⁷When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. ⁸"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; ⁹and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ¹¹For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."



COVID-19 UPDATE – August 26, 2022

According to the CDC, 95% of the U.S. population now has some level of immunity against Covid. Vaccinations and previous infections present a lower risk of severe disease, hospitalization, and death from COVID than it did at the start of 2020.

If you are exposed to Covid, or if you are sick and suspect that you have Covid – you should isolate and test.

- Wear a high-quality mask when around others.
- Follow the advice of your health-care provider.
- If you are immune compromised, follow the directives of your health care professional.

If your test results are negative, and you are symptom free, you can end your isolation.

If your test results are positive:

- **Stay** home for at last 5 days and isolate from others in your home. Wear a high-quality mask when around others.
- If after 5 days you are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication, and your symptoms are improving, or you never had symptoms, you may end isolation after day 5.
- Regardless of when you end isolation, avoid being around people who are more likely to get sick from Covid until at least day 11.

<u>How do the updated guidelines affect St. Paul's?</u> Masks, social distancing and hand sanitizing are no longer requested from everyone. We will continue to keep hand sanitizer's at worship and in hallways for your convenience. For worship, they are located at the entrance to our worship area in Fellowship Hall. If you are experiencing symptoms, please stay home.
