EARLY INTERVENTION THROUGH STIMULATION AND PHYSIOTHERAPY

Our goal as volunteers is to improve the social, emotional, physical and neural development of the children we visit. Louise Short, one of our supporters, who is an experienced UK trained, Special Educational Needs Teacher, talked to us briefly about the different developmental milestones that children should meet in their first years of life. She has since lead a series of crafting workshops where volunteers made resources for the babies to help them engage and improve their visual, auditory and tactile awareness. Sensory bottles, colourful mobiles, monochrome cards and bean bags will allow for sensory play, thereby strengthening the babies neural pathways.









Apart from having lots of fun unleashing our creative selves, we know that the end results will have a huge impact on the little ones we support. Mobiles not only help to brighten up the environment, but also encourage tracking, spatial reasoning and depth perception. A special thanks to our friends and volunteers who made this possible.

Stimulation through play and engagement is an important and worthwhile objective, but one of our top priorities as an organisation is also Early Intervention. We have a newly appointed Early Intervention Therapist called Prasannatha, who will work alongside a team of doctors from Fernandez Hospitals. This will help the children to reach their expected, developmental milestones through regular physiotherapy.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

In the month of March, we were able to procure various items needed by the orphanage. We purchased new orthotics, physiotherapy equipment, school supplies for the preschool and for the older kids, etc. We were also able to repair the roof of one of the outdoor playgrounds used by the toddlers.







RUNNER UPDATES

• Thank you to Apollo Hospitals for sending a team of doctors when needed to review and advise on the chicken pox and MMR vaccination. In the month of

February, we successfully organised the drive and administered vaccines for around 57 children. Special thanks for Fernandez Foundation for sponsoring these vaccines.

- We continue to track and support the FTT (failure to thrive) babies at the orphanage. Due to a combined support of the orphanage and the Fernandez doctors we were able to see some positive changes and consistent progress in some of the children.
- It was a busy quarter for hospital admissions. We had 27 admissions, many of them whom were repeat admissions and some long term cases.

CUDDLERS

We have had an increased number of volunteers for cuddling which is great. Our scheduled monthly Volunteer Meets continue, it's a great way to connect runners and cuddlers and share experiences. The volunteer sessions are usually guided by counselling Psychologists Varudhini and Shalini (Inner-Connect). During one of these volunteer meets, Inner-Connect arranged for a dance therapy session by Ms. Vanitha Bhoopal. It was a wonderful session of different movements using free flow of hands, mirroring, eye contact with partners etc. It was a refreshing experience and a morning well spent exploring and understanding the significance and benefits of dance therapy.

EXPENSES

Listed below are our expenses for the last quarter;

Admin: INR 82K primarily our accountant fees to maintain our books and compliance.

Baby items: INR 2.1 lakhs includes two LED TVs, Mixer, Toys, Feeding chairs and pillows etc.,

Medical equipment: INR 17.72 includes medical & physio therapy equipment such as treadmill, orthotics for 14 children, CPR manikins, Motorised wheel chairs, walkers, Hospital beds, Trans nasal feeding pumps etc.,

Consultations, Diagnostics and Medicines: 1.49 lakhs

Health and safety: INR 32K - Antibacterial soap and Sanitiser.

Supplements: INR 4.01 lakhs - Pediasure, Nutrilite, vitamins / minerals, Dry fruits, and nuts.

Vaccines: INR 1.12 lakhs - 100 vaccines (Chicken pox & MMR) purchased and administered under doctors' examination for those children due for vaccination. Salaries and transport charges for the staff that care the babies: INR 6.64 lakhs- includes ayahs to care for the babies in the hospital, full time nurse, part time-occupational therapist and staff to monitor FTT babies and annual bonus. Infrastructure: 4.93 lakhs - Play equipment and roof renovation for a play area.

Hospitalisations: INR 44.3 lakhs covering 27 hospitalisations. As mentioned earlier, many children needed longer stays in the hospital.
