CORILLAS WORK THE AO

Last week, Delta Co. routed a VC main force basecamp in the 515 Valley, eight kilometers southwest of Liz. That basecamp was believed to be a cooking center, a VC kitchen, that propared food for company-size elements in the field.

This week; the company uncovered ther enemy support camp--this one a VC main force ordnance camp in the mountains, four Kilometers southeast of the VC kit-

chen.

Fridar, the con any CP and the 3d platoon's 1st Squad were on a natrol in flatlands at the base of the Mui Con Vus. The men came yoon some fresh tracks leading up into a mountain and called for an 11th Brigade visual tracker team. The team lead the men up the east slope and stopped fust short of what turned out the ordnance factory.

The next morning, the men went back up the slope, this time without the assistance of the tracker team, and at the insistence of SSG Phan Van Tinh, company's interpreter, pursued the trail, further. Signs of an enemy encampment became more apparent M as they found niles of rice husks and trench networks in the area.

They soon found more fresh tracks, a freshly dug bunker, an AK47 round,

olothing hung out to dry.

The patrol broke up into two elements with SSG Tinh and the CP's Kit Carson Scout, Nguyen Si, walking point Following. the tracks, the CP element entered the basecamp and found it deserted. There were two hooches, one a general cooking area, and the other an ordnance plant in which the men found a five-gallon can of petna and three complete homemade grenades.

A further search of the camp revealed a bag containing 17 more grenades, ammo can full of tools, two protective

masks, and another AK round.

The enemy had made good use of springs near the camp and had constructed troughs of banana stalks and used helmets collecting vessels. The trench network provided straight-shot communication.According to CPT James Whitaker, (GRENADE FACTORY continued on next page)

SYKES! REGULARS NET THREE ENEMY KIAS; UNCOVER SIX TUNNELS

The SYKES! RECULARS were again busy throughout the Mo this week by achieving significant reductions of energy personnel, encamments, and ordners. The pate talion killed three enemy, detained six VC and 24 Vietnamese civilians for terrogation, uncovered one enony besecamp and six tunnels, and found two booby traps and a sapper satchel charge.

Jan. 12th, Bravo Co. detained ten civil and for questioning. Charlie Co., operating in the southern portion of the AO, destroyed two booby traps. The first was a hand grenade attached to a trip wire firing device. The second, found by the list Platoon, was a 500-pound bomb with a metal to metal contact firing da-

Jan. 13th, Bravo Co. detained ten civilians for questioning and bickedup four VC. Two of the VC were detained five kilometers northeast of Liz, just west No Duc. One VC was a security chief and the other was a confirmed guerrilla. They were picked up along with three other military age males believed to be draft dod-In the same area, the Gorilla Squad reported three VC KIAs who attempted evade in a sampan.

Recon picked up four civilians for questioning and detained a 20-year-old VC who was carrying papers of commendation from his CO for operations against the ARVNs. The platoon also found and destroyed

mortar round found in the area.

Jan, 14th, Bravo and Delta companies the each discovered 50-foot tunnels which were destroyed. Delta also detained three Vietnamose, one of whom was believed be a VC tax collector.

Jan. 15th, Delta found another tunnel, three kilometers southwest of Liz, which was concealed in a bamboo hedgerow covered by a trap door. Charlie Co. found two more tunnel complexes, four kilometers southeast of Liz, one of which was · motors long, branching off in many directions, and containing a number of rooms.

Jan. 16th, Charlie Co. dusted off a VC who was wounded when he set off an enemy booby trap. Recon, operating eight kilo-meters porhteast of Liz, fired on a VC who was heading toward the men with a weapon. The enemy soldier was wounded in the contact, but managed to evade. The plateon also engaged three more VC who evaded to the north. That evening, Delta's 3rd Platoon fired on a VC approaching its night defensive perimeter. The next morning, the men found his racing sheakers.

Jan. 17th, Recon picked up a Vietnamese civil an for interrogation and engaged a four-man VC element dressed khaki uniforms and carrying a weapon. The platoon pursued the group and called in Sharks to continue the chase. Meanwhile, Charlie Co., ten kilometers north of Liz, dug up a satchal charge containing axplosives and a homomade firing device. The charge weighed about ten pounds and included some kind of persist at CS gas.

Jan. 18th, a LOH reacting to intelligence chased down and detained a Vietnamese evading in the Gaza Strip. A Warlord team, working eight kilometers mrtheast of Liz, snatched three civilians who evaded into a bunker. Also on the 18th, Dolta was in the mountains west of Liz and uncovered the VC main force basecamp. GRENADE FACTORY continued

CO, the VC could get into a tranch heat a direct math to the basecamp OPs, which were located at large rocks on the slopes and provided excellent observation of the entire valley.

"The VC had definitely been there recently, "explained CPT Whitaker. "A lot of the thatching was still green and the cuttings on the bamboo stalks were still fresh. They must have beat it out the back way just as we came in."

Due to Dulta's efforts, the VC main force in the area is now without two of its fundamental support groups--its mess hall and its ordnance plant.
