The project consists of the development of a 30' x 30' heavy duty vinyl 12 sided preengineered gazebo with an at grade 6" concrete slab. The proposed Community Park Gazebo Project is a major component of a larger plan for a Community Park at the former middle school property. This larger plan has been discussed and developed by our community members for nearly seven

years. The proposed Community Park Gazebo Project is much needed because the residents of Weathersfield Township are an underserved population without access to local public recreational facilities within our boundaries. The estimated total project cost is \$68,539.99; the grant request is 75% or \$51,404.99 and the local match is 25% or \$17,135.00 (of which \$2,350.00 are in-kind contributions). It is anticipated and has been represented by a number of local organizations and individuals that most, if not all, of the 25% local match will be cash donations.

Whereas, the State of Ohio through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, administers financial assistance for public recreation purposes, through the State of Ohio Nature Works grant program and

Whereas, the Weathersfield Township Trustees desires financial assistance under the Nature Works Grant Program,

Now, therefore be it resolved by the Weathersfield Township Trustees;

That the Weathersfield Township Trustees approves filing this application for financial assistance;

That David A. Rouan, Township Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file an application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance; and

That the Weathersfield Township Trustees does agree to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the Nature Works Grant Program.
