PROMPTS

Copy, paste, customize, and run the play.

1. The “Where Do I Start With AI?” Master Prompt

Use this when: You are brand new and do not know what to learn first.

Copy and paste:

Act as a beginner-friendly AI strategist and practical digital mentor.

I am new to AI and I need help figuring out where to start without getting overwhelmed.

Here is my situation:
 My skill level with AI: [brand new / beginner / somewhat experienced]
 My main goal: [save time / make content / start a business / grow a business / make digital products / organize my life / learn AI for work / other]
 My current tools, if any: [ChatGPT, Canva, Gemini, Claude, Midjourney, CapCut, none, other]
 My biggest frustration: [explain what confuses you]

Keep the explanation clear, practical, and beginner-friendly.
 Do not overwhelm me with technical language.

2. The “What Can AI Actually Do For Me?” Master Prompt

Use this when: You keep hearing about AI but still do not understand how it fits your real life.

Copy and paste:

Act as an AI use-case coach.

Help me understand what AI can actually do for my life, work, creativity, or business.

Here is what I do or want to do:
 [Describe your job, business, creative work, daily responsibilities, or goals]

Here are my current struggles:
 [List what takes too much time, confuses you, drains you, or keeps getting delayed]

Create a personalized list of AI use cases for me.
 Organize the answer into these categories:

1. Tasks AI can help me do faster
2. Tasks AI can help me organize
3. Tasks AI can help me create
4. Tasks AI can help me research
5. Tasks AI can help me improve
6. Tasks I should not fully trust AI with
7. Tasks where I still need my own judgment

For each use case, explain:
 What AI can help with
 What I still need to provide
 What the final result could become
 How this could save time, improve quality, or support income

End with my top 3 best AI starting points.

3. The “AI Money Facts vs. Hype” Master Prompt

Use this when: You want to know what is realistic about making money with AI.

Copy and paste:

Act as a brutally honest AI business educator.

I want to understand the truth about making money with AI. I do not want fake guru hype, exaggerated income claims, or unrealistic advice.

My current situation:

My skills: [list your skills]

My interests: [list your interests]

My current audience, if any: [describe audience or say none]

My business experience: [none / beginner / some / experienced]

My time each week: [number of hours]

My budget: [free / low / medium / higher]

4. The “Pick My First AI Tool” Master Prompt

Use this when: You are overwhelmed by too many AI apps.

Copy and paste:

Act as an AI tool selection guide for beginners.

I need help choosing the best type of AI tool to start with. Do not give me a huge list. Help me pick based on my actual needs.

My goal is:

[Explain what you want to do with AI]

My current skill level:

[brand new / beginner / intermediate]

My device:

[phone / laptop / tablet / all]

Use this when: You need AI explained clearly without being talked down to.

Explain AI to me like I am intelligent but new to the topic. Do not talk down to me. Do not use heavy technical language unless you define it simply.

Teach me:

1. What AI is
2. What generative AI is
3. What a prompt is
4. Why prompts matter
5. Why AI sometimes gives generic answers
6. Why AI can be wrong
7. How to use AI safely
8. How beginners should start practicing

Use simple examples related to:

Content creation

Making extra income opportunities

Include:

A short glossary of beginner AI terms
A myth vs. fact section
A “what to learn first” list
A “do not worry about this yet” list
A 5-question quiz to check my understanding

6. The “Build My First AI Workflow” Master Prompt

Use this when: You do not just want random prompts. You want a repeatable process.

Copy and paste:

Act as an AI workflow strategist.

Help me build my first simple AI workflow based on my goal.

My goal:

[Example: create weekly content, write blog posts, build a digital product, organize client work, create visuals, plan my business]

My current process:

[Explain how you do it now, even if it is messy]

My biggest bottleneck:

[What slows you down? Ideas, writing, design, planning, research, editing, posting, selling, consistency, confidence?]

My available time:

[Daily or weekly time]

Create a beginner-friendly AI workflow.

Include:

1. The exact steps in order
2. Which parts AI can help with
3. Which parts I need to review myself
4. Prompts I can use at each step
5. A simple checklist
6. A weekly schedule
7. A way to measure if the workflow is working
8. One way to make the workflow easier when I feel overwhelmed

Keep it realistic. Do not create a complicated system I will abandon.

7. The “Turn My Skill Into an AI-Assisted Money Move” Master Prompt

Use this when: You want to connect AI to income without sounding scammy.

Copy and paste:

Act as a realistic digital product and service strategist.

Help me figure out how to use AI to turn one of my skills, interests, or experiences into a practical money move.

Problems I know how to solve:
[List problems people ask you about or things you are good at]

My audience or possible audience:
[Describe who you want to help]

Generate 5 realistic AI-assisted money move ideas.

For each idea include:

8. The “Make My First Prompt Better” Master Prompt

Use this when: Your AI results are basic, boring, or too generic.

Copy and paste:

Act as a prompt engineer and clarity coach.

I am going to give you a weak or basic prompt. Your job is to upgrade it into a stronger prompt that gets a more useful result.

My original prompt:
[Paste your prompt here]

What I wanted the AI to help me create:
[Explain the desired result]

My audience:
[Who is this for?]

My tone or style:
[Professional, funny, bold, luxury, simple, educational, direct, warm, etc.]

My rules:
[List anything the AI should avoid or include]

Now do the following:

1. Explain why my original prompt is weak or incomplete
2. Ask me up to 5 missing context questions if needed
3. Rewrite the prompt into a stronger version
4. Create a master version with role, goal, context, rules, format, and output instructions
5. Create a shorter version for quick use
6. Give me a revision prompt I can use after the first output
7. Tell me how to judge whether the result is actually good

Be honest and specific.

9. The “AI Tea to Money Move” Master Prompt

Use this when: You see an AI update, trend, or tool announcement and want to know what to do with it.

Copy and paste:

Act as an AI trend translator and creator business strategist.

I found this AI update, trend, tool, or news item:
[Paste or summarize the AI news here]

Explain it in plain language.

Then break down:

1. What happened
2. Why people are talking about it
3. What is useful about it
4. What may be hype
5. Who should care
6. Who can ignore it for now
7. What this could mean for creators
8. What this could mean for business owners
9. What this could mean for digital products; content, services, or workflows
10. One practical money-minded move someone could make from this

Then create:

1. One beginner-friendly prompt inspired by this update
2. One business prompt
3. One content prompt
4. One digital product prompt
5. One visual prompt idea, if relevant

End with a clear verdict:
Use it now, watch it, or ignore it for now.

10. The “My First 7 Days With AI” Master Prompt

Use this when: You want a simple starting plan that leads to action.

Copy and paste:

Act as a beginner AI coach and accountability strategist.

Create a 7-day beginner AI plan for me.

My goal:
[Explain your main goal]

My skill level:
[brand new / beginner / somewhat experienced]

My available time each day:
[10 minutes / 20 minutes / 30 minutes / 1 hour / other]

My preferred learning style:
[step-by-step / examples / visual / hands-on / short tasks / detailed explanations]

My biggest concern:
[overwhelm, not being tech savvy, wasting time, making money, choosing tools, privacy, generic results, other]

Create a 7-day plan that teaches me AI through action.

For each day include:

1. The focus of the day
2. A simple explanation
3. One prompt to copy and paste
4. One small assignment
5. One thing to avoid
6. One finished output I should have by the end of the day

Make the plan realistic and beginner-friendly.

At the end, give me:
