

INTRODUCTION

In Deuteronomy God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111 God shows the people the power of God's works. For the church these are ways of pointing to the unique authority people sensed in Jesus' actions and words. We encounter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that prevails over any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.



THE WORD

FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Today's reading is part of a longer discourse in Deuteronomy, an updating of the law for the Israelite community as the people wait to enter the promised land. Here Moses assures the people that God will continue to guide them through prophets who will proclaim the divine word.

- L [Moses said:] ¹⁵The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you shall heed such a prophet. ¹⁶This is what you requested of the LORD your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly when you said: "If I hear the voice of the LORD my God any more, or ever again see this great fire, I will die." ¹⁷Then the LORD replied to me: "They are right in what they have said. ¹⁸I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people; I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who shall speak to them everything that I command. ¹⁹Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet shall speak in my name, I myself will hold accountable. ²⁰But any prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded the prophet to speak—that prophet shall die."

SECOND READING


1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Paul is concerned about the way some Corinthian Christians use their freedom in Christ as license to engage in non-Christian behavior that sets a damaging example to other, impressionable believers. Christians have a responsibility to each other that their behavior does not cause another to sin.

L ¹Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. ²Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge: 3but anyone who loves God is known by him. ⁴Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." 5Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords—⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist. 7It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. 8"Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. 9But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? ¹¹So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. 12But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.





A NEW MESSAGING SYSTEM IS READY!

We have set up a new telephone messaging system for the whole St. Paul's community! This system, called Phonevite, allows the church to immediately send messages to everyone at the same time. In a matter of just a few minutes, we can get a message to 200+ people. This service is a secure service that is only controlled by a select few people within the congregation: the administrator, the pastor, the council president.

School systems, county governments and civic organizations use these kinds of messaging systems. If you've had school children in the last decade or so, then you'll be familiar with this kind of messaging.

Here's how this works:

- All of the phone numbers we have attached to your information in the church directory have been put in the messaging system.
- Check the St. Paul's directory to make sure your correct phone numbers are listed. Contact Carmen If you prefer receiving a call from just one of your numbers - home OR cell number. If you do not see the number you prefer receiving the call from on the most current directory phone list, then contact Carmen asap with the correct number BY MONDAY, FEBRUARY 5TH.
- TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 6TH @ 2 PM, we are sending out the first test message to all of you.
- The incoming message will be sent from the church's phone number. If you do not answer, the message will be left on your voicemail.
- WARNING!!! After you hear the message, the system will give you TWO prompts: One to listen to the message again, and the other (#5) if you wish to opt out of ever receiving any message again from this system.
- IF YOU CHOOSE TO OPT OUT OF THE SYSTEM, WE CANNOT ADD YOUR NUMBER BACK FROM OUR END.
- If you do not receive the call/message on 2/6, please call Carmen to update or add your correct phone number/s BY MONDAY, FEBRUARY 19TH.
- TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 20TH @ 2 PM, we will send a second test message out to make sure we've captured any changes/edits/adds.

How are we going to use this message system:

For weather-related announcements/closures/delays, for funeral announcements, for special or annual meetings, for special services, etc.
