I hope this finds all of you enjoying somewhat cooler weather. There are still many good riding days left. If you have the chance, get out and enjoy these beautiful motorcycles that we have.

I know it is a bit late but if you attended Wing Ding in Nashville I hope you were able to survive the heat and traffic. We had a great ride out and back to Nashville with fellow Twisters. We rode out through southern Missouri on Highway 60. We were in drizzly weather until Springfield, MO. We were in rain so heavy that we were down to about 10 mph and nowhere to get off the Interstate. We finally found a service and had 5 bikes parked between 2 gas pumps with 6 people looking at their phones trying to find a way through the rain storms. We went south through *The Land Between the Lakes Recreational Area* in northwest Kentucky. This was a beautiful twisting hilly road without much traffic and an enjoyable ride.

Navigating Nashville roads and traffic was an adventure in itself. I have never seen a 5 lane interstate parking lot before but they seem to have them there. It was either stop and go traffic or 70 mph race track. It makes me thankful for the traffic we have in this area. One of our riders made the comment that where he was from 3 cars backed up at a stop sign was a traffic jam.

We participated in the Law Tigers bike night in a parking lot for Nissan Stadium where the Tennessee Titans play. There was the light show, bike show and the drill teams all participating that evening. There were 3 drill teams in attendance, Central Florida Drill Team, Canadian Northern Lights Team and our own Kansas Twisters. We started the evening off with our usual Flag Salute but added all the bikes from all three teams riding in tandem around the range. It

Some valuable lessons were learned that evening. The primary one was that if you think it is difficult to just ride your motorcycle in the dark, try doing it with 8 other bikes in close proximity doing precision moves. We were able to pull the performance off without any incidents or injuries. We all agreed that we certainly don't want to perform under those conditions again. Future performances will be in the day light.

As stated in previous newsletters we will be having the Training Summit again this year on Saturday November 9th. We have a location here in northeast Wichita thanks to Brenda Kistler. We will be at Greenwich Elementary on North Greenwich Road in Wichita. More details will follow as soon as we have them finalized.

I will finish up this article with the last installment in the series on Levels program. This month covers Level IV Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider. As always if you have any questions about anything with the Levels program or the Rider Education programs feel free to contact me.

Level IV: Safety By Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

(Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider)

Level IV is the most prestigious level within the Rider Education Levels Program and is referred to as Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider. It represents the highest level of commitment by the Rider and/or Co-Rider toward safe riding and preparedness. This commitment is shown by a demonstrated history of safe miles, continuing education and current certification in **both** First Aid **and** CPR. These Master Tour Riders/Co-Riders are the finest example to every one of the highest level of commitment to safe motorcycle operation and preparedness. Level IV of the Rider Education Levels Program, the Master Tour Rider, was designed for those special caring individuals who desire to "be all they can be" with regards to motorcycle safety. The requirements are more stringent than Level III and require a greater commitment.

These individuals are caring, trained and prepared with the experience to back them up. It is realized Level IV is not for everyone, but for those who desire to be of greater service to their fellow man, it is the correct prescription.

Rider Requirements:

Be a current GWRRA member.

Be a participant in Level III of Rider Education Levels Program and have been current in Level III for at least one full year.

Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.

Be current in both First Aid **and** CPR and/or MEDIC FIRST AID certifications.

Co-Rider Requirements:

Be current GWRRA member.

Be a participant in Level III of Rider Education Levels Program and have been current in Level III for at least one full year.

Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.

Be current in both First Aid **and** CPR certifications.

Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.

Submit a completed Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider Application Form (Form N.9) with written recommendation from the Chapter Director or other validating GWRRA Officer along with the appropriate fee to the Regional Educator.

Cost: **\$35.00 for each participant** (8.00 additional cost for Black and Gold patch) Receive: "Special Triangular" patch with dark blue border and your individual Master number embroidered on it.

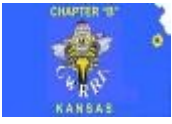

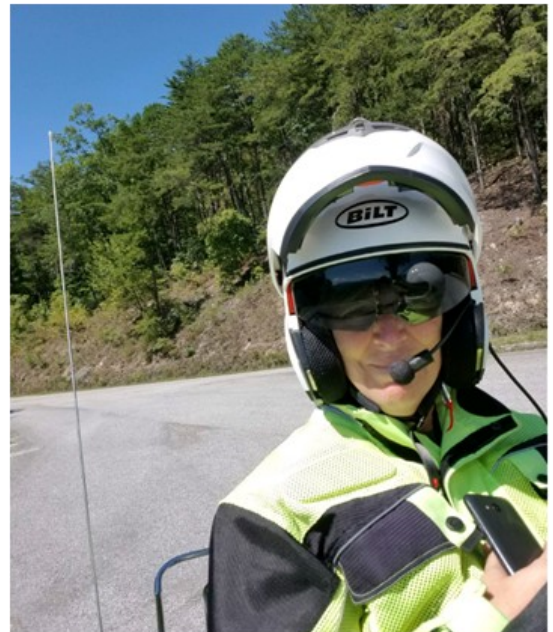

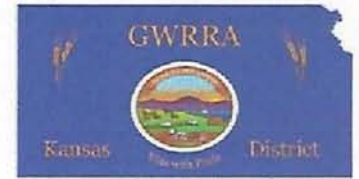
