Shucks Missed Wing Ding. Had no choice because of three doctor appointments Wing Ding week. Pulled my middle hamstring muscle on left leg and began therapy. Had my Diabetic appointment, had my cardiologist with a echogram test, and last had a CT scan on my neck and will see a doctor in November for that. (Read on about that). And to top all that Sheila is recovering from surgery which a complications was an issue.

Right now I'm unable to ride(by choice) because I cannot wear a helmet. Wearing one puts pressure on a neck vertebrae that pinches a nerve sending pain down my left arm. I do NOT ride without my helmet. As I said "by choice". Enough of this negative stuff.

I was thinking about all of you that were lucky enough to ride your motorcycles to Wing Ding or on a Chapter ride in the heat. So here is a refresher for you because the heat is not going way just yet. It's been in the 90's most of this week with more to come.

Exposing your skin to the sun and wind increases your probability of getting dehydrated. Using your own sweat to cool off by covering our body is a very good way to survive. We see people in 'T' shirts and even some in shorts. They say "I'm keeping cool because nothing is blocking the wind." The less protective gear you have on, the faster the ele-

ments drain your fluids. With direct sun & hot wind on your skin, you are begging to dehydrate. And don't forget mesh jackets aren't much help either. I know that from experience. I have a yellow mesh and after some negative experience with dehydration I don't wear it any more. Good crash protection but not so good with preventing dehydration. I bought a jacket that has air vents that open & close. Works really well.

Some symptoms to look for beginning dehydration are: thirsty, hot, tire, nauseated and lightheaded are clues to developing dehydration. And if you aren't urinating very much you need to get liquids down immediately.


We must remember to keep ourselves hydrated. How? Water & a sport drinks with electrolytes and minerals. I have to be careful with what sport drink I drink because of the sugar content. I found Propel is a good one for me. I believe there is a G2 drink that I can drink. I drink mostly water, its cheap and easily available. Stay away from Iced tea and other drinks that have caffeine in them. Water, sport drink and rest will help you recover, obviously do all this out of the heat.

That's a thumbnail to deal with "dehydration". Enroll in a Medic First Aid class and learn more. Be safe.






