

A great October for riding this year. As we look forward to riding in November and beyond, the weather makers will throw a few things at us that we usually do not see much if any during the summer.

I'm talking about the falling leaves for starters. Please remember as you ride the highways and by-ways that those pesky leaves can hide potholes and other debris that could potentially cause you some problems. Even sand may be under them just waiting for our arrival. What about animal carcass or large rocks, or a metal cover on the surface! And we should remember the frost in the morning that causes the leaves to be slippery.

What about us, the rider and co-rider. Bundle up in layers if there is a question on how cold it will be early morning. Check those electric gloves, vests, pants and whatever else you need to keep warm. But be careful not to put on too many clothes at might affect your ability to operate the motorcycle safely.

Be aware of our own body temperature. If we start tensing up from the cold, it could affect our reactions because of tightness of the muscles. Be alert of our surroundings prepare to react accordingly.

Chapter 'B' is sponsoring a Medic First Class November 21 in Lawrence. . There was some discussion of possibly having an additional seminar if the MFA class is for renewals only.

I received a lot of favorable comments on the 'On Bike Games' Rider Ed sponsored during the Kansas Rally. We are looking forward to providing more exciting games at the 2016 rally to be held in Hutchinson Kansas.

I mentioned above Medic First Aid. Wait until you see and get to work with our 'new' manikins. They almost talk to you. They tell you when you are not pushing hard enough and if you are going too slowly. They are really fun to use. AND we have three Automated External Defibrillation machines 'AED' that are programmed with situations that you solve with the AED. Just another fun training aid.

Your Rider Education Team has released the 2016 Rider Course schedule. As always, it is subject to change.





The Ozarks Heritage Preserve in Hollister, MO was a sight to behold. Lunch was enjoyed at Arnie's Barn, a 150 year old wooden barn that was brought from Arnold Palmer's hometown in Latrobe, PA and reconstructed at Top of the Rock by a local Amish family. The group then traveled two and one half miles in electric carts along the Lost Canyon Nature Trails. The highlight of the travel was a four-story cave with a cascading waterfall. Additional waterfalls, natural rock formations, and covered bridges were seen along the route. The final destination of the day was Harrison, AR where dinner was enjoyed at Neighbor's Mill, Bakery, and Café.



A beautiful ride through Eureka Springs, and the back roads to Rogers, AR began the second day. After checking out the vendors at Pigtail Harley Davidson, it was on to Fayetteville and Baum Stadium. The Kansas Barn Alliance is a not-for-profit organization formed to discover, memorialize and preserve the history of rural Kansas. Then it was on to Burlington to view one of the 2,200 Carnegie Free Libraries that Mr. Carnegie built in small towns throughout the United States in the 1920's. Gene and Barbara Merry now own the building and have repurposed it to display beautiful artwork depicting rural Kansas. Gene and Barbara joined the group for lunch to share additional information about their town and make new friends.

An old Round Barn just east of Burlington was the final stop. This barn has a cypress wood silo inside it and an open lower level so the livestock could enter to be fed during cold winter days. The Wolf Creek Nuclear Power Plant could be seen in the distance as the group headed home. A great example of the blending of the old and the new. It was a fun time of sharing and learning.

Rick and Brenda Kistler are in charge of providing dessert for our regular meeting night on October 27th. We are sure it will be delicious as always.


Jack and Doris Schoeck are in charge of the dinner ride in Novem-



Afterthoughts

Potholes

To automobiles, they're an annoying fact of life, something that in the extreme, can actually cause damage to wheels or suspension. To motorcycle riders, they can be lethal.

An inattentive motorcycle rider hitting a large pothole can be launched from his ride before he even realizes what's happened. When a car's wheel falls into a pothole, there are still three more on the ground helping the car track straight through the hole. On the other hand, the first wheel on a motorcycle that hits a pothole is also the only wheel responsible for steering the vehicle - and a sudden, uncontrollable swerve caused by the pothole's effect on this wheel can cause the bike to slam to the ground, or veer into oncoming traffic or a ditch. And with the brutal winter that the majority of the northern states and Canada have just been through, the roads are in severe disrepair.

Potholes are formed when water seeps into the road through small cracks in the asphalt or concrete. The water then freezes, and expands with tremendous force. This force breaks up the asphalt or concrete. The next day, the water melts, and seeps down even deeper. That night it freezes again...this freeze/thaw cycle is horrendously destructive to roads, and is why our road crews spend their summers spraying "tar snakes" all over the roads, in an attempt to keep the water out of the cracks.

Some know a road that is in such bad condition that not even the cars will drive on it.

Sand On The Roads

All winter long, trucks spread sand and salt on our roads to assist in traction and keep our cars from sliding into one another.

This sand sits around in spring until it is washed away by heavy rains, or swept and vacuumed up by street cleaning machinery. Until then, this hazardous substance lays on the road, waiting to bite careless motorcyclists.

When you hit this leftover sand with your bike, you can slide just like on ice. And if you happen to be in a turn at the time you hit the sand (which is normally the case, being that the sand tends to collect on the inside of corners), you can be on the ground so fast you don't know what hit you.

Quite a few people over the years have told stories about their unfortunate encounters with sand - like a wise pilot once said, learn from the mistakes of others; you won't live long enough to make them all yourself.



BY THE BOOK

Do I Have to Own a Goldwing?

Have you met someone who would be a good fit with your GWRRR Chapter? But they don't ride a Goldwing. Encourage them to join. Did a GWRRR member sell their Goldwing and either quit riding or purchase another brand of motorcycle? Encourage them to stick around. Most of us know there are two categories of GWRRR membership, Full Members and Associate Members. To be a Full Member one must own a Goldwing or Valkyrie motorcycle. Associate Members are those who either own another brand of motorcycle, or maybe no motorcycle at all, but are still interested in being a part of GWRRR because of all we have to offer. It was recently announced that Associate Members no longer pay any more than a Full Member to enjoy all of the benefits of GWRRR membership.

So, other than not having a Goldwing, are there other differences between being a Full and Associate Member? The short answer is 'not really'. They can participate equally in any and all activities at all levels with only 2 exceptions - and one of those can be overridden in extreme circumstances. Associate Members are not eligible to become Directors or Assistant Directors (at any

level) and they may not participate in the Couple of the Year selection process above the Chapter level. Yes, Associate Members may be honored as your Chapter Couple of the Year - they just cannot participate in the District selection process. Yes, an Associate Member can hold team positions, even the officer positions such as Trainer, Educator, Membership Enhancement Coordinator or Treasurer. The exception I mentioned that might be overridden; in the rare instance of a Chapter facing closure due to no Full Member assuming the Directorship, a qualified Associate Member desiring the position can be considered as an alternative to closing the Chapter.

So don't be a Goldwing 'snob'. Embrace Associate Members and encourage others to join and participate as an Associate Member. Who knows, they may realize owning a Goldwing really IS for them! Its a great way to grow your Chapter.
