



Author's Note

This book was inspired by my daughter Alyson's true life whimsical adventures. Alyson was a survivor of Twint-to-Twin Transfusion Syndrome (TTTS) and was born at 27 weeks gestation, weighing two pounds, eight ounces. Her identical twin siter, Alyssa, passed away in utero three weeks prior to their emergency delivery due to complications from TTTS. Heartbreakingly, Alyson passed away mid publication of this book at the age of 28. She giggled seeing herself in animated form and was excited to know a book was being published about her.

I wrote this book as if Alyson could talk and share her life's journey. Alyson sustained brain injuries prior to birth as a result of blood clots being passed in utero through blood vessels shared from her demised twin. She had the medical diagnoses of cerebral palsy, epilepsy, and chronic lung disease. Alyson was non verbal, wheelchair bound, fed through a grube, had a trach and used several respiratory machines to assist with breathing-to list a few of her unique challenges. Through it all, Alyson radiated profound patience and happiness. She loved life in spite of her numerous medical diagnoses. She was a blessing to our family, and through her challenges taught and did more for us than we feel we could have done for her. At first glance, most people may have just seen my smiley young lady in her bright pink wheelchair. However, there truly is more to Alyson, and other individuals similar to her; they have countless and unique possibilities.
