

But before we get into the 2018 schedule, I have a 'SPECIAL TRAINING' announcement that is coming in 2017, in fact this month of October.

I sent an email to the CD's, CE's and District Team announcing that we will have a ROAD CAPTAIN COURSE' of instruction OCTOBER 22, 2017. Since that announcement, we have confirmed that it will be in the Old Depot in El Dorado, KS. Phyllis VanBuskirk has secured it for us. Thanks Phyllis.

It is important that every member know that there is a lot of valuable and usable information in this class that will help you be a better group rider than you already are. If you do not care to be a group leader or tail gunner (Drag) for a group, take it anyway. You are not under any obligation to be a Road Captain, but you should obligate yourself to gain this knowledge. IT'S FREE.

We hope you will choose to join us in one or more riding courses. I like to refer these courses as 'refresher, lets sharpen our skills' opportunities. All training is in Wichita.

March 17: 'Kansas Summit & Retreat Event. This is a non-riding activity that will be a one day of Rider Education Seminars and University Modules to inform and educate. It also will be valuable to the folks that are in the Level's program. Great opportunity to renew your commitment to safe riding. FREE

April 7: TRC-R. This is a Trike Course without the classroom session. \$25.00

April 22: BRC2. This is a two wheel advanced MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) session. \$25.00

May 5: TC & TTRC. This is the Trailering session for two wheels and Trikes. \$25.00

Once again, this is NOT just for those of us that participate in the Rider Education Levels program. Let your Chapter Educator know you have an interest in this life saving training. If enough enroll in your area we will come to you. \$25.00 maybe less.

By now, you know that GWRRR has put in place a 'NEW' GWRRR. They call it 'Restructuring'. The changes will officially take place January 1, 2018. Keep an open mind and PLEASE do not pre-judge the new program. I attended three forums at Wing Ding that was lead by our GWRRR President Anita Alkire. I'm excited to see how it all plays out. The re-structure will certainly affect the Rider Education program and my team is ready.

I'm looking forward to seeing all these changes in writing in our manual guidelines. A lot of positive changes are upon us.

Oct 6th, 7th, & 8th – District Campout @ Council Grove Lake.



Just a reminder about what the Talimena Scenic Drive is all about?

Talimena Scenic Drive is a National Scenic Byway in southeastern Oklahoma and extreme western Arkansas spanning a 54.0-mile (86.9 km) stretch of Oklahoma State Highway 1 (SH-1) and Arkansas Highway 88 (AR 88) from Talihina, Oklahoma, to Mena, Arkansas. Designated a National Scenic Byway by the America's Byway Program in 2005, the road travels within the Ouachita National Forest along the highest peaks of the Winding Stair Mountains, part of the Ouachita Mountain chain, including the second tallest peak in Arkansas, Rich Mountain, 2,681 feet (817 m) in elevation.

Many of the forests along these ridges, stunted and of little commercial value, were never logged and are old growth. The two-lane road features hiking trails beginning at various points along its stretch and 22 scenic vista pull-outs. There are at least 13% hill grades along the route. (I got this info from Wikipedia...I do love to “copy & paste”)
