand-children, who are still serving delicious fried chicken dinners. Tues-Sat 4-8:30p Sunday 11a-8pm 620 -231-9460

#### Jims Steak House & Lounge

1912 N Broadway for steaks and more. The vintage neon sign out front is a clue that Jims has been around for awhile, and with good reason. This classic streak house is famous throughout the region for steaks, steak tips, and onion rings. One taste and you'll know why Jim's has been in business since 1938. Mon-Sat 4:30p-10p 620-231-5770

#### Chicken Mary's

1133 E 600. From 20th (Pittsburg) 4 miles north on U.S 69 then 3 1/2 miles east on 600. When Joe Zwengast was no longer able to work in the coal mines in the early 1940's his wife, Mary started preparing meals to support the family. They began serving chicken dinners in their home, moved into an old mining camp pool hall in 1945. They have operated in their current location since 1966. The Zwengast family's third generation continues to compete with neighboring Chicken Annie's for the best and most mouthwatering chicken dinners. Tue-Sat 4-8:30p. Sunday 11a-8p 620-231-9510.

#### Pichler's Chicken Annie's

At 1271 S 220. From 4th, 4 1/2 miles south on Broadway/U.S.69 Business. Chicken Mary's granddaughter Donna married Chicken Annie's grandson Anthony and together they created a new dimension to the area's chicken tradition by opening Pichler's Chicken Annie's! You know the food is something special coming from this chicken-cooking combo. Tues-Sat 4-8:30pm 620-232-9260

#### **Typhoon Grill-Pittsburg**

1014 S Broadway. A richly decorated Asian interior is the perfect complement to the delicious and beautifully presented. Thai dishes such as pineapple curry, rice soup, pad Thai, and tamarind chicken Mon-Sat 11a-8:30p




Hello everyone,






