25-034 MOTION TO ADOPT A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF WEATHERSFIELD TOWNSHIP, TRUMBULL COUNTY, OHIO STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE OHIO LOCAL PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE BOND AMENDMENT TO APPEAR ON THE MAY 6, 2025, PRIMARY BALLOT

WHEREAS, the Ohio Local Public Infrastructure Bond Amendment, as proposed through House Joint Resolution 8, seeks to authorize the issuance of \$2.5 billion in general obligation bonds, limited to \$250 million per year over 10 years, to finance critical public infrastructure improvement projects throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, the funds from the proposed amendment would be administered through the State Capital Improvement Program (SCIP) by the Ohio Public Works Commission, providing essential grants, loans, and loan assistance to local governments for infrastructure projects, including roads, bridges, water supply, wastewater management, stormwater utilities, and waste facilities; and

WHEREAS, the SCIP has been a cornerstone of public infrastructure development in Ohio since 1987, funding nearly 19,000 projects and delivering vital benefits to communities in all 88 counties, including Weathersfield Township; and

WHEREAS, Weathersfield Township has directly benefited from SCIP, receiving \$2,383,534 in grant funds for 25 road infrastructure projects, which have significantly improved the quality of life and safety for Township residents; and

WHEREAS, the continuation of SCIP funding is critical to prevent a gap in infrastructure investment, as the current authorization is set to sunset on July 1, 2025, and to ensure that local governments can continue to access the financial resources necessary to address urgent and long-term public infrastructure needs; and

WHEREAS, approval of the Ohio Local Public Infrastructure Bond Amendment would ensure that the State of Ohio can continue to invest in its communities without creating new taxes or increasing existing ones, as the bonds will be serviced through the state's general revenue funds within its 5% debt service limit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Weathersfield Township, Trumbull County, Ohio, that:

- 1. The Board of Trustees strongly supports the Ohio Local Public Infrastructure Bond Amendment to appear on the May 6, 2025, primary ballot.
- 2. The Board recognizes the invaluable contributions of the State Capital Improvement Program to the infrastructure and well-being of the township and the state as a whole, and affirms the importance of its continuation through this amendment.
- The Board commits to raising awareness among Township residents about the significance of the Ohio Local Public Infrastructure Bond Amendment and its potential to ensure ongoing infrastructure improvements in Weathersfield Township and beyond.
- 4. The Fiscal Officer is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Ohio Township Association (OTA) to express the Board's strong support for the

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Ohio Local Public Infrastructure Bond Amendment so that the OTA can use this resolution to garner support from other townships state-wide.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
