Correspondence/Announcements:

- The Trustees would like to remind our residents of the dates for this year's Spring Clean-Up Program which will be held the week of May 9, 2022.

 Residents should put their material out on the same night as their regular pickup.
- The Trustees would like to remind our residents of the dates for this year's Scrap Tire Pickup Program. Curbside collection will begin on Monday, May 9, 2022 and continue through Friday, May 13, 2022. There is a limit of four car tires (off rims) per household, large truck tires will NOT be accepted. You can also drop-off your tires between 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM during the collection week at the Township Administration Building at 1451 Prospect Street, Mineral Ridge, Ohio 44440.
- The Trustees would like to remind our residents that the 2022 Residential Tree Limb Chipping Program is continuing. The 2022 Residential Tree Limb Chipping Program will begin on Friday May 6, 2022 and will continue each Friday through Friday October 28, 2022. For tree limb pick-up, you must call the Township by Thursday of each week to be placed on the list for a Friday pick-up. Please keep the following rules and procedures in mind:
 - This program is intended for residential tree limbs up to 3 inches in diameter.
 - The tree limbs must be placed at the curbside with all the cut ends aligned with each other toward the street.
 - No shrubs, stumps, roots, lumber, or railroad ties will be accepted. All tree limbs must be free from vines.
 - We are not a tree removal service; if you are having a tree professionally removed let them do the entire job, you must have them take the tree limbs as well.
- The Trustees would like to mention that their annual Easter Egg drive-thru event that was help on Saturday, April 16, 2022 went well. They would like to thank the Fire Department for their help with the event.
- The Trustees would like to mention that their annual street sweeping program is continuing and should be completed later this week.
- The Trustees would like to remind our residents that open burning is not permitted within the Township. We have had several brush fires that placed our firefighters and our resident's property at risk. Please do not open burn and enjoy the remainder of your spring.
- The Trustees would like to remind our residents that the Township Gas Aggregation Program with Constellation Energy will be ending with your meter reading in May. The Trustees would like to remind our residents that they have an opportunity to join the Trumbull County Gas Aggregation Program. The Trumbull County Gas Aggregation Program began in March of this year and continues through February 2026. A fixed rate of \$3.99 per Mcf has been established and there is a senior discount (over 65) at \$3.89/Mcf. For enrollment information please contact Constellation Energy at (844) 809-6834

The Township has requested \$447,000 from the Senator to be used for our Multi-Jurisdictional/Community Center.
- Ohio Edison has announced that they will be conducting tree trimming and other vegetation management work in our community as part of its ongoing efforts to help enhance electric service reliability. The tree-trimming program will help keep power flowing to customers by helping to prevent tree-related outages, such as those that can occur during the spring and summer storm season.

22-076 Motion to Authorize an Increase in the Micro-Purchase Threshold and to adopt Uniform Guidance Procurement Policy.

WHEREAS, the Township has received a distribution of monies (the "ARPA Funds") from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARPA" or the "Act");

WHEREAS, Congress passed the Act effective March 11, 2021;

WHEREAS, Section 603 created the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund which, among other things, appropriated money to cities, nonentitlement units of local government, and counties to mitigate the fiscal effects stemming from the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease (Covid-19);

WHEREAS, expenditure of ARPA funds is subject to the federal Uniform Guidance requirements set forth in 2 C.F.R. 200;

WHEREAS, the Township is a non-Federal entity under the definition set forth in 2 C.F.R. § 200.1;

WHEREAS, 2 C.F.R. 200.318 requires all recipients of federal funds to maintain documented procurement standards and policies;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. 200.320(a)(1)(ii), a non-Federal entity may award micro-purchases without soliciting competitive price or rate quotations if the non-Federal entity considers the price to be reasonable based on research, experience, purchase history or other information and documents that the non-Federal entity files accordingly;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. 200.320(a)(1)(iii), a non-Federal entity is responsible for determining and documenting an appropriate micro-purchase threshold based on internal controls, an evaluation of risk, and its documented procurement procedures;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. § 200.320(a)(1)(iv), a non-Federal entity may self-certify on an annual basis a micro-purchase threshold not to exceed \$50,000 and maintain documentation to be made available to a Federal awarding agency and auditors in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.334;

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. § 200.320(a)(1)(iv), such self-certification must include (1) a justification for the threshold, (2) a clear identification of the threshold, and (3) supporting documentation, which, for public institutions, may be a "higher threshold consistent with State law";

WHEREAS, under Ohio law, Townships are required to conduct competitive bidding purchases and contracts if such purchases and contracts exceed the following threshold:

1. Purchase of materials, machinery, and tools to be used in constructing, maintaining and repairing roads and culverts, where the amount involved exceeds \$50,000. R.C. 5549.21.

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- 2. Contracts for the maintenance or repair of roads, where the amount involved exceeds \$45,000. The board must advertise once, not later than two weeks prior to the letting of the contract, in a newspaper of general circulation in the township. The award must be to the lowest responsible bidder. R.C 5575.01.
- 3. Contracts for the construction and erection of a memorial building or monument when the amount involved exceeds \$50,000. R.C. 511.12(B).
- 4. Contracts for equipment for fire protection, mechanical resuscitation, underwater rescue and recovery, and communication estimated to exceed \$50,000. R.C. 505.37 and 505.376.
- 5. Contracts for street lighting systems where the cost exceeds \$50,000. R.C. 515.01.
- 6. Contracts for street lighting improvements where the cost exceeds \$50,000. The board shall accept the lowest and best bid, if the successful bidder meets the requirements of section 153.54 of the Revised Code. The board may reject all bids. R.C. 515.07.
- 7. Contracts for building modifications for energy savings pursuant to R.C. 505.264, where the estimated cost exceeds \$50,000 (with certain exceptions). Award must be to the lowest and best bidder in accordance with the provisions of R.C. 307.86 to 307.92.
- 8. Contracts for private sewage collection tiles where the cost exceeds \$50,000. R.C. 521.05. The successful bidder must meet the requirements of R.C. 153.54.

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. 200.320(a)(1)(iv), the Township desires to adopt higher micro-purchase thresholds than those identified in 2 C.F.R. §§200.67, 200.321(a), and 48 C.F.R. § 2.101; and

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby RESOLVED by the Board that:

- 1. In compliance with the Uniform Guidance, and specifically 2 C.F.R. 200.318, the Township adopts the attached Uniform Guidance Procurement Policy to be used for all expenditures of ARPA funds.
- 2. In accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.320(a)(1)(iv) and the applicable provisions of Ohio law, the Township hereby self-certifies the following micro-purchase thresholds, each of which is a "higher threshold consistent with State law" under 2 C.F.R. §200.320(a)(1)(iv)(C) for the reasons set forth in the recitals to this resolution:
 - A. \$50,000 for the purchase of materials, machinery and tools to be used in constructing, maintaining and repairing roads and culverts;
 - B. \$45,000 for contracts for the maintenance or repair of roads;
 - C. \$50,000 for contracts for the construction and erection of a memorial building or monument;
 - D. \$50,000 for contracts for equipment for fire protection, mechanical resuscitation, underwater rescue and recovery, and communication;
 - E. \$50,000 for contracts for street lighting systems;
 - F. \$50,000 for contracts for street lighting improvements;
 - G. \$50,000 for contracts for building modifications for energy savings, subjects to the exceptions set forth in R.C. 307.86 to 307.92; and
 - H. \$50,000 for contracts for private sewage collection tiles.
- 3. The self-certification made herein shall be effective as of the date hereof and shall be applicable until December 31, 2022, the end of the current fiscal year of the Township, but shall not be applicable to Federal financial assistance awards issued prior to the adoption of this resolution, including ARPA funds.
- 4. In the event that the Township receives funding from a federal grantor agency that adopts a threshold more restrictive than those contained herein, the Township shall comply with the more restrictive threshold when expending such funds.

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5. The Township shall maintain documentation to be made available to a Federal awarding agency, any pass-through entity, and auditors in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.334.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Township concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Township Trustees, and that all deliberations of the Township Trustees and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
