L: Father of us all, keep us mindful of our trespasses; save us from bearing false witness, and help us honor your name above all others. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

(Here other intercessions may be offered.)

L: O God, you have called the saints your own. Gather us, with them, into your kingdom, in the promise of life forever with you. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

P: Into your hands, O God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy through your son, Jesus Christ our Lord.
