Our own District Convention is coming up this month in Abilene, KS on September 13-14. We


are excited about it and are looking forward to seeing you there. We have a lot of fun things planned to do so there should be something for everyone to do.





## Statement of Purpose or Why Are We Here?

Every organization or business should have a mission statement as well as a statement of purpose. While being similar, they are different. A mission statement should answer the question 'what do we do and who do we do it for?'. The statement of purpose answers the question 'why do we do what we do?'. The statement of purpose contained in the Officer Handbook includes pieces of the mission and sums it up very succinctly to answer the questions of 'what do we do and for whom' as well as 'why we do it'.

“GWRRA is an informal educational, social organization of proud, unique and special people – Gold Wing Owners. It was formed for people to exchange ideas, share safety information relating to motorcycling and motorcyclists, educate the non-motorcycling public concerning motorcycling problems and participate in impromptu rides. 

CHAPTER "B"



The past month has been a busy one for Chapter B as we have traveled far and wide. Mary Rose Enderle and Bogie Bogenrife led the group on an extended breakfast ride the end of July. We headed to Leavenworth via the scenic route on a beautiful Saturday morning. There was a great turnout and before the day was over there were 32 members enjoying the day together. Breakfast was at the Pullman Family Restaurant in Leavenworth where excellent food, good service, and railroad memorabilia were enjoyed.

After breakfast, we walked down the street to the C. W. Parker Carousel

Museum. We had great fun as we rode on a 1913 Carousel compliments of Mary Rose and Bogie. It made us feel like kids again. Many of us stayed and toured the museum and learned about the early history of Leavenworth.



It was a fun time on a Peach Run also led by Mary Rose and Bogie as the group traveled along the historic Santa Fe Trail from Lexington, MO through Dover and on to Waverly. The first stop was at the Lexington Courthouse to see the cannon ball that is still lodged in one of the columns.



The Battle of Lexington State Historical Site was the next stop where we were surprised to discover that even though the Union soldiers were entrenched and held the high ground, the Confederates won that battle by hiding behind bales of hemp and rolling them up the hill.

In Dover, we enjoyed pork chops smoked by the American Legion, an antique tractor show, crafts, wine tasting, quilt show, homemade ice cream and a parade. It was then on to Waverly and Schreiman Orchards where we enjoyed free samples of sweet, juicy peaches and then purchased some. On the way home we stopped at the Missouri Confederate

Home near Higginsville. This was a home for Confederate soldiers after the Civil War and became a cemetery. It was the end to a perfect day with dinner at Jalapeños in Stanley, KS.

Six brave souls headed north to South Dakota and Sturgis. Going the week prior to the actual Sturgis Rally gave the guys the chance to experience the rally without the thousands of people who take over the town. Bison were plentiful and "up close and personal" as they made their way through Custer State Park. Devil's Tower in Wyoming, the Black Hills, and a special tour of Crazy Horse were enjoyed by all.



The 2013 "It's A Wild Ride" Parade in Gardner, KS was a chance for us to promote GWRRA and our chapter. We met for breakfast at Tumbleweeds and then proceeded to the parade staging area. We managed to get near the beginning of the parade, and our group was led by bikes sporting the United States and GWRRA flags. All the bikes were decked out in their finest and we received many waves and cheers as we rode the approximately two mile parade route.



It was time once again during August for the annual breakfast and blackberries ride. ### Homemade mosquito trap

#### Items needed:

- 1 cup of water
- 1/4 cup of brown sugar
- 1 gram of yeast
- 1 2-liter bottle

#### HOW:

1. Cut the plastic bottle in half.
2. Mix brown sugar with hot water. Let cool. When cold, pour in the bottom half of the bottle.
3. Add the yeast. No need to mix. It creates carbon dioxide, which attracts mosquitoes.
4. Place the funnel part, upside down, into the other half of the bottle, taping them together if desired.
5. Wrap the bottle with something black, leaving the top uncovered, and place it outside in an area away from your normal gathering area. (Mosquitoes are also drawn to the color black.)

Change the solution every 2 weeks for continuous control.

\*it may take a day or two to work and may not work at all in some areas




## RIDES LAST MONTH:




