Did you Know?





- Approximately every three days, someone in the United States is killed in a forkliftrelated accident
- Each year 94,750 injuries related to forklift accidents are reported
- \$135,000,000 immediate costs are incurred due to forklift accidents
- According to OSHA, approximately 70% of all accidents reported could have been avoided with proper safety training and policy¹



Did you Know?

Accidents also have the capacity to destroy tangible assets:

- Forklifts
- Merchandise
- Buildings and facilities
- Other vehicles
- Shelves and racks
- Electrical systems
- Etc.







Did you Know?

It is a violation of Federal law for anyone UNDER 18 years of age to operate a forklift or for anyone OVER 18 years of age who is not properly trained and certified to do so.





The Home Depot #4935 - Hudson, WI

An alarming trend over the past year due to forklift related accidents:

- 20% increase in employee absenteeism
 - 60 man-days lost
 - \$58,344 personnel injury costs
- 30% increase in property and inventory damage
 - \$23,000 property and equipment
 - \$15,000 merchandise





Problem Solution

Provide safety and operations training:

- In compliance with all regulatory agencies
- All currently assigned and new Warehouse Associates designated as forklift operators
- Requirement to certify to operate the various model forklifts found at The Home Depot #4935
- Recertify annually











Goals

- Reduce/eliminate personal injuries
- Reduce/eliminate workman's compensation claims
- Reduce workman's compensation insurance costs
- Reduce/eliminate loss of inventory due to negligence or mishandling of goods
- Reduce/eliminate forklift damage, property damage, and down time due to accidents



Expected Results

- Decrease in forklift accidents by 70% after safety and operations training
 - Reduction in injuries
 - Reduction in damages to equipment, property, and inventory
- Positively affected bottom line due to reduction of costs associated with forklift accidents
- Increase in store revenue with enhanced capabilities to assist and service our customers.



Cost vs. Benefit

- Annual training cost: \$6,153 (labor and materials)
- Benefit: \$74,440 (\$106,344 x 70%)
 - Personnel \$58,344
 - Equipment/Maintenance \$33,000
 - Inventory \$15,000

$$ROI = 12.10$$

For every \$1 spent on training we get \$12.10 in return.

Summary

- The Home Depot #4935 experienced due to forkliftrelated accidents:
 - 20% increase in employee absenteeism
 - 30% increase in property and inventory damage
 - Costs totaling over \$106K for 2013
- Solution Provide forklift safety and operations training in compliance with OSHA and other regulatory agencies
- Included with the intrinsic benefits of this training is an ROI of 12.10
