Continuous Communion Distribution

Usher will release one row at a time. Please maintain 6 ft. distance in the aisle. Upon approaching the altar, sanitize your hands. Take a wine cup, refrain from touching other cups. Receive the bread from the Pastor, holding out your open hand, palm up, fingers straight out. The Assistant Minister will pour wine into your cup. Please remain fully masked when receiving your bread and wine. Proceed to the cup disposal area and consume both elements at that location. Place disposable communion cup in the waste container.


or anything that belongs to your neighbor. - Exodus 20:17

GROCERY MINISTRY is growing! We have added New Hope Missions as a partner! Families receive one York County food box, produce, canned and baked goods from New Hope, eggs and produce from St. Paul's every week. Our neighborhood need is also growing. From walking the streets to give it away, we now average 65 -70 families coming weekly to receive food. Last week we provided 82 boxes and 80 doz. eggs and 60 boxes of squash, peppers, cottage cheese, teas, rice tomatoes spinach and spices. More items, more families....means we'd love to have more people join us to pack from 9-9:30ish and distribute from 10-11. You don't need to stay the entire time but are more than welcome! Please consider joining us for a Saturday morning outreach to our community.

WHY CAMP?

A place for Faith Formation and Vocational Discernment

The heart of faith formation is essentially deepening the relationship between us and God, and also between us and our siblings in Christ. Camp is a place where faith formation comes to life! Scripture and living the way Jesus teaches us becomes real. Rather than stories and poems written about and for ancient people, scripture is revealed to us as a story we enter into and are part of!



Lower Susquehanna Synod Bishop James Dunlop, who continues to attend Family Camp with his wife and grandchildren, has often reflected that his time at camp was central in his own vocational discernment, leading him to enter seminary and seek ordination. Deep conversations and time for personal devotion and prayer helped him listen closely to the Holy Spirit – and his experience was not unique!

"Camp is where I first really felt God speaking to me," is a common refrain we hear from campers year after year – and not just from kids. We hear this from people of all ages, people in public ministry roles, and people who live out their faith in the secular world.

Maybe it's time we rethink the value of the summer church camp experience. It's not just a "once and done" opportunity; it's a valuable and unmatched opportunity for lifelong faith formation and vocational discernment.
