Presentations Regarding Excellence, Bravery, and Courage:

Gia Grace Lamm:

Gia is the daughter of John and Kimberlee Lamm. Gia's father serves his community as a Trooper with the Ohio State Highway Patrol and has been named Trooper of the Year and leads the state with the most drug arrests.

Gia suffers from a serious heart condition. Akron Children's Hospital and the Cleveland Clinic were unable to correct her heart condition. The family refused to give up and they went to see a surgeon at the Boston Children's Hospital were a plan to engage in a very risky surgery to correct the problem was outlined. After the surgery, Gia and her family remained in Boston for an entire month.

Gia suffered a setback today and is currently at the Akron's Children's Hospital receiving care.

Sean Reilly:

On June 30, Sean and his family were given the news of Sean's cancer diagnosis; however, they were waiting on the results of a bone marrow aspiration to confirm the type. On July 1, it was confirmed that he indeed has ALL, which stands for High Risk B Lymphoblastic Leukemia.

Chemotherapy treatments started immediately and Sean was required to be in the hospital for 33 days in order to complete the induction phase of chemo. Since then, the treatments have continued every week since induction, he has received chemotherapy until now.

For the past 6 weeks, Sean has been in the hospital every other week. He is currently undergoing intensive Chemotherapy which requires in-patient hospital stays for at least 3 days, depending on how quickly his system can clear the chemo once it has been administered. This phase of chemo will last for another 2 weeks and from there we will go into another phase of chemo which, unfortunately, carries some nasty side effects that Sean has a hard time dealing with. He has approximately 3 more years of chemotherapy; however, as the months pass, his required visits/inpatient stays in the hospital are less frequent. As of right now, his body has responded very well to the treatments and he remains in remission. Going forward, all chemo is given with intention of keeping his blood and bone marrow leukemia free, as leukemia can easily return if treatments are not carried through the entire 3 years.

Through it all, Sean has handled all of this like a trooper and never ceases to amaze his doctors or nurses. To this day, the family is so grateful to the community we live in.

Logan Smith:

Logan, Sean's older brother, was part of the 2015 graduating class of Mineral Ridge High School. On July 1, 2015 he took the oath and was inducted into the United States Naval Academy as part of the Class of 2019. From there he promptly started plebe summer, which consists of 7 weeks of vigorous mental and physical training. A typical day during plebe summer lasted from approximately 4:45 am until 11:00 pm.

At the end of August, the academic year began and he attends classes 5 days per week. Some of his classes include Naval History, Cyber Security, Leadership, Calculus and Chemistry. Boxing and wrestling classes are also mandatory in order to teach self defense, hand-to-hand combat and to build confidence. Logan is also part of the Special Operations Training Team which is a Navy SEAL training program. It is 5-6 days per week and he is trained by retired US Navy SEALS. The training is extremely difficult and meant to shape future SEAL candidates upon graduation from the Academy. Logan is excited to get home for Christmas break this Saturday, December 19th.

Cole Palmer:

Cole Robert Palmer successfully completed four years of challenging academic, physical and professional military training, graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy, May 22, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Aerospace Engineering and a commission as a U.S. Navy Ensign. He is a graduate of Mineral Ridge High School.

At the academy Palmer was a Manager of the Men's Diving Team for the past four years and held leadership positions as Training Sergeant, Physical Missions Sergeant, Training Officer and Executive Officer.

Founded in 1845, the U.S. Naval Academy today is a prestigious four-year service academy that prepares midshipmen morally, mentally and physically to be professional officers in the naval service. More than 4,400 men and women representing every state in the U.S. and several foreign countries make up the student body, known as the Brigade of Midshipmen. U.S. News and World Reports has recognized the Naval Academy as a top five undergraduate engineering school and a top 20 best liberal arts college. Midshipmen learn from military and civilian instructors and participate in intercollegiate varsity sports and extracurricular activities. They also study subjects like leadership, ethics, small arms, drill, seamanship and navigation, tactics, naval engineering and weapons, and military law. Upon graduation, midshipmen earn a Bachelor of Science degree in a choice of 25 different subject majors and go on to serve at least five years of exciting and rewarding service as commissioned officers in the U.S. Navy or U.S. Marine Corps.

The Brigade of Midshipmen is comprised of approximately 4,400 students from every state in the union. Each year, approximately 1,200 young men and women are admitted to the Naval Academy's incoming class.

The academy's more than 81,000 alumni include; one president, 21 members of Congress, five governors, 73 Medal of Honor recipients, two Nobel Prize winners, 52 astronauts and 4,000 admirals and generals.

Fire Captain Thomas Lambert:

Captain Tom Lambert was off duty when he heard a call go out on his Weathersfield portable for a possible child drowning. Tom was just around the corner from the call so he responded in his personal vehicle. On arrival he found WPD patrolmen already on scene with the child. He assisted them with CPR until the ambulance arrived.

On arrival he found a confused elderly gentleman. Tom took vitals and did a patient assessment where he came to the concussion that he was having a CVA. He was able to convince the gentleman to go to the hospital which he was not happy with. On arrival at the hospital the man was treated for the CVA. Due to Tom's quick response and convincing him to go to the hospital he had a good outcome with no deficits.

Police Officer and Fire Lieutenant Daniel Lowery:

Officer Dan Lowery has been with the Township Police Department for nearly 11 years and has been a full-time officer for over five years. Dan also serves his community as a Lieutenant within our Fire Department.

Dan is married to Maria and they have two children, Liam and Ainsley. Dan is truly a family guy and loves spending time with his wife and children.

Dan graduated from Mineral Ridge High School and went on to Mercyhurst University where he received his Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice.

Dan serves as the Police Department's Detective and Juvenile Officer. Dan is also in charge of our school ALICE Training and serves on the CART Team.

Dan is a selfless leader and always goes the extra distance to try and make a situation better than he found it.
