Bible Study Questions:

1. How does understanding the Bible as “alive and speaking” change the way you approach reading it?
2. Reflect on the acronym B.I.B.L.E. — which part resonates most with you today and why?
3. Which scripture from this study speaks most deeply to you right now? How can you apply for it this week?
4. Why is storytelling such an effective method for God to reveal His truth?
5. How can you invite the Holy Spirit to guide your understanding each time you open your Bible?

Journal Prompt:

Write about a time when a scripture “spoke” directly to your situation. What did God reveal to you? How did it guide your next steps?

Action Step:

This week, choose one Bible story — any narrative that draws your heart — and read it slowly. Pray before you read, asking the Holy Spirit to teach you something fresh. Meditate on it for a few days, then write down what God reveals to you through that story.

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
