FIFTH ANNUAL REUNION

June 4 & 5 are the dates of the 2010 reunion! We will be returning to the Hilton Cincinnati Airport in Florence, KY (7373 Turfway Road, Florence, KY 41042; the phone number is 859-371-4400, and their web site URL is http://www1.hilton.com/en_US/hi/hotel/CVGCHHF-Hilton-Cincinnati-Airport-Kentucky/index.do. Be sure to tell the registration clerk you are attending the Charlie Company Reunion when making your reservation. The Hilton will provide complimentary airport shuttle service.

We have a block of 45 rooms reserved at the rate of \$85 a night. This rate is good three days before and three days after the reunion dates. The Hilton will continue to honor this rate if we go over 45 rooms as long as space is available. The Hilton will release any unreserved rooms of our block for general sale at the cut-off date **May 28, 2010**. Any reservation received after the cut-off date will be accepted on a space and rate available basis. If you wish to cancel, please do so by 6 pm, hotel local time, on the day of arrival to avoid cancellation penalties.

MEALS - We have arranged with the Hilton to prepare a buffet Friday and Saturday night at 6 p.m. for our group. The cost of the meal is \$25 per person (this <u>includes</u> tax and gratuity). We have to order these ahead of time and must make payment before the actual event.

To several of us our friendship with Keith goes past the reunions to more than forty years ago when Trace arrived as an "instant" to 2nd platoon in August or September 1969. Our company was in transition then as many of the guys Duck and I knew when we arrived in May were going home. We were in weapons squad with two M-60s and would go out on patrols and snakes with the other squads as assigned. We liked Trace and Stephens out of these "new" guys since part of the deal was keeping "something" together and they tried to do that. Trace was fun to be around and it was good to see him again back in '02. I enjoyed reminding him of the SEC at the reunions and appreciated his love for his family and his passion for living life to its fullest.

His obituary stated. "Keith was an avid outdoorsman and found peace and comfort in the woods. He loved all type of game hunting especially deer and turkey. He spent many hours fishing and walking in the woods. Keith loved Ohio State football and missed very few games in his lifetime. He was a hard core Trimble Tomcat fan, especially Football Friday night."

"He served in the United States Army and completed a one year tour in Vietnam. While serving in Vietnam he received a bronze star medal for meritorious achievement in ground operations against hostile forces."

"Keith worked for AEP as an electrical lineman for 32 years and retired from the company in 2004."

"Per his wishes, his body was donated to the Ohio University College of Osteopathic Medicine." The family had a "Celebration of Life" on Saturday, March 13th at the Trimble High School gymnasium and a dinner and social gathering after the celebration.
