


Newsletter – April to September 2023

Life Saving Lessons and Supporting ABC!



Dr. M. Sivaranjani is a local paediatrician with a strong belief in empowering parents and caregivers to have the necessary knowledge and know-how to care for children. She is also passionate about teaching them how to handle situations requiring a quick response.

In her owns words (since we can't say it any better):

"In spite of training thousands of parents, I never get tired of this one thing - teaching parents about First Aid and CPR. Nothing can be more gratifying than saving a life! This passion and commitment may have stemmed from my life having been saved by my intern Dr Arun when I choked on a goose berry seed. I know of parents who attended the sessions/followed my videos and saved their children from choking and saved their children/spouse by giving CPR. You may count them on your fingers, but every life saved is 'SAVED'! Isn't it? Statistics say 6 out of 10 deaths can be prevented by giving the right First Aid at the right time!"

Dr. Sivaranjani has been supporting ABC since we started in 2013. In recent years, she has conducted many First aid and CPR sessions for parents and care givers. For two of these sessions this year, she donated all the proceeds to ABC. We thank her for her very generous donation.

New to the ABC Family

"I volunteered to come for the cuddling activity at the orphanage once a week. This is a unique experience for me as I have not seen/cuddled so many babies at one go, until now. I have been with babies as young as six months to toddlers who are about three years old. I must say I enjoy being with the

toddlers very much. They brighten my day with their sweet smiles, innocent looks, and little pranks. We often take some toys with us to entertain them. We try to talk to them about colours and numbers and words. Many of them stare without giving responses but some of them respond positively. This is a work in progress! Some kids just want to be on my lap and they cry when I have to place them down. That brings to fore the necessity of having many hands at the cuddling front. We play some nursery rhymes and encourage the kids to sway and dance. They seem to enjoy this activity very much, as we also try dancing with them.

The two hours that we spend with them passes very quickly and before long it is time for us to leave. We say our goodbyes and they respond with zealous waving and blowing kisses at us. Awww... that's a sweet moment. I thoroughly enjoy this activity and the weeks that I am unable to make it, I miss them. My advice to the ladies who can spare some time... definitely sign up for the cuddling activity. You will love it. The world needs you!"

CUDDLER & RUNNER UPDATES

Our cuddlers had to stop visits for a couple months due to a large number of chicken pox cases. However, we are happy to report that visits have once again restarted and the children are thrilled to have our cuddlers back to give them extra love and hugs.

We have also been working with our occupational therapist and a local paediatric hospital to guide us with helping the children meet their developmental milestones. Many children have speech delays and our volunteers have been doing a great job trying to stimulate them!

We are also working on FTT (Failure to Thrive) and SAM (Severe Acute

Malnutrition) children. The following steps are being currently followed:

- Weekly recording and review of weight progress of the identified children
- Closely follow up on their daily nutrition and intake.

Following the guidance of Fernandez doctors and their nutritionist, dietary changes were made for each child based on their age and health condition. ABC supports them with natural supplements (Ex. dry fruits and nuts). Monitoring these children allows escalation to doctors and concerned parties if they have not improved in a considerable period of time. We are also able to conduct further investigations and delve into the reasons for FTT.

EXPENSES

It will come as no surprise that good healthcare does not come cheaply. Itemised below are some of the expenses we incurred over the last two quarters:

Admin: INR 86K primarily auditor fees to prepare our taxes and staff uniforms etc.

Baby items: INR 1.84 lakhs - medical monitors, transnasal feeding pump etc.

Consultations, Diagnostics and medicines: INR 113K

Health and Safety: INR 51K - Antibacterial soap and Sanitizer

Supplements: INR 5.2 lakhs - Pediasure, Nutrilite, vitamins/minerals, Dry fruits and nuts

Vaccines: INR 1.84 lakhs Influenza, Typhoid, Hep A, Chicken pox, etc. Salaries and transport for staff that care for the babies: INR 7.6 lakhs-includes ayahs to care for babies in the hospital, full time nurse, part time occupational therapy, and staff to monitor FTT babies.

Hospitalizations: INR 25.3 lakhs Covering 25 hospitalizations. We had some special needs children requiring long-term care, but we also had other shorter hospitalizations where the children needed immediate care, though they improved quickly.

Moving forward we are trying to think of new ways we can generate funds so that we can continue to offer the best care to the children we support. If you know of any individual or company who would be able to support us, please get in touch with us.
