The Eighth Annual Charlie Company Reunion will held at the *Hilton Cincinnati Airport* in Florence, KY on June 7 & 8. Reservations may be made directly with the Hotel room reservation department by calling the hotel at 1-859-371-4400. In doing so, request the group rate for Group "Charlie Company 1st Battalion- 20th Infantry." Room rates will again be \$85 per night plus tax and will be paid by individuals. We were given a new cutoff date, May 20, along with more rooms added to our block of rooms. Reservations will continue to be accepted and the Hilton will honor reservations made as long as space is available so don't think it's too late to attend. You can make your reservations and later cancel, if necessary, at no cost to you providing you meet their notification deadline.
