

Well, it is raining, so am spending some time writing my monthly article for the Winger. Just what Mulvane needs, more rain. Not a lot to pass on as we had to cancel our last 2016 riding course because of insufficient enrollment.

Looking at the schedule from several chapters, there are some super opportunities to go on some rides. Hopefully that will happen.

My trike needed a new front tire so after reading an article in Wing World about the Avon tire made for trikes I decided to purchase one. It is AV71 130/70R-18. I had it mounted by Action Jackson Auto Service in Udall. The owners, Jack & Teresa Kistler are GWRRA members so why not send business their way.

Haven't made a long trip on it yet. Was going to ride to Oklahoma Rally, but that fell to the way side. Really disappointing.

CONGRATULATIONS TO Don & Jan Schroeder and Jeff & Ann Whithorn for receiving their appointment to Level IV. The four of them are from KSH, Hutchinson Chapter.

BE THE COMMANDER

This is the title of my safety discussion with you. What I am referring to is that we, as riders, need to know how to 'control the situation' we face every time we throw a leg over the saddle of our favorite ride. Another words, we must be proactive about recognizing and controlling a situation when it is about to happen.

How do we <u>learn</u> to "Control the situation"? One option is to enroll in a riding course particularly at the early time of riding season. For us Kansans, that is around March. Of course some never stop riding if weather permitting. Take the course every year then, option two, practice what you learned. I tell my students and anyone that will listen to me that: <u>'Practice Makes Permanent! You are what you Practice!</u> Think about it. If you practice bad habits that is exactly what you will do in an emergency situation. If you developed good habits (techniques) they just might save your life or prevent an accident all together. Getting with a Rider Coach will help. GWRRA has excellent riding courses as does the Motorcycle Safety Foundation. Find one and enroll. You will be glad you did. Back to being a Commander.

Let's talk about what probably is the most common situation you have faced or will face while riding. The dreaded left turner. For discussion, you notice (because you were scanning) that the oncoming vehicle is slowing and in the left turn lane. How do you prepare for him possibly turning in front of you? Cover your controls (Brakes & clutch)? How about slowing down? Speeding up? If you slow down and he/she sees you they might hurry up and make the turn before you are in peril. Speeding up might get you past the car making the turn. Be careful on that speeding up idea. In Kansas the traffic laws do not allow you to speed up (be above the speed limit) just to pass or clear an intersection. Ticket Time! Do not exceed the speed limit to get around the person going the speed limit. Besides, there may be a second threat in the area such as a pedestrian running across in front of you or a bicyclist crossing over etc.. Covering the controls is certainly a must. You reduce your reaction time to 'react' by squeezing (not grabbing) the front brake and applying the rear brake. Always use both brakes! The rider with his feet on the highway pegs in town is asking to become a statistic.

Have you ever asked yourself or co-rider "why didn't that jerk see us?" We talk a lot about this in the classes I teach. Here are some of the reasons the students give. 1) the car driver is not looking for motorcycles, only cars. 2) The car driver looked pass us looking at the vehicles behind us. 3) Don't see us because we are smaller than a car. 4) Maybe we cannot be seen because of the background behind us. The time of day may be a factor with the glare of the sun. 5) Maybe the position we ride in has something to do with it? 6) Drivers view was blocked by larger vehicle.

And let us not forget the distractions they have within the car now days. Cell Phones (talking and texting), video players, putting on make up men shaving, combing hair, eating and drinking. The list goes on and on. Quick experience. I was driving to Derby KS from Mulvane taking my dog "Tucker' to play time Inn when I observed the car in front of me (four lanes) was speeding up, slowing down, speeding up, weaving etc... When got where I could see what she was doing it was apparent. She had her cell phone taped on the steering wheel and her fingers were going ninety to nothing. So folks sometimes no matter what we do to make ourselves more visible to car drivers, it may not matter. That's the sad part.

Most everything mentioned above applies to many situations with cars pulling out in front of you. From driveways, side streets etc.. Be ready

Running out of space so might continue this next month. We will probably talk about how we can be more visible. I'm sure you know what to do but do you do it? Hope so. I might even share some stuff I witness during my 34 year career in law enforcement.

Enjoy what is left of a riding season. A lot of fall foliage rides are in the works! And Remember!



Again - Mark on your calendar for October 14th as that will be Chapter P's monthly get together. Derby Church of Christ, 225 N Derby St, in Derby.





Statement of Purpose or Why Are We Here?

Every organization or business should have a mission statement as well as a statement of purpose. While being similar, they are different. A mission statement should answer the question 'what do we do and who do we do it for?'. The statement of purpose answers the question 'why do we do what we do?'. The statement of purpose contained in the Officer Handbook includes pieces of the mission and sums it up very succinctly to answer the questions of 'what do we do and for whom' as well as 'why we do it'.

"GWRRA is an informal educational, social organization of proud, unique and special people – Gold Wing Owners. It was formed for people to exchange ideas, share safety information relating to motorcycling and motorcyclists, educate the non-motorcycling public concerning motorcycling problems and participate in impromptu rides. In addition, it supports the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) and assists all motorcyclists in achieving and/or improving public acceptance of motorcyclists. GWRRA is a family-oriented organization, without political or religious affiliations or influence and supports civic, local, police, charity, and government organizations. GWRRA publishes and distributes *Wing World* and other media that will inform, educate, entertain and enlighten our Members and Officers".


