I will end with ----


It is NOT goodbye, It is NOT so long, It is NOT farewell.



Events of the past month are still evolving. We recently received information about another possible start-up organization. Currently proposed are the 'Eagle Wings Motorcycle Association' and the newest is 'Wing'd Rider'. Please read the information sent out on the emails to keep up with what is happening and to decide if we want to become part of either organization. Neither group says what dues may cost, but Wing'd Rider is offering a magazine similar to 'Wing World'.

I hear rumors that Honda is discontinuing Gold Wing motorcycle production. The Japanese market may be shutting down due to pollution concerns, but from everything I have read and heard, it appears more likely Honda will slim down the models offered but continue production. One comment was that Honda may only offer the DCT, which makes sense as 90% of the 2018 and later models are DCT. Also, they may only offer the Tour model as the bagger model sales are fewer. The push at this time is for EV (electric vehicle) models, including motorcycles. Harley already has an EV model, so Honda may need to join the bandwagon. Time will tell.

Lots of changing going on, but we can still enjoy riding anyway. Thank you all again for your support and encouragement.
