

A WORD FROM YOUR DISTRICT RIDER EDUCATORS

It is almost time for the Kansas District Rally in Independence, KS September 10th and 11th. The Rider Ed team will be presenting 2 seminars to help make you safer. We will be presenting a revised version of Mountains, Hills and Curves and also Crash Scene Response. Both of these classes will give you some good information. Please take advantage of them while you are there.

The team also met a couple of weeks ago and we have a schedule for some range courses for both later this year and early 2022. We are planning to present the Advanced Rider Course for October. This class is for 2 wheeled motorcycle riders and co-riders. This is a new version of the course that has not been presented in Kansas and was first presented in July at Wing Ding. This is NOT like any other 2 wheeled courses we have presented. Here is the information on the course:

When: October 10, 2021.

Where: start at Don & Jan's Schroeder, 708 Charles, Hesston.

7:30 registration, 8:00 class starts.

11:30-12:00 lunch will be served.

12:00-about 4:30 range practice at the Hesston High School parking lot - 200 N Ridge Rd. Hesston, KS

Water and snacks provided.

Cost: \$25 for the Rider and no cost for the Co-Rider

IT'S SCHOOL TIME!

Yes, school is back in session and that means school zones, speed, and kids who forget to look. Let's put safety first here.

We have all heard it said, "The biggest worries in school zones are caused by the smallest people." Children see traffic from their own little world. A child develops a sense of danger around nine or ten years of age. Unlike adults, it is difficult for small children to recognize a hazardous situation. A child may think that if one automobile stops, all traffic will stop.

Teenage drivers and parents pose additional hazards for drivers in school zones. Teenage drivers take risks and may speed through school zones or suddenly cut in front of you. Parents transporting a carload of noisy children may fail to use his or her turn signals, stop suddenly, or abruptly change lanes.

We all have difficulty seeing young children and must always anticipate the presence of children when riding in and around a school zone, residential area, strip mall, shopping center, playground, and on highways with bicycle lanes. When riding in these areas, riders must reduce the speed of their vehicle to below the posted limit and plan for unexpected movements of young children and teenagers. Remember, these young people are easily distracted by activities or actions of others around them.

When young people are walking near the roadway, riders should sound the horn to get their attention, reduce speed, and be prepared to break.

Every year, young people are killed by motorists who fail to stop while children are boarding or exiting a stopped school bus. When following a school bus, ALL drivers should maintain the proper speed and increase their following distance, in case the school bus driver stops suddenly to pick up a young student who may be late.

Children are our future; be on the look- out and protect them.

Rhonda Brooksher - September 18th Chuck McClung - September 18th Margo Roberts - September 18th







Why: Make riding safer and more fun by building, refreshing, or learning new rider skills. Maintain or upgrade your Levels program.

We do not expect a 2-wheel course to be offered in the spring of 2022. Only if this course cancels (eg: weather) will we offer a spring course. The Level's program has extended a grace period until June 30, 2022, but don't count on another extension if a spring course is not offered.


