All baptized believers are welcome to commune. Gluten free wafers and grape juice are also available.

Continuous Communion Distribution

In preparation for Communion, Pastor will request one volunteer to serve as Usher and assist members in coming forward for communion. Starting at the front right side of the sanctuary (facing the altar) release one row at a time. After the last person on the right side has been released, move to the front of the sanctuary, and wait for the Pastor's nod to release the left side of the sanctuary. Maintain 6 ft. distance between people.

Usher will release one row at a time. Please maintain 6 ft. distance in the aisle. Upon approaching the altar, sanitize your hands. Take a wine cup, refrain from touching other cups. Receive the bread from the Pastor, holding out your open hand, palm up, fingers straight out. The Assistant Minister will pour wine into your cup. Please remain fully masked when receiving your bread and wine. Proceed to the cup disposal area and consume both elements at that location. Place disposable communion cup in the waste container.

* Blessing

Response after the blessing: C: Amen.

* Prayer after Communion

L: Let us pray. Pour out upon us the spirit of your love, O Lord, and unite the wills of those whom you have fed with one heavenly food; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

* Benediction

Response: C: Amen.

* Dismissal

L: Go in peace. Serve the Lord. Response: C: Thanks be to God.

An usher will dismiss one row at a time, first one side of the sanctuary and then the other side; be patient and follow usher guidance. Wear mask until you leave church property. Do not congregate in the building.
