REUNION VI~ 2011

The Sixth Annual Charlie Company Reunion will be held at the Hilton Cincinnati Airport in Florence, KY on June 10 & 11. The contracted cost of the rooms will be \$85 per night. This price is good three days before and three days after the event. You may register online or call the Hilton at 1-859-371-4400. We are going to have practically the same agenda as in the past but we are adding an optional riverboat cruise for Friday noon with BB Riverboats.

Thirty-two have already expressed interest in the riverboat cruise with most indicating *lunch* and cruise instead of cruise only. BB **Riverboats** recommended we make reservations as soon as possible to be sure we can "cruise" so we have set a deadline of March 4 to make the initial reservation. They will accept reservations after that date as long as space is available and also stated March would be a good time for a group our size to make reservations to be sure we well be able to cruise at the time we want. A deposit is required at the time of reservation and so we need this earlier than the meal money. They will give refunds up to one week before the cruise but nothing during the seven days prior to June 10. (Web site info... Riverboat Cruise)

Our "interest" surveys indicated 23 wanted the **Cruise & Lunch**, 3 wanted **Cruise Only** and 8 either had no preference or didn't state it. The group rate for *Cruise & Lunch* is \$27.50 and enough have already sent money so we now qualify for this reduced rate instead of \$34.50.

Right now we do not have enough to qualify for the *Cruise Only* group rate so we are asking for

\$16.50. If we do qualify for the group rate, you will be refunded \$1.50 at the reunion to make up the difference between the group rate (\$15.06) and non-group rate. *Please be advised the Cruise Only guests will not be seated with the Cruise & Lunch guests!*

So, if you want to cruise with us on Friday June 10 from 12-2 pm, please send \$27.50 per person if you want Cruise & Lunch or \$16.50 per person if you want Cruise Only to Mike Stinnett, 319 Antioch Road, Clarksville, TN 37040 to be received by Friday March 4. Payment will be accepted after that time with the understanding that we may not be able to add more to our group if they do not have the space. As usual, make the check out to Charlie 1-20 or to Mike Stinnett. You may include your cruise preferences and # of people on the memo line of the check. Some have also sent the money for the optional Friday and Saturday night meals. The buffet menu will be in the next newsletter and the cost is \$25 per person per meal.
