Pet Rules and Regulations

We welcome you and your pets (dogs and cats) to our hotel. The following guidelines have been established to protect the comfort of all of our guests:

- All pets staying must be properly licensed and up to date on their vaccines. Vaccination records (Rabies and Parvovirus vaccine are a must) along with a pet photo must be presented prior to or at the time of check-in.
- You agree to be responsible for all property damage and/or personal injuries resulting from your pet. You further agree to indemnify and hold harmless Blanco County Inn, its owners and its operators from all liability and damage suffered as a result of your pet. Blanco County Inn reserves the right to charge your account commensurate to the cost of such damages.
- Nightly accommodation includes dog bowl/s, dog treats and pet towels. When given advance notice. Guest must only use designated towels for pets, Guest agrees that his or her debit/credit card will be charged a \$130.00 fee for failure to abide by these terms.
- A “dog on vacation” sign must be placed on your door at all times during your visit, which we will provide. Housekeeping will not enter the rooms as long as there is a “dog on vacation” sign.
- Pets should never be left unattended in hotel gathering spaces, and dogs must be walked in designated areas. Canine companions must be kept on a leash at all times. Further more pets should only be left in the room unattended if in a kennel.
- Please use waste bags to clean up after your pet. If you need bags, please see someone at the front desk. They will provide you with bags and can direct you to the pet relief stations.
- The pet fee is \$25.00 for small dogs (dogs <10 lbs) and \$50.00 for all other dogs, charged as individuals, which covers the duration of your stay.

Service animals are welcome throughout the hotel at no additional charge. Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, a service animal is limited to any dog or miniature horse that is “individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other cognitive disability.”

According to Federal ADA guidelines, animals whose sole function is to provide emotional support, comfort, therapy, companionship, or crime deterrence are considered pets and are not considered service animals. Therefore, the per stay pet fee does apply.
