

Bob gave a great lesson on Goldwing maintenance tips which centered on storing the bike for winter. I know that there are some that ride their bike year round but for those of us that prefer to not ride with snow chains on our tires the lesson talks about how you should change your oil before storing it because moisture can accumulate in the tank and become corrosive. Also you should keep your fuel tank ¾ full and to use a fuel stabilizer. Remember with the tank mostly full there is less chance of condensation forming in the tank. As for the battery...remember even if you aren't running the bike the battery is still being used to keep the memory in your radio and CB so you should disconnect the battery or use a battery tender. If you choose this method try to choose a tender that has a microchip that keeps track and only charges when it needs to. Cheap chargers may save you money but they can overcharge the battery and that will defeat the purpose. Last thing...put around 5 extra pounds in the tires and store it on the center stand if possible.

Question...did you know that the Sedgwick County Zoo does a poker run? It's called the Monkey Butt ride and this year it was held on the 15th. Larry and I went on it this year. Didn't win anything but had breakfast then took a ride around a couple of the small towns around here Here's Larry checking out his bike just before we left to begin out ride.

September ended with John & Teresa Gull attending the Oklahoma District rally. They invited us to go along but we decided not to attend even with plenty of badgering from Teresa due to travel plans we had for early October. She was kind enough to provide a short narrative of the rally and it's included below:

John and I attended the Oklahoma District Rally in Muskogee. It was a great rally. There were 19 vendors and good attendance. John had a good vendor poker hand on Saturday consisting of four Kings. He got beat out by someone with four Aces. I made a guess on a jar of matchbooks with a prize to go with it. I happened to be sitting by the prize table when a young gentleman won a candle holder and he didn't want it so he gave it to me. We ate lunch on Friday at an Amish restaurant and had fried pie for dessert. Was it ever heavenly? On Saturday, we had lunch at a BBQ restaurant. It was also very good. The rally was held at the Civic Center and they will have it there again next year. It was a very nice place for the rally. The weather was perfect for the ride down and back so that was really nice not to have to worry about bad weather. We had a great time visiting with friends we had not seen for a while. We also had fun touring the city and doing a little bit of shopping since we had never been there before.

Our supper "ride" was on the 4th to Marilynn's in Osage City with 14 in attendance. Brenda and I were the only ones that showed up on less than 4 wheels and with 20/20 hindsight we should have been on 4 also. We had a nice trip to Osage City with no wind ideal temperature and not much traffic. While we were enjoying our food and watching the weather guy pointing out more information than anybody wanted to see about a line of weather west of

us (it didn't even show up as a drizzle prior to leaving Manhattan) a lot of interesting conversations were going on more or less at the same time. Afterthoughts

It has been stated that there is safety in numbers. That is true if all the numbers are thinking the same way. That goes especially for group rides. If not everyone has good communication, think CB radio on the same channel or good helmet speakers or the mic turned the right way or even having the CB tuned for the best possible send / receive. Good communication is the lead rider calling out stops, turns, road hazards, etc and the tail gunner repeating the call so the lead rider knows he was heard and understood and so those in the group have a double chance of hearing the calls.

Good group riding practice is a must to remain safe on a ride. We can look at the scenery and the things that attract our attention for a moment, but we must always stay together and be alert to the ride. Two or more small groups are far better than one large group. That way we can stay together and eliminate the chance of others on the road cutting in and separating our group. When passing, we should do it as quickly as possible and leave room for the last riders to also get around. Be sure everyone gets around safe and that no one is left "hanging out" in the passing lane. Also be sure that all are ahead of what is being passed so there are no rear end crashes.

When organizing a group, the various rider preferences should be taken into account. Those who like faster speeds and whipping through the curves should be placed at the front. Those who prefer slower speeds and like to take it easy should be placed at the rear. This is just common sense and that way everyone can enjoy the ride and ride the way they feel most comfortable.

Everyone should have taken the riding course and Road Captain course. Even though we think we are good riders and have been riding for years, or if we have taken car, truck, bus, etc. driving courses, they are not the same as the courses given for riding motorcycles or trikes. The Road Captain course is especially useful in group riding, even if you never intend on leading or being tail gunner. Having taken the course, you know what and why the leader and tail gunner are responsible for – your safety. They direct you and keep the group together. If one lags then all behind lag and that causes a lot of unsafe circumstances and even missed turns or stops. We all should keep up our skills and learn to be safe and courteous to the others riding with us.

GWRRA has the best trainers available and the cost is not even comparable to other courses offered by any other safety training. If you think you are good now, take a course and see how good you can really be.



Standards of Conduct

Officers of GWRRA are held to a higher standard. The Officer's Handbook outlines Standards of Conduct for all Officers. They are expected to set the example and be role models for the Members to follow. They promote high standards for association service and personal conduct. They instill Member confidence in the integrity and fairness of all Officers. Following are the Standards of Conduct taken from the Officer Handbook.

MAINTAIN loyalty to the Association and aggressively help it to achieve its objectives and goals.

HOLD inviolate the confidential relationship between the individual Members of our

Association, and all confidential information entrusted to me through my office.

SERVE all Members of our Association impartially, and provide no special privilege to

any individual Member, nor accept any special personal compensation for the

performance of my duties.

NEITHER engage in, nor countenance, any exploitation of our Association, and

safeguard and protect all its Marks.

RECOGNIZE and properly and fairly perform my responsibilities to our Association,

uphold all rules and policies relating to its activities, with skill, courtesy, honor, good will

and especially to uphold exemplary service to the Membership.

EXERCISE and utilize sound "people principles" in the conduct of the affairs of my office.

USE only fair, moral and ethical means when seeking to influence opinion.

ALLOW no false or misleading statements to be made to the public or Membership.

NOT disseminate any malicious information concerning this or any organization.

ACCEPT responsibility for cooperating in every reasonable way with all Association

Officers and Members.

USE every opportunity to improve public understanding of the positive principles of

motorcycling, especially GWRRA.

MAINTAIN high standards of personal conduct, and make efforts to improve my

management skills, my character, and my communication techniques.

But what about the Members – do they have a standard of conduct? Members have no standard of conduct except that which is acceptable by society, and lawful. Members have the right to express their opinions and are free to disagree with any decision so long as it is done in a manner which is non-threatening and non-violent.

The Officer's Handbook spells out procedures for handling both Officers and Members who violate these standards. We will get in to those later down the road.


