COVID-19 UPDATE - Nov. 1, 2022

'TIS THE SEASON! Not for holidays and celebrations – but for COVID, respiratory infections, influenza, and the common cold.

How do we protect ourselves, and each other, as winter sets in and contagions fill the air?

- Keep air moving through Fellowship Hall by leaving the HVAC circulation fans on low and operating floor fans.

BUILDING RENOVATIONS – WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED?

SANCTUARY To rave reviews, painting of Ceiling and Walls is complete; refinishing the floor is in process. Pews will be returned to the sanctuary and the painters will return to finish their work.

The staining and sealing of the sanctuary oak floor has begun and will take one full month for the floor to harden/cure. The floor cannot be walked on during this process. Even walking on the floor without shoes will cause damage. PLEASE, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO ENTER THE SANCTUARY. Once the floor is cured in mid-December, you will be invited back into the sanctuary to see the progress.

When will we resume worship in the Sanctuary?

A definite date is unknown. Waiting for the oak floor to cure, returning the pews to the sanctuary, having the painters return to finish their work – all of this takes time. Everyone would like a return by Christmas, but that may not be possible. And whether we celebrate Christmas in the sanctuary or in fellowship hall, worship will still be glorious and festive. A huge challenge in resuming worship in the sanctuary will be reinstalling the pews. Returning the pews will be more difficult than when they were removed since we do not want to damage the new floor. The move will begin in mid-December and could take several workdays/evenings depending on how many physically strong volunteers are available to help. We will keep you posted on moving dates/times.

HALLWAYS ON THE MAIN FLOOR As part of the Sanctuary project, hallways on the main floor have been painted.

FELLOWSHIP HALL AND HALLWAYS/STAIRWELLS Congregational Council approved the painting of Fellowship Hall along with the hallways and stairwells up to the main floor and to the landing leading to the second floor. Because cost will be \$40,000, Congregation approval will be requested at our December 11th Annual Meeting. Funding will come from the Raubenstine bequest. Based upon Congregation approval, this work will be done in January/February 2023. Also, during this time, damaged ceiling tiles will be replaced.

PLEASE NOTE: Fellowship Hall will be closed to any activities during January and February. As appropriate, the Lounge will be available.
