Section 1: The Board finds and determines that it is in the best interest of Weathersfield Township, its residents, businesses and other electric consumers located within the corporate limits of the Township to establish an Aggregation Program in the Township. Provided that the Aggregation Program is approved by the electors of the Township pursuant to Section 2 of this Resolution, the Board is hereby authorized to automatically aggregate, in accordance with Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code, the retail electric loads located within the Township, and, for that purpose, to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the purchase and sale of electricity. The Board may exercise such authority jointly with any other municipal corporation, township or county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio to the full extent permitted by law. The aggregation will occur automatically for each person owning, occupying, controlling or using an electric load center proposed to be aggregated and will provide for the opt-out rights described in Section 3 of this Resolution.

Section 2: The Board of Elections of Trumbull County is hereby directed to submit the following question to the electors of Weathersfield Township at the election on November 3, 2015:

Shall the Board of Trustees of Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, OH have the authority to aggregate the retail electric load located in the Township, and for that purpose, enter into services agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of electricity, such aggregation to occur automatically except where any person elects to opt out?

FOR THE ELECTRIC AGGREGATION PROPOSAL

_ AGAINST THE ELECTRIC AGGREGATION PROPOSAL

The Fiscal Officer of this Board is instructed to immediately file a certified copy of this Resolution and the proposed form of the ballot question with the Trumbull County Board of Elections not less than ninety (90) days prior to the election. The Aggregation Program shall not take effect unless approved by a majority of the electors voting upon this Resolution and the Aggregation Program provided for herein at the election held pursuant to this Section 2 and Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: Upon approval of a majority of the electors voting at the election provided for in Section 2 of this Resolution, this Board, individually or jointly with any other political subdivision, may develop a plan of operation and governance for the Aggregation Program.

Before adopting such plan, this Board shall hold at least two public hearings on the plan. Before the first hearing, notice of the hearings shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township. The notice shall summarize the plan and state the date, time and place of each hearing. No plan adopted by this Board shall aggregate the electric load of any electric load center within the Township unless it, in advance, clearly discloses to the person owning, occupying, controlling, or using the load center that the person will be enrolled automatically in the Aggregation Program and will remain so enrolled unless the person affirmatively elects by a stated procedure not to be so enrolled. The disclosure shall state prominently the rates, charges, and other terms and conditions, of enrollment. The stated procedure shall allow any person enrolled in the Aggregation Program the opportunity to opt- out of the program at least every three years, without paying a switching fee. Any such person that opts out of the Aggregation Program pursuant to the state procedure shall default to the standard service offer provided under Section 4928.14 or division (D) of Section 4928.35, Ohio Revised Code until the person chooses an alternative supplier.

Section 4: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board and that the deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, incompliance with all legal requirements including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

> WHEREAS, the Ohio Legislature has enacted natural gas deregulation legislation which authorizes the legislative authorities of municipal corporations, townships and counties to aggregate automatically, pursuant to Section 4929.26 of the Ohio Revised Code, subject to opt-out provisions, the retail natural gas service located in the respective jurisdictions and to enter into service agreements to facilitate the sale of the natural gas loads; and

WHEREAS, such legislative authorities may exercise such authority jointly with any other legislative authorities;

WHEREAS, governmental aggregation provides an opportunity for residential and small business customers collectively to participate in the potential benefits of natural gas deregulation through lower natural gas rates which they would not otherwise be able to have individually;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Weathersfield Township seeks to establish a governmental aggregation program with opt-out provisions pursuant to Section 4929.26, Ohio Revised Code (the "Aggregation Program"), for the residents, businesses and other natural gas consumers in Weathersfield Township and in conjunction jointly with any other municipal corporation, township, county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio, as permitted by law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF WEATHERSFIELD TOWNSHIP, TRUMBULL COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. This Board finds and determines that it is in the best interest of Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, OH, its residents, businesses and other natural gas consumers located within the corporate limits of the Township to establish a natural gas Aggregation Program in the Township. Provided that the Aggregation Program is approved by the electors of Weathersfield Township, OH pursuant to Section 2 of this Resolution, Weathersfield Township, OH is hereby authorized to aggregate in accordance with Section 4929.26, Ohio Revised Code, the retail natural gas loads located within the Township, and, for that purpose, to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of natural gas. The Township may exercise such authority jointly with any other municipal corporation, township or county or other political subdivision of the State of Oho to the full extent permitted by law. The aggregation will occur automatically for each person owning, occupying, controlling, or using natural gas proposed to be aggregated and will provide for the opt-out rights described in Section 3 of this Resolution.

SECTION 2. The Board of Elections of Trumbull County is hereby directed to submit the following question to the electors of Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, OH at the general election on November 3, 2015. The Aggregation Program shall not take effect unless approved by a majority of the electors voting upon this issue at the election held pursuant to this resolution and Section 4929.26 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The form of the ballot to be used in the November 3, 2015, election shall be substantially as follows:

Shall Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, OH have the authority to aggregate the retail natural gas loads located in the Township, and for that purpose, enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of natural gas, such aggregation to occur automatically except where any person elects to opt out?

The Fiscal Officer of Weathersfield Township, OH is instructed immediately to file a certified copy of this Resolution and the proposed form of the ballot question with the Trumbull County Board of Elections not less than ninety (90) days prior to November 3, 2015. The Aggregation Program shall not take effect unless approved by a majority of the electors voting upon this

Resolution and the Aggregation Program provided for herein at the election held pursuant to this Section 2 and Section 4929.26 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. Upon the approval of a majority of the electors voting at the election provided for in Section 2 of this Resolution, this Board, individually or jointly with any other political subdivision, shall develop a plan of operation and governance for the Aggregation Program. Before adopting such plan, this Board shall hold at least two public hearings on the plan. Before the first hearing, notice of the hearings shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township. The notice shall summarize the plan and state the date, time, and location of each hearing. No plan adopted by this Board shall aggregate the natural gas of any natural gas customer within the Township unless it in advance clearly discloses to the person owning, occupying, controlling, or using the natural gas that the person will be enrolled automatically in the Aggregation Program and will remain so enrolled unless the person affirmatively elects by a stated procedure not to be so enrolled. The disclosure shall state prominently the rates, charges, and other terms and conditions of enrollment. The stated procedure shall allow any person enrolled in the Aggregation Program the opportunity to opt out of the program every two years without paying a switching fee. Any such person that opts out of the Aggregation Program pursuant to the stated procedure shall default to the natural gas company providing distribution service for the person's retail natural gas load until the person chooses an alternative supplier.

SECTION 4. This Board of Trustees finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

15-112 Mr. Blair made a motion to adopt a RESOLUTION PROPOSING THE Moratorium HONORABLE JOHN R. KASICH, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF Injection wells OHIO, TO DECLARE A MORATORIUM OF NEW INJECTION WELLS IN TRUMBULL COUNTY, OHIO, and declaring an emergency.

> WHEREAS, on May 20, 2015, the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners hosted a joint meeting with Commissioners from Ashtabula County, Mahoning County, Portage County, Stark County, Meigs County, Morrow County, the Trumbull County Township Trustees Association Committee, the Ashtabula County Township Trustees Association Committee, and the general public to discuss legislative and regulatory reform initiatives for restoration of certain local government controls over Class II injection wells; and

> WHEREAS, concerns were expressed regarding the context of legislative and regulatory reforms impacting the health, safety, and welfare of area residents including, without limitation, protection of local infrastructure, fresh water supplies, and property values; and

WHEREAS, Trumbull County is leading the State in the number of injection wells and 75% of the waste being transported into our area is from out of state. In Ohio, Class II injection wells are loosely regulated and not monitored for contaminant migration; and

WHEREAS, authority to implement local controls through zoning resolutions or otherwise was negatively impacted in 2004 after HB 278 was passed. Unintended consequences of that legislation include the proliferation of a disparate number of Class II injection wells in rural townships, villages and cities in Ohio's Appalachian counties and other mostly rural counties; and

WHEREAS, these consequences include unfunded burdens on our local government infrastructure, citizens' concerns regarding their health and safety, and the anticipated long term devaluation of real property values, financial loss to property owners, and tax base dilution; and

WHEREAS, the process known as "salt water injection' used to deposit brine/toxic waste under extreme pressure in wells several thousands of feet, as well as shallow injection wells, has been alleged to pollute water aquifers and trigger seismic activity. Further, Ohio has faced unusual seismic activity; and

WHEREAS, the Weathersfield Township Trustees requests the State of Ohio to contribute part of the license and permit fees for these wells to Trumbull County to help defray the costs incurred by local governments including, without limitation, to local fire, police, HAZMAT, highway, and other impacts to local infrastructure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WEATHERSFIELD TOWNSHIP TRUSTESS, TRUMBULL COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, that:

<u>Section I.</u> The Fiscal Officer shall send a certified copy of this Resolution to the Honorable John R. Kasich, Governor of the State of Ohio, Chief James Zehringer of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and Craig Butler, Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

<u>Section II</u>. The Weathersfield Township Trustees, Trumbull County, Ohio hereby joins the ranks of the Board of Trumbull County Commissioners, all other County Commissioners, Township Associations and Municipalities opposed to the injection of toxic oil and gas waste and to the permitting of additional Class II injection wells due to known and unknown risks and to the harm industrial dumping allegedly inflicts on Ohio communities.

<u>Section III</u>. The passage of this Resolution and all deliberations relating to the passage of this Resolution were held in open meetings in accordance with the provisions of Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.

<u>Section IV</u>. This Resolution is considered to be an emergency measure for the purpose of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, Ohio in light of the issues relating to injection wells within the Township and Trumbull County, and shall take effect, and be in full legal force and effect, at the earliest time allowed by law.
